High School Senior is the 2023 NYPD Det. Randolph Holder, Jr. Scholarship Recipient

On Friday, October 6th, GALEA (Guyanese American Law Enforcement Association) hosted their annual Gala. The NYPD fraternal organization selected three high school seniors for their exceptional performance in school, extracurricular activities and essay writing skills based on specific criteria.

Anaya Willabus from Mill Basin was selected to receive the NYPD Detective Randolph Holder, Jr. Scholarship.

Det. Holder was the first Guyanese born to die in the line of duty within the NYPD. He was a third generation police officer – his father and grandfather served as police officers back in Guyana. Holder joined the NYPD in 2010 and was killed on October 20, 2015. He was 33 years old and resided in Mill Basin at the time of

his death.

GALEA started a scholarship fund for high school students as part of their efforts to highlight and remember a fallen hero and fellow Guyanese first responder.

As part of Willabus' speech, she mentioned the importance of role models and their positive impact. She also referenced her parents, especially her father who is currently a Guyanese first responder with the NYPD.

Additionally, Willabus acknowledged the first Guyanese woman to be selected by the NYC Mayor to serve as the first Deputy Commissioner – Tania Kinsella.

Willabus thanked Commissioner Kinsella for her service and said that such women are a great inspiration for others to follow. Kinsella was also recognized by GALEA, receiving the "Woman of the Year" award.



District 22 Holds Phenomenal Middle School Fair

At Community District Education Council 22's (CEC 22) meeting on Tuesday evening, October 3rd, held at the District Office (5619 Flatlands Avenue) and streamed live to the public, the focus was definitely on middle schools, with the admissions process now in full swing. The application period, which begins on October 11th and ends on December 8th, culminates with the official middle school offer release on April 3, 2024.

During the meeting, Superintendent Julia Bove asked several of the principals in attendance to speak about their middle schools, in order to help families with students in Grades 3-5 to identify schools that match their children's interests and ambitions.

Principal Kerri Moser of I.S. 278 (1925 Stuart Street) announced that her school is one of only 50 in the Nation participating in a NASA Mission to the Moon design challenge and boasts of robust theater, drama, art and band programs that are chock-full of talented students.

Principal Victoria Hippolyte-Agard of I.S. 381 (2500 Nostrand Avenue) explained that her school is perfect for students seeking a small, nurturing learning environment, which consists of just 300 children. She said that the school is currently being "rebranded" to connect students with prospective high schools and will offer three specialized programs: Med/Sci, which aligns with programs at Midwood High School; Law and Civics, which aligns with programs at James Madison High School; and Arts, which aligns with pro-

grams at Edward R. Murrow High School.

Principal Ellen Quigley of P.S./I.S. 206 (2200 Gravesend Neck Road) said that her school is unique in that it serves students in K-8 and that while most 5th-graders elect to stay on through their middle school years, they also offer open enrollment to external students. She explained that the school is extremely diverse, with over 20 different languages spoken by students and staff and a Russian dual-language program, and announced that the five-story extension to the building will be complete in September 2026 to accommodate their ever-growing student body

The superintendent invited families to attend what she promised would be an incredible showcase of the programs the District's middle schools have to offer, and the event did not disappoint. The Middle School Fair, held for the first time since 2019, on Thursday, October 5th, at Shell Bank Junior High School (2424 Batchelder Street) had a tremendous turnout, with a line down the block to get in. With all 10 of District 22 middle schools represented at the fair, students and their families were excited to have the opportunity to meet principals and teachers, network with peers, review presentations and program overviews, and get an in-depth look at what each school has to offer. Additional school tours, open houses and information sessions will also be held throughout October to help families decide which schools they will apply to.

The next meeting of CEC 22 will be held on Tuesday, November 14th at 6:30 p.m.





Teeing Off in Canarsie

Canarsie residents no longer have to travel far to tee off. Thanks to the Canarsie Merchants Association (CMA), golf lessons are now offered right here in our community. Located at Seaview Avenue and East 108th Street, Professional Golfer Kelly Pierre of All Access Golf teaches beginners and helps pros sharpen their golf skills on Sunday mornings.

Pierre started All Access Golf after noticing limited access to the sport in the neighborhoods he came from. He fell in love with the game years ago and has been teaching inner-city youth and newcomers the great game of golf. Pierre also includes lessons on black history within golfing, emphasizing that teeing off was introduced by a black man, Dr. George Grant, in the 1800s. This historical aspect is shared in various programs Pierre produces.

Pierre connected with the CMA at Medgar Evers College. After meeting with

CMA founder Norine Medas, she helped to secure funding to launch the golf program, with the help of Councilwoman Mercedes Narcisse. The free clinic ran from August until October 1st. The next clinic is scheduled for spring 2025.

The golf clinic isn't the only venture sponsored by the CMA. From October until the end of the year, they are hosting pop-up shops in Canarsie, featuring various business vendors. Medas connected with Jenn "Smalls" Smalls of "The Small Business Suites" to curate the upcoming pop-up shops, which help small business owners network and find resources to build and grow their businesses. The next popup shop is scheduled for Saturday, October 21st. "Brooklyn's Home for the Holidays" Lights Up the Night for Halloween

An army of skeletons reaches out to you from the second-floor balcony, above a sea of small monsters rising up from the lawn below. A witch's flying school is just down the road from a vampire's blood bank. And thousands of lights of all colors and sizes shine bright in the night.

This is just a small part of the scene at "Brooklyn's Home for the Holidays" this October. Brooklyn's Home for the Holidays is a private home, located at 1102 East 72nd Street, that sets up huge decoration displays for every holiday, complete with lights and music.

Austin Ferrazzano is the mastermind behind the displays. The 22-year-old decorator lives in the home with his family and creates the displays as a hobby when he's not working.

"I know at the end of the day, even while I'm setting it up, I get so much support – people are looking forward to it," Ferrazzano said in an interview. "The continuous support from the people in the neighborhood just makes it so much more worth it to me, to see





everyone happy and appreciative of what I can do for the community and bring everyone together."

And make people happy, he does. Residents regularly come out to see his displays, often as families. Ferrazzano even creates scavenger hunts for visiting kids to find hidden decorations.

"It's really great," Andrea, a community member who came with her children, said. "They're having fun doing the scavenger hunt."

This year, the Halloween display has several new additions, including an expanded Frankenstein's laboratory and a giant animated zombie.

"Any little details that can complement the theme or the display really adds to it," Ferrazzano said.

The Halloween display will be up from October 1st until Halloween and will be lit every night from about 7 p.m. until 10:30 p.m., barring rain. Ferrazzano's next display will be Thanksgiving, which should be up around the first week of November.



First 63rd Precinct Community Council of Season Announces Three Cop Awards

Three NYPD officers were honored for successful arrests at the first 63rd Precinct Community Council meeting of the season on Wednesday, September 27th, at the John Malone Community Center.

The precinct serves Bergen Beach, Mill Basin, Marine Park, Flatlands and Floyd Bennett Field, while the community council and its civilian board work to bridge gaps between the precinct and its residents.

It was announced that there was a 30% decrease in shootings throughout Brooklyn overall, according to Brooklyn District Attorney's Office representative Alexander Gurevich. However, there has been a slight increase in car break-ins within the 63rd Precinct.

Numbers from previous road tow operations — when large tow trucks collect non-street-legal cars from the community — were also announced. The June operation saw

49 illegal cars removed, while July saw 19 and August saw 51. The night of the meeting was the tow operation for September.

Neighborhood Coordination Officer (NCO) Tricia Navarro-Caraballo was awarded a plaque and a guaranteed parking spot for the month of June. While without her partner, she apprehended three thieves who were actively committing a crime before fleeing at her arrival.

Police Officer Giancarlo Proietti earned the Cop of the Month award for July for helping to solve more than 10 crimes with a single arrest. He pulled over a tow truck that he noticed had an obstructed plate — only to find that the truck was stolen and had been used to steal two cars earlier that same day and 12 cars on other days across southern Brooklyn.

Lastly, Officer Maximo Sabala won the award for August by conducting a Kings County Supreme Court search war-

rant that led to the discovery of firearms, ammunition, crack cocaine and pills.

Usually, the meeting is led by the precinct's Deputy Inspector Rachael Kosak, but she was on vacation, so the meeting was led by Executive Officer Captain Abdullraha Hussein.

Patrol Borough Brooklyn South Assistant Chief Charles McEvoy was in attendance, his first time visiting the community council all year.

"I never thought it would take me 23 and a half years to get back to Brooklyn South," McEvoy said, referring to how his previous years at the NYPD were spent in other parts of the city. "But I got back, and I came back to the best job in the borough. At least, I think it's the best job. Why is it the best job? Because I get to serve all the wonderful communities in Brooklyn South that are very near and dear to me."

In addition to a visit from the assistant chief, there were members of the NYPD's Emergency Service Unit, a specialized unit that provides support to all the other units, its members being trained in police work, rescue work and first aid. It includes the Apprehension Tactical Team, the Canine Team, the Hazmat/Weapons of Mass Destruction Team and the Emergency Medical Squad.

An officer from the K-9 team brought his police dog, Daisy the bloodhound, into the community center, much to the delight of Community Council President Greg Borruso.

"I just think it's really interesting to see the dogs," he said. "Because I watch 'Smugglers' and the dogs are extremely smart, especially the beagles. So, I think it'd be really interesting."

Daisy was excited to meet so many new faces at the meeting, and attendees were permitted to pet her.

The next 63rd Precinct Community Council meeting will be held on Wednesday, October 25th, at 7 p.m. at the John Malone Community Center, 2335 Bergen Avenue.



Community Education Council 18 Looks Forward to a Year of Innovation and Impact

Innovation and impact are the defining characteristics of the 2023-2024 school year for School District 18, Superintendent Celeste Terry said at the October 2nd meeting of Community Education Council 18 (CEC 18), held at the district office, 1106 East 95th Street.

"I want us to have some key words," Terry said at the start of her report. "The key words I want you to remember are impact and innovation. It's what makes schools special."

To demonstrate how this year will be different, Terry is having her team attend the CEC 18 meetings with her, so they can each speak to the different initiatives they're working on. While her team had a big showing at the meeting, the CEC's own board did not. For the second meeting in a row, there weren't enough nominated board members present to officially elect them into their roles.

The DOE is beginning to implement the NYC Reads Initiative, a new English curriculum that teaches reading differently by focusing on phonetics and the science behind reading. It will begin in elementary schools and work its way up to high schools.

District 18 doesn't have to implement NYC Reads until next school year, though Terry said they're trying to start training the teachers in the new program this winter, so they're prepared for next fall.

But first, the district will have to choose from one of three possible curriculum vendors: Houghton Mifflin Harcourt (HMH), Imagine Learning from Expeditionary Learning or Wit & Wisdom. The decision has yet to be made, but it sounded like the district is leaning toward the last option.

"It's about us being smart about the way we work with our children," Terry said. "And the reason why they're talking about phonics is a lot of our kids didn't learn how to read using phonics and they're struggling, so this is the reason why they're changing the way we teach reading."

NYC Kids Rise Save for College is another program that was discussed. This program sets up 529 bank accounts for all District 18 students to save money for college. The city and the district are giving this to kids in kindergarten through second grade, with the intention of giving each kid \$1,200 by the time they graduate high school.


Another topic of discussion was a potential new school in the district for children with autism.

"We're in the ground floor of planning what that would look like," Terry said. "What we're finding is

that we have children who are autistic, and they're not being serviced appropriately. They're being placed in general education centers with teachers who aren't particularly trained."

Terry also shared statistics regarding schools. District 18 has 12 teacher vacancies as of press time, five of which have "acting" teachers who aren't officially certified yet, but who are teaching every day like a full-fledged educator would. The district's enrollment is falling but not as bad of that of other school districts. Additionally, the district has three Gifted & Talented programs, which Terry said she fears are not of equal quality to the honors programs in other districts.

The next meeting of CEC 18 will take place at 7 p.m. on Monday, November 6th at 7 p.m. at the district office, 1106 East 95th Street.
