Thanksgiving and the Canarsie Legacy

As New Yorkers gather to celebrate Thanksgiving, it's a vital time to remember the Canarsee people, the original inhabitants of the lands that now form Brooklyn and parts of Queens. This Thanksgiving, amid feasting and family gatherings, let's also recognize and uplift the indigenous heritage that predates our modern celebrations.

The Canarsee, part of the Lenape tribe, were the first stewards of this region, living harmoniously with the land and waterways of New York long before European settlers arrived. This Thanksgiving, let's pay tribute to the Canarsee by acknowledging the land we occupy and celebrating the diverse cultures that contribute to our society. In doing so, we embrace a fuller, more inclusive narrative of our shared history, making the holiday a truer celebration of gratitude and respect.

Detectives Looking for Clues in Shooting at Sectionz Lounge

A young man was shot outside a Canarsie social hall over the weekend.

Officers from the 69th Precinct responded to a 911 call of a person shot outside Sectionz Social Lounge and Rental Hall, located at 1153 East 92nd Street, between Flatlands and Conklin Avenues, around 1:20 a.m. on Sunday, November 19th. Upon arrival, they observed a 20-year-old man with a gunshot wound to the upper right chest.

EMS took the victim to Brookdale Hospital in stable condition.

Detectives believe the shooting may have stemmed from an argument that escalated. There are no arrests, and an investigation is ongoing.

Arrest Made in Double Homicide

One day after a man and a woman were shot in an East New York home, police arrested Luis Collado, the 52-year-old suspect being charged in their deaths.


Collado was arrested on Saturday, November 18th, and charged with murder, attempted murder and criminal possession of a weapon.

Police said the suspect allegedly shot the duo inside 17 Louisiana Avenue, off Hegeman Avenue, just before 7 p.m. on Friday, November 17th. Officers from the 75th Precinct found Rosa Acevedo, 43, and Gustavo Devora Acevedo, 26, with multiple gunshot wounds to the body.

A handgun was recovered at the scene, and Collado was taken into custody, police said.

EMS pronounced the 43-year-old woman dead at the scene, according to police. The 26-year-old victim was taken to Brookdale Hospital in critical condition but succumbed to his injuries the following day.

Police Searching for Subway Slasher

Police are looking for the suspect who slashed a 22-year-old man in the neck aboard an "L" train last week.

The NYPD has released photos of the suspect, who is described as a black male, 5'10," weighing about 170 lbs. He is approximately 25 years old and was wearing a purple hooded sweatshirt with white letters,



a black du-rag and a dark-colored backpack at the time of the assault.

Police said the victim was riding a southbound "L" train around 2:40 p.m. on Tuesday, November 14th. As the train approached the Livonia Avenue subway station, an unknown male individual slashed the victim on the neck using a box cutter. He then fled off the train at Livonia Avenue in an unknown direction.

The victim was treated by EMS for a laceration to the neck, police said.

Brown Compost Bins Stolen

Marine Park residents are asking what the world is coming to when they have to chain down their compost bins or risk having them stolen by thieves on scooters overnight. The new, brown 13-gallon bins have a latching lid and wheels and were provided for free by the Department of Sanitation (DSNY) until October 13th as part of their Curbside Composting program. Each bin is labeled by hand with the house number to which it belongs but is not permanent and could be removed. Seeing as the bins have no monetary value, it is unclear why thieves are stealing them and what they are doing with them.

According to 311, DSNY does not provide new or replacement bins for residents already receiving Curbside Compost collection, even if they have been stolen. They advise residents to use any labeled bin under 55 gallons with a secure lid (to keep rodents out) instead. Alternatively, you can register to attend a free Brown Bin Giveaway event in your neighborhood by visiting nyc.gov/dsny or by calling 311.

Mill Basin Civic Honors Veterans at Monthly Meeting

The basement of Mary Queen of Heaven Church, located at 1395 East 56th Street, was packed on Wednesday, November 15th, for the Mill Basin Civic Association's monthly meeting. Area residents came out to receive updates from attending elected officials, including Assemblywoman Jaime Williams (AD59), Councilwoman Mercedes Narcisse (D46) and Community Board 18 District Manager Sue Ann Partnow, as well as to air their grievances about some nagging quality of life issues.

A major frustration voiced by many, including Assemblywoman Williams, concerned illegally parked cars and blocked driveways, usually perpetrated by persons who do not reside in the community. Williams stated there were times when she had to contact the police to have those problems addressed. Mill Basin

Civic Association President Paul Curiale went as far as to contact one of the offenders, a nearby pastor, to convey the group's exasperation.

Williams also addressed another distressing situation -- the current migrant issue and predicament at Floyd Bennett Field. She said that she visited the area last Sunday and was heartbroken to see "scared and frustrated children, walking with garbage bags of clothes on their heads."

Councilwoman Narcisse reported on the recent passage of Bill #968, which will raise awareness of sickle cell disease and make testing more accessible. The news was met with cheers by the civic association whose member, Terri Cadet-Donald, suffers from the disease.

At a press conference held on November 2nd to publicize the bill's passage, Narcisse disclosed that she too carries the sickle cell trait. "The passage of this bill is deeply personal. As someone who carries the sickle cell trait, and as a nurse who has cared for patients battling this condition, I understand the multi-dimensional challenges it presents." She also reported that another Bill, Intro 1241, that requires the Commissioner of Veterans' Services to submit an annual report on the provision of mental health services by City agencies to veterans, is still pending.

Three local veterans, Fred Greenberg who served in the U.S. Navy, and Salvatore Caruso and Robert Spieler who served in the U.S. Army, were recognized for their service to their country. "We're blessed to have our three great veterans," announced Curiale who requested a moment of silence for those "lost." Spieler, who had an illustrious career as a teacher for over 35 years, was also inducted into the NYS Veterans Hall of Fame and presented with a proclamation from State Senator Simcha Felder (SD22).

Spieler, a Chemical Corps Army veteran stated, "It is an honor to all our veterans who are here today. All our veterans in the United States and all our veterans in the world. We honor everybody. We love our country and there is nothing we wouldn't do to keep it free."

Williams added, "We are living in a time when freedom is not free and we have to be thankful for the life we have here."

Flatlands

Saying "No" to the "City of Yes"

The November 16th Zoom meeting of the Flatlands Civic Club, Inc. (FCC) was especially important to homeowners in the Flatlands area that have been targeted for proposed changes through various NYC initiatives that can be transformative, but not in a good way, according to Assemblywoman Jaime Williams (AD59).

One of those initiatives was Mayor Eric Adams' "City of Yes," which involves changes to zoning regulations to support small businesses, create affordable housing and promote sustainability.

"I am not really in support of it because of what I know firsthand," Williams said of a 50-page report she received prior to a presentation by Community Board 18 on November 15th that focused on the commercial aspect. "They spoke about Flatlands in particular — they spoke about Avenue N and I was very, very concerned about that for many reasons."

Also discussed was 5602 Flatlands Avenue, which has double and triple parked cars, constant traffic with cars and trucks, businesses and several active automobile shops in one small area.

Concerns ranged from existing traffic and congestion in the area that would be overly exacerbated by development over commercial properties, higher property taxes, lower property values, loss of homeownership as properties are sold to build hi-rise buildings and loss of a residential quality of life.

The MTA's proposed light rail system con-

necting Brooklyn and Queens was also seen as something that would alter the community because of the density of buildings that will be built along the train lines that run through the area.

Another perceived threat was to homeownership and intergenerational wealth, especially for people of color that comprise the majority population in the area. Williams told them to think about how their community would be changed, comparing it to Williamsburg, which has been transformed due to gentrification.

Williams will be holding a town hall at the Hebrew Educational Society (H.E.S.), 9502 Seaview Avenue, on Thursday, November 30th, at 7 p.m., regarding the infrastructure of Canarsie, East New York and other parts of the district.

"We have to give our residents in the community the knowledge that they need so the next time the 'City of Yes' people come to present at the community board, we can stand up and say, 'You know something? It sounds good, it looks good, but I don't think this is right for our suburban community'," Williams said. FCC president Joan Gilbert and many others voiced their agreement.

Williams also spoke about Floyd Bennett Field and announced that the lawsuit to stop the migrant camp has a new court date in Kings County Supreme Court on December 4th.

The next FCC meeting will be held at Fox Playground during the holiday tree lighting event on Friday, December 15th, from 2-4 p.m.





Wide-eyed turkeys sit together on a lawn, lined with brightly shining lights. A quartet of scarecrows stands guard together, hovering over bales of hay, pumpkins and gourds.

Thanksgiving has reached Brooklyn's Home for the Holidays, a multi-story private home at 1102 East 72nd Street adorned with magical decorations for every holiday. While Thanksgiving isn't the house's biggest display, it's one the resident decorator, 22-year-old Austin Ferrazzano, makes sure to include every year.

"It's a pretty small setup, but

it's something to keep the lights shining in between Halloween and Christmas," he said in an interview.

And shine they do.



"City of Yes" Proposal Put on Hold

A vote on the "City of Yes" for Economic Opportunity was tabled until a later date to give Community Board 18 (CB18) more time to review the extensive proposal set forth by the NYC Department of City Planning (DCP) at the November 15th meeting of CB18.

CB18 board member Naomi Hopkins gave an overview of a meeting that the Planning and Zoning Committee had with representatives of DCP on November 6th.

Hopkins said that "City of Yes" has three major focuses: 1) carbon neutrality, which would expand opportunities for decarbonization projects, 2) economic opportunities to increase opportunities for small businesses with flexible zoning and 3) housing opportunities to ensure all communities are meeting the need for housing.

The board accepted DCP's proposal for carbon neutrality at its June 21st meeting (see "Board Says 'Yes' to 'City of Yes' Carbon Neutrality Proposal," Canarsie Courier, July 6, 2023). Last week's meeting focused solely on economic opportunities for small businesses.

Hopkins said that there are 2,470 storefronts with a 10% vacancy rate within CB18. A zoning text amendment proposed by DCP would give businesses additional flexibility to expand, thereby decreasing the number of vacancies.

There are 18 proposals with this City of Yes plan, with applicability maps detailing how each proposal would impact CB18. As each community board is different, only 10 of the proposals apply to CB18.

The proposal has four goals: 1) make it easier to find space to grow, 2) support growing industries, 3)

foster vibrant neighborhoods and 4) new opportunities for businesses.

If approved, zoning changes would allow commercial activity to be added to upper floors of already existing businesses. Nightlife regulations, including dancing and live entertainment, could be expanded under this proposal, which would also include the facilitation of commercial spaces on NYCHA properties (i.e. corner stores on its properties, which would provide economic opportunity for its residents).

Kyra Cuevas, Senior Borough Planner at DCP Brooklyn Office, explained that zoning for economic opportunity is extremely limited and the laws have not been updated since 1961. "We want to make it easier for business and residents to thrive." She said that the amendment would not only allow something like a doctor's office to be added to a second floor, but an urban agriculture shop (presently only allowed in manufacturing buildings) could also be included.

Because of technical difficulties, the applicability maps were not available, and Councilwoman Farah Louis requested that the DCP team return in December with a more thorough presentation. Cuevas agreed to the plan, and a vote by the board will be conducted in late December or early January.

Assemblywoman Jaime Williams expressed her concern about the overdevelopment of our community and the huge traffic issue that already exists on Flatlands Avenue. She suggested that the proposal be open to the public, not just the CB18 board, as "the magnitude of this plan could greatly alter the community."

The DCP proposal is currently in the public review period. More than 100 meetings have been held citywide. Once the review period is completed, a public hearing will be held in January before being referred to the City Council.

A new application for an "adult-use retail dispensary premises license" was approved for Ital Mist Smoke Shop Corp., located at 4502 Avenue N. The owners, a father and his two daughters, own an existing shop at the same location that has been selling CBD products for 18 months and are requesting a transition to legal marijuana

This is the second dispensary that has been approved by CB18. At last month's meeting, the board approved an application for the Flatbush Pot Shop, located at 2129 Flatbush Avenue. That proposed shop is located 80 feet from the Ital Mist Smoke Shop.

The board acts as a recommendation committee, but the final decision for both dispensaries is made by the

CB18 District Manager Sue Ann Partnow concluded the meeting with her monthly update and raffled off 27 turkeys for the lucky winners.


The next meeting of CB18 will take place at 7 p.m. on Wednesday, December 20th, at 1097 Bergen Avenue.


Second Annual Turkey Giveaway



State Test Scores up in District 22

Members of the school community gathered at Midwood High School, located at 2839 Bedford Avenue, on Tuesday evening, November 14th, for Community District Education Council 22's (CEC 22) monthly meeting, also streamed live to the public.

Superintendent Julia Bove and Deputy Superintendent Matthew Melchiorre shared District 22's standardized test scores, which had been previously embargoed. They were happy to discuss the analytics and report that scores in both English Language Arts (ELA) and Math were up across the board, with very few exceptions. ELA scores across all grades were up two points since last year, and 21 points since the superintendent took on her position in 2014. Math scores across all grades were also higher than ever, with a 10-point increase since last year alone. Bove explained that the students' success, especially in Math, had a lot to do with being back in the classroom, where they could engage in hands-on learning and group work again. She also said that the i-Ready assessment program that was used this year helped administrators to identify gap areas where kids needed additional resources that were then remedied prior to the actual exams.

Since District 22 will be taking on most, if not all, of the undocumented immigrant children who will be moving into the hotly-contested Floyd Bennett Field shelter (which can house 2,000 people) in the coming weeks, Bove assured the community that the situation was well in hand. She explained that her team had already registered the children of some 80 such families last week and had a sound plan to place students in a way that would not encumber any one school in particular. The superintendent said that the District would hold clothing drives to ensure these students had warm jackets for the winter as well as food drives and assistance with anything else the kids needed.

To further accommodate these families, District 22 will be holding a parent workshop called "Know Your Rights," presented by the New York Immigration Coalition on November 26th at 6:30 p.m., which will include recent changes in Federal Immigration Policy, rights when interacting with immigration officials and resources, with interpretation in Chinese, Russian and Spanish.

The next meeting of CEC 22 will be held on Tuesday, December 5th at 6:30




