Mill Island Civic Sounds the Alarm Against Proposed Condo Complex

It was standing room only at the Mill Island Civic Association meeting, held on Thursday, April 25th, at Temple Shalom, 2075 East 68th Street, drawing concerned residents from all corners of the neighborhood to discuss a pressing issue threatening the charming community's character and landscape of one- and two- family residential homes. The proposed construction of a condominium with 96 units at the intersection of East 66th Street and Dakota Place has sparked outrage and mobilized residents to take action.

Attendees packed the venue to capacity, voicing their opposition to the development. The singular issue dominated discussions, with residents expressing frustration at the nonchalant attitude and lack of urgency from civic leaders in addressing the impending threat.

Despite no permits or variances being filed yet, the looming prospect of groundbreaking spurred residents to demand proactive measures from the civic association. Many residents in attendance – working professionals such as real estate brokers, developers, mortgage bankers, lawyers and others – emphasized the need for preparedness and legal action to thwart the proposed development.

Former Bergen Beach Civic Association (BBCA) President Sal Calise and incoming President Michael Trotter echoed sentiments of solidar-

ity and offered support to the Mill Island community in their fight against overdevelopment. When faced with a similar condo development threat, the BBBCA took swift preemptive action by engaging a skilled lawyer, developing a comprehensive plan and keeping the community informed. Through proactive measures and unity, they convinced the city of the project's drawbacks, leading the developer to abandon their plans.

Eileen O'Brien, liaison for Assemblywoman Jamie Williams who vehemently opposes the project, provided insights into the political reality and urged residents to engage local elected officials to support the will of the community, oppose this plan and enforce existing zoning laws.

The Mill Island Civic has launched an online petition on Change.org (<https://www.change.org/p/halt-overdevelopment-of-condominium-complex-at-east66th-street-in-mill-island-brooklyn>) to halt the overdevelopment of the condominium complex, calling on local authorities to enforce existing zoning laws and resist large-scale developments that threaten the fabric of the community.

The proposed development has raised concerns about overcrowding in local schools, strain on infrastructure and erosion of the neighborhood's character. The petition further emphasizes that police, fire and sanitation are at maximum capacity and cannot support the

influx that this condominium complex would bring.

Opponents say this rapid overdevelopment will lead to overcrowded schools, increased traffic congestion and higher living costs. The civic association along with its members and surrounding communities highlight the importance of balanced development that preserves community identity, quality of life and their quiet suburban surroundings.

However, many feel the petition is not enough.irate locals expressed their furious opposition in comments ranging from "This is a beautiful quiet neighborhood and too many big buildings would ruin it" to "This is disastrous" and even "We're fine the way we are. Leave us alone!"

Residents seem determined to protect their neighborhood from unchecked development and ensure a sustainable future for generations to come. The fight is far from over, but the Mill Island community stands ready to defend its character and suburban lifestyle.

For years, the Council has provided resources to the community by hosting an annual job fair which provides opportunities for many, especially the youths; supporting National Night Out Against Crime; catering Thanksgiving Dinner to scores of residents at The New South Shore Manor, 1041 East 83rd Street; distributing toys to hundreds of children, annually, at

Teens and Cops Unite for Anti-Gun Violence Awareness Event

A group of dedicated 69th Precinct YCOs (Youth Coordination Officers) joined forces with students from the Canarsie Educational Campus and the Young Explorers club to organize a Walk Against Gun Violence.

The teenagers marched from Canarsie High to Conklin Avenue and East 96th Street, where the event concluded with a dinner and a small thank-you party for the students. Officer Dugue, the mastermind behind the April 26th initiative, along with several colleagues from the Youth Squad, conceived the idea to support the youth within our community. The officers utilized their own resources to plan and publicize the event, covering expenses such as food, venue and hiring a DJ to play the latest hits. The overall turnout

and feedback from the participating teens was overwhelmingly positive.

Nasha, a teenager from Canarsie, and Reggie from East Flatbush, shared their perspectives with the *Canarsie Courier*, both expressing their support for the cause and their desire to make a difference in the community.

Nasha, who tragically lost her brother to gun violence, emphasized the importance of connecting with other teens to share her story. Reggie, an NYPD Explorer, aims to change how young people perceive the police in his community. When asked about addressing gun violence, they highlighted that many of the youths involved in such crimes seek validation within the community. They view the walk as a crucial step in raising awareness and initiating change. Reggie also

pointed out that many kids grow up in unstable homes and find stability in the streets, a sentiment echoed by Officer Mayfield, also from the Youth Squad, with over 15 years of service to the NYPD.

Mayfield emphasized that much of the violence stems from online conflicts, territorial disputes and even disputes arising from music scenes. She noted the influence of older individuals persuading young people to commit crimes, often under the false assumption that they won't be charged as adults for certain offenses. Commanding Officer Captain Dion Hinds, who was present at the event, emphasized to the teens the importance of staying connected and being leaders within their circles. He expressed pride in his team of officers for taking the initiative to organize the event and commended their hard work. He also pledged continued collaboration with the community and the 69th Precinct for future initiatives aimed at combatting gun violence.

Earth Day Cleanup at Fresh Creek

In honor of Earth Week, a group of 12 interns from the Jamaica Bay Wetlands Fellowship, along with Fresh Creek Civic Association President Maria Garrett and two civic members, cleaned up some overgrown areas behind residents' homes and along the waterfront on Flatlands 7th Street, off of East 108th Street, on Thursday, April 25th.

The team cut down a lot of invasive weeds, including mugwort, Japanese knotweed and phragmites, as well as overgrown vines crawling along some residents' back fences. The group also cleaned up the area by the Avenue M Outfall.

NYC Parks routinely performs cleanups in the area, but "Parks never goes that far when they do cleanups," Garrett told the *Canarsie Courier*.

In total, about 20 bags of debris were collected, loaded onto a truck and removed from the location.

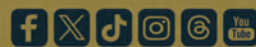

Assemblywoman Monique Chandler-Waterman Gives State of the District Address

Assemblywoman Monique Chandler-Waterman (AD 58) gave her State of the District Address on April 13th, at M.S. 961 Lenox Academy, 100-01 Flatlands Avenue.

Senior Executive Director, Office of Community Schools, George Patterson gave opening remarks in which he referred to the assemblywoman as a person of great "diligence, integrity and compassion – someone who in the face of adversity demonstrates remarkable resilience and character – and really a blessing for all of us in this community."

Guests were entertained by a processional marching band from the Middle School of Media, Law and Fine Arts, dancers from Lenox Academy, step team from P.S./I.S. 66 and Honor Guards from P.S. 135, from which the assemblywoman, her four children and even

her mom graduated.

Patterson then introduced a group of clergy, who surrounded the assemblywoman and offered up prayers for her. In a similar fashion, Congresswoman Yvette Clarke delivered greetings on behalf of other elected officials.

Before she gave her address, Chandler-Waterman showed a film which outlined her many accomplishments, some of which occurred prior to her election. One of her main battles was against gun violence – a fight she has continued since taking office. Her fight helped her secure \$5 million from the NYS budget for gun violence prevention. Additionally, she secured over \$230,000 in discretionary funds to provide support to survivors of gun violence, other anti-violence issues and the prevention of domestic violence.

Chandler-Waterman also advocated for a com-

munity center which resulted in the construction of the Shirley Chisholm Recreational Center, a \$141 million project that is scheduled to be completed in 2025. "The groundbreaking of this center was a proud moment and a vital asset for our community, especially in central Brooklyn," she stated.

Additionally, she has received approval from the mayor, chancellor and head of School Safety to launch a Community Center Concept at Tilden High School. One of the aims is to, again, target incidents of gun violence by providing a safe space "not just for the kids who attend school but for other youths, adults and families to utilize," she announced. Other accomplishments include sponsoring Mass Shooting Bill A5791, co-sponsoring the Clean Slate Bill and securing \$250,000 in funding from NYS Office of Mental Health to address mental health issues.

The evening closed with a benediction by Rev. Dr. Charles Galbreath who prayed for continued guidance, strength and covering over her. "We pray for her and her colleagues and her entire staff that they will not be weary in well-doing. We pray for the community that we will see it grow and flourish into what it should be."

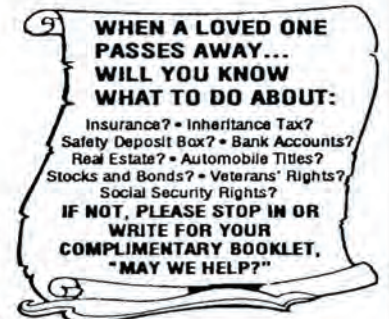

"Three Shootings are Way Too Many" – Commanding Officer at 69th Precinct Council Meeting

The 69th Precinct Community Council held their monthly meeting on Tuesday, April 30th, at Our Lady of Trust Academy, 1696 Canarsie Road. Meetings usually take place at the Hebrew Educational Society (H.E.S.), but the building was closed for Passover observance.

Commanding Officer Captain Dion Hinds was pleased to say that overall crime in the precinct was down by 16% over the most recent 28-day period. Robberies are also down by 81%, felony assaults by 11% and felonies by 60%. However, there has been an uptick in grand larcenies, specifically car break-ins in the area of Avenues J to L, between East 100th Street through East 103rd Street. Car owners need to be more vigilant in locking their doors, and Hinds asked residents to cooperate with officers requesting footage from home surveillance cameras, which will assist them with solving crimes in the area.

Three youths were shot in Canarsie so far this year, the most recent incident occurring on Sunday, April 21st, when a 14-year-old male was shot in the Bildersee Playground.

"One juvenile is a lot; three is way too many," Hinds said, stating that a 15-year-old was shot at the beginning of 2024 and Christian Montrose, 19, was shot in front of his East 104th Street home in March.

"It's becoming a serious issue, not only in Canarsie but in New York City as a whole. Unfortunately, the individuals behind these shooting are juveniles. It's something we are taking very seriously. Bildersee Park is now my main focus," Hinds said. "I know the activity that is going on in Bildersee Park and it stops the larger percentage of the good people from having a good time in the park that was built for all."

A fixed post at Flatlands Avenue and East 82nd Street will return to the troubled corner, operating on Monday to Sunday from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. Following that, a specialty unit will patrol the area to ensure everyone's safety.

The increase in police presence should help, as the commanding officer said he is seeing activity he is not happy with during school hours and later in the evening along Flatlands Avenue, from East 80th Street to East 87th Street, especially near a smoke shop on East 87th Street.

Hinds presented Cop of the Month awards to Officers Mariam Karim and Pardeep Dhaliwal for recovering loaded firearms.

On Thursday, March 14th, around 6:45 p.m., Officer Dhaliwal observed four males walking eastbound on Glenwood Road toward East 79th Street when one of the males discarded a green shoulder bag under a parked car. Dhaliwal retrieved a loaded 9 mm semi-auto Taurus from the bag. The male was apprehended during a foot pursuit, and another gun was taken off the street.

On Saturday, March 16th, around 10:15 p.m., Officer Karim and Sgt. Keegan responded to the Breukelen Houses, where a known gang member attempted to conceal a firearm. They approached the male and recovered a loaded 22 mm firearm from his waistband.

"Because of the excellent work of Officers Dhaliwal and Karim, they are being honored as our Cops of the Month for March," Hinds said.

With the warm weather upon us, residents are concerned about ongoing issues in Canarsie Park, which include double parking, cars parked on the center median and blocking residential driveways, loud music, garbage, etc. Hinds acknowledged it was a big issue, said he met with elected officials earlier this year to discuss the problems and promised that they would be addressed.

Sgt. Brian Maher said the NYPD plans to step up enforcement this summer by issuing additional summonses for people who are in the park after closing time (10 p.m.).

Regarding excessive noise, Maher said they will issue more noise summonses this year. "We have more officers trained on the noise meters, which is a necessity in order to issue the proper summonses so they don't get thrown out in court."

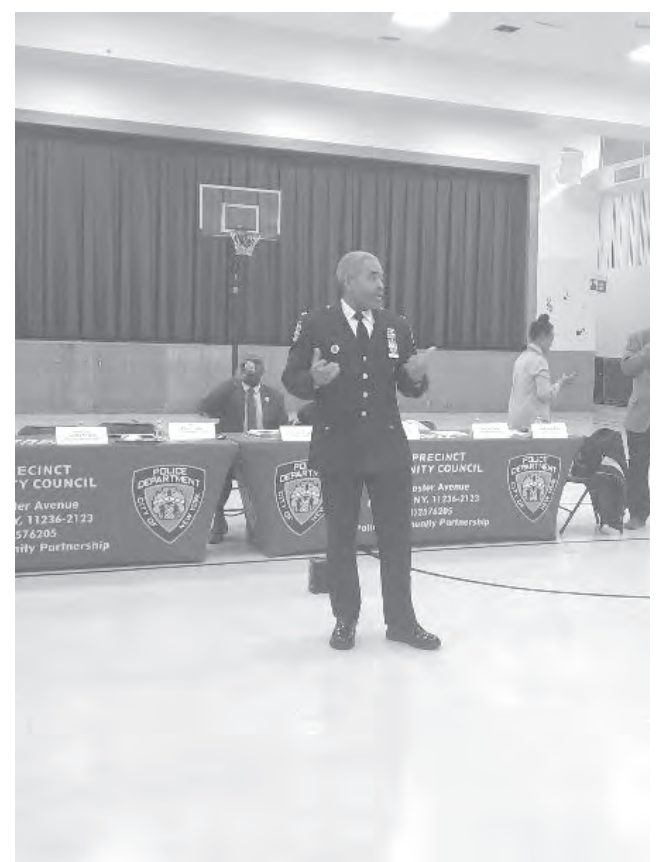
Last year, temporary barricades were used to prevent cars from parking on the medians. Maher said that they made a request to the DOT to put the barricades on an angle so cars cannot park on the outside of them. Additionally, NYPD traffic enforcement agents will do more enforcement to resolve the parking situation, he said.

Illegal smoke shops have taken over the city, but the city is finally cracking down on them. Community Board 18 District Manager Sue Ann Partnow said that a smoke shop near Kings Plaza Mall, on Avenue U and Hendrickson Street, was recently shut down for selling illegal cannabis. More should follow as an NYPD task force is working with the Sheriff's office to crack down on this citywide issue.

The next meeting of the 69th Precinct Community Council will be held at 8 p.m. on Tuesday, May 28th, at the H.E.S., 9502 Seaview Avenue.

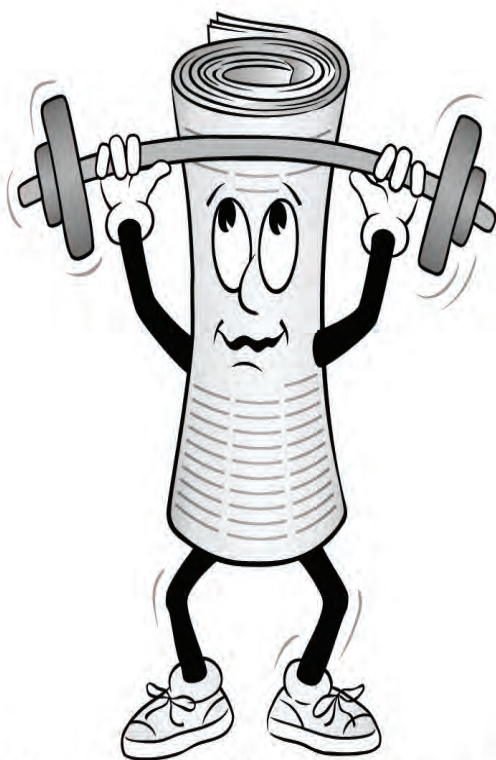

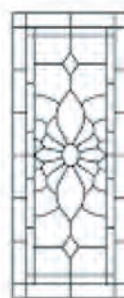

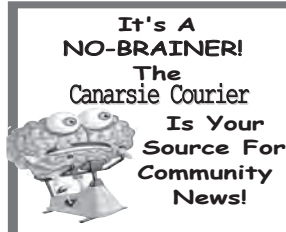
