In Memory of Javel Lawton

The loss of 15-year-old Javel Lawton, struck down by gunfire on January 2nd at the Bayview Houses, has left a void that echoes through the streets of our neighborhood. While statistics show a decline in violence – with homicides dropping by 12% and shootings by nearly 25% in 2023 – these numbers offer no comfort. Each statistic, each percentage point, represents a life, a future, a world of potential snuffed out.

Remembering Billy Jean Hippolyte, Ethan Flowers and too many others lost to this scourge, we're forced to confront a harsh truth: one death by gun violence is one too many. Javel, like the others before him, was not merely a casualty of circumstance; he was a son, a friend, a beacon of potential. His death stands as a grim reminder of the work that remains to be done.

In response to this tragedy, Javel's family has established the Javel Lawton Legacy Fund, aiming not only to honor his memory but to catalyze change. This fund represents a commitment to supporting children who bear the invisible scars of gun violence trauma. The establishment of this fund is a clarion call to all of us that Javel's legacy will not be

defined by the way he died, but rather by the impact he continues to make in our relentless fight against this senseless violence

Our community's stand against gun violence is more than a reactive measure; it's a proactive movement toward a future where the streets of Canarsie are not marred by the sounds of gunfire but are avenues of safety, opportunity and hope. The drop in violence is a step in the right direction, but we must not become complacent. Our fight continues, and it must be multifaceted. We must demand from our government more than just words of consolation; we require action. Investments in afterschool programs, job fairs, workforce development training and cure violence initiatives are not just budget lines they are lifelines.

As we remember Javel and all those we've lost, let us channel our grief into action. Let us stand united, not just in mourning, but in our unwavering resolve to make our community a place where the potential of our youth is realized, not robbed.

Let's turn this tragedy into a turning point, ensuring that the loss of these young lives becomes the impetus for



a sustained, collective effort to eradicate gun violence from our community. Together, we can build a Canarsie where children like Javel Lawton don't just survive but thrive. Please consider donating to the fund and support Javel's family at https://www.gofundme.com/f/javellawton.

Bayview Residents Fed Up With Gun Violence

Residents mourning the passing of another victim lost to senseless gun violence gathered at the Bayview Houses for a rally against gun violence, just steps away from where 15-year-old Javel Lawton was fatally shot on Tuesday, January 2nd.

Loved ones of Javel Lawton, residents, violence interrupters, community leaders and elected officials denounced his killing. The group also called for fullyfunded, anti-gun violence initiatives.

The victim was struck and killed by gunfire while visiting his childhood home, and the suspect has not been apprehended as of this time. Councilwoman Mercedes Narcisse was there to show her support. Angry at the loss of a teen who had his entire life ahead of him, she said, "It's someone that's been part of Bayview Housing Christmas parties with me. I knew the family...enough is enough."

The family of Javel Lawton are hoping justice will be served. They have established a GoFundMe page (Javel Lawton Legacy Fund) in his honor, which will also support children affected and impacted by the trauma of gun violence.

The rally was organized by Jibreel Jalloh, founder of the Flossy Organization.

Teen Fatally Shot at Bayview Houses

A family is mourning the loss of their son after he was fatally shot on the grounds of the Bayview Houses last week, marking the first homicide of the year in Brooklyn.

Police said Javel Lawton, 15, was shot once in the torso around 9 p.m. on January 2nd, near 1550 East 102nd Street, while visiting friends at the NYCHA complex, where he lived at one time.

Detectives from the 69th Precinct/Police Service Area 1 conducted an investigation and found four shell casings at the site.

As Lawton, who was residing in East Flatbush, was leaving Bayview, a group of at least three males, wearing masks and hoods, approached him. An argument ensued, and one of the males fired a shot at Lawton,



striking him once. The group then fled on foot.

Paramedics rushed the victim to Brookdale Hospital, but, sadly, he couldn't be saved. Lawton was pronounced dead at the hospital.

It's unclear at this time what prompted the dispute and if it was gang-related.

No arrests have been made, and an investigation is ongoing.

tion of the suspect at this time.

EMS took the victim to Brookdale Hospital where he was listed in critical but stable condition.

Double Shooting Leaves Teen and Elder Shot

Detectives from the 67th Precinct are investigating the shooting of a 17-year-old male and a 71-year-old woman last weekend.

Officers responded to a 911 call of shots fired at 1925 Nostrand Avenue, between Foster and Newkirk Avenues, around 2 p.m. on Saturday, January 6th, where they found the teen with three gunshot wounds to his back, buttocks and thigh.

The elderly woman, who was caught in the senseless hail of bullets, was shot in the foot.

Both victims were taken to Kings County Hospital where they were listed in stable condition.



A woman with a kind heart and a passionate spirit, Carol dedicated so much of herself to the service of others and was always willing to speak up for what she believed in. As an advocate for the community at large and children and seniors in particular, Carol was courageous and outspoken and went out of her way to make her little piece of the world a better place for everyone.

As longtime Parent Coordinator at P.S. 312, Carol touched the hearts of so many students and their families. Somehow, she knew every child by name and would always take the time to stop and talk with them at drop-off or in the hallway, to ask them

about their day or how they were feeling and really listened to what they had to say. It was not unusual to see her shooting the breeze with her students outside of school either, chatting at the supermarket or over an Italian ice – she made them feel important.


"I miss her already! It was an honor having known Carol," recalled District 22 Superintendent Julia Bove. "She gave 110% to P.S. 312 and the entire community. She would help students get out of the car as parents drove up to the school. She always had a warm smile on her face that made each student feel special. It was her idea to utilize the abandoned lot of land behind P.S. 312. The idea evolved to be the *Carol Pino Learning Farm*, named in her memory."

"Carol came up with the idea and she lobbied every local elected official until finally Councilman Alan Maisel made the idea a reality," agreed Bergen Beach Civic Association President Sal Calise. "When Carol found out, she was happy but she never gloated at the outstanding achievement; she would always say 'it's for the community.' She always thought about others," he remembered with fondness, of her active involvement in the Civic, her volunteer work at the Mary Queen of Heaven Food Pantry and the Millennium Development Senior Center at John Malone, where she advocated for more funding and pushed back against any budget cuts the City proposed.

It's strange for her neighbors to think they'll never again see Carol Pino riding her bike down their quiet streets on a nice afternoon or run into her on one of her evening strolls. "She was everything good about Bergen Beach," shared Calise in a touching tribute to her. "I know she will be looking down on us from Heaven, saying, 'Hey, make sure you do what's right ""

Migrant Problems Take Center Stage at 63rd Precinct Community Council Meeting

A large crowd of upset residents gathered at the 63rd Precinct Community Council's first meeting of the year at 1097 Bergen Avenue on Wednesday, January 3rd, to air their grievances and fears concerning the behavior and alleged illegal activities occurring near area homes and businesses mainly in Bergen Beach, Mill Basin and Marine Park, by the migrants housed at Floyd Bennett

Donald Cranston, representing Assemblywoman Jaime Williams, said that despite the City's attempts to dismiss their lawsuit — initiated by Williams and a coalition of civic presidents, community leaders and residents — to dismantle the migrant camp, the court case will be heard on January 18th.

"We're sending a letter to the mayor and all the powers that be at the tent city that we're not going to accept the panhandling door-to-door, the going into people's backyards and whatnot — the panhandling, in and of itself, ringing of someone's doorbell is not a crime, but the harassment portion of it is a crime, so we're asking them to push that message at tent city," Cranston said.

For further clarification, Deputy Inspector Rachael Kosak advised residents not to call 311 for panhandling complaints, but if someone enters a private driveway, alleyway or backyard, it's a 911 call.

Frustrated residents, mainly from Marine Park and Mill Basin, complained that harassing behavior was happening on every block. Migrants were seen ringing doorbells; asking for money and handouts; and loitering at gas stations, businesses and supermarket parking lots. They were concerned about the welfare of the little children who were seen with the adults sitting on the sidewalks and curbs or walking in the streets.

Adding to the list of complaints was an allegation that migrants were trying to extort and scam people by trying to make false claims of getting hit by cars on streets and in parking lots in the hope of getting cash in exchange for not suing for damages, but residents were advised to always call 911 and report suspicious activity.

Kosak spoke of the limitations in addressing the issues unless there were specific complaints that warranted action. She also saw the need for more outreach and communications with the migrant population.

"In order for you to get the results you want, you need to go to where they make the decisions," Community Council President Greg Borruso said in response to a resident's plea to have everyone work together. He suggested working with Jaime Williams' office as a coalition and getting other elected officials on board to bring the issue to Congress and the voting booths.

Councilwoman Mercedes Narcisse, who represents the affected district, spoke out about accusations and rumors against her for not supporting the assemblywoman's efforts through litigation, rallies and speaking out.

She said that it was a federal issue and explained what her priorities were as far as obtaining funding and working for the community. "I don't have the leverage to tell the federal what they can do," she said. "You have to understand that."


She said that someone at the meeting told her that she

was the one who voted for the migrants to be here and supported having them at Floyd Bennett Field.

"I did not volunteer to bring no one to Floyd Bennett Field," she said. "When I received the news about Floyd Bennett Field, I was the first one to say, 'Oh my God, this is not what we want here."


In response to requests to do more, she expressed her empathy and support for the residents and announced both at the meeting and in a social media post the next day that she planned to meet with officials at Floyd Bennett Field to arrange a meeting with the migrants to "communicate directly with them, emphasizing the inappropriateness of their actions, and to explore possible measures to avoid similar incidents in the future.'

The next 63rd Precinct Community Council meeting will take place at 2335 Bergen Avenue on Wednesday, January 24th, at 7 p.m.
