
Floyd Bennett Field Lease Renewal Sparks Community Outrage

The recent renewal of the Floyd Bennett Field (FBF) lease, permitting the site to house over 2,000 migrants for another year, has provoked widespread outrage among community members and local leaders. Despite months of protests, petitions and rallies, the state and local administration has extended the lease, a move that many say disregards the voices and concerns of residents from neighborhoods like Marine Park, Canarsie, Mill Basin, Bergen Beach and Gerritsen Beach.

Assemblywoman Jaime Williams, who has been at the forefront of the opposition, expressed her frustration with the city's decision. "This ill-advised decision to place men, women and children in a dangerous flood zone with no resources is no less unconscionable today than it was when originally conceived." She pointed out the overwhelming community objection, noting that over 5,000 people signed a petition against the renewal. "Our community and surrounding neighborhoods came out in force, but our objections were ignored by city and state leaders."

At a September 8th rally to oppose the lease renewal, Assemblyman Michael Novakhov also voiced his frustration with the city's handling of the crisis. "The renewal of the lease at Floyd Bennett Field to house illegal migrants is a slap in the face to our community," Novakhov said. "Despite overwhelming opposition from residents, the city and state continue to pour taxpayer dollars into a failed, short-term solution. We've already spent over a billion dollars with no clear plan for an end to this crisis. Our priority should be addressing root causes, not perpetuating policies that

burden our neighborhoods."

Former Councilman Ari Kagan, another attendee at the rally, criticized the misuse of FBF, which was originally designated as a recreational space. "Floyd Bennett Field was never meant to serve as a shelter for illegal migrants, and renewing this lease disregards the voices of local residents. It's time to listen to our citizens who care deeply about public safety and fiscal responsibility," he said.

Ron "Ronbo" Canterino, Chairman of New Yorkers First and the Coalition for Better Communities, discussed the community's ongoing efforts to oppose the renewal. "It is a blatant disregard for the community's united opposition. Floyd Bennett Field is not equipped for housing and is not safe for anyone to live in, especially during the winter when it floods. It's a

national park, not a shelter," he said, adding concerns about safety, illegal activity, the destruction of the local environment and threats to surrounding communities.

Bren Lee, founder of the STOP FLOYD BENNETT ILLEGAL MI-GRANTS Facebook group, echoed the sentiments of the other speakers. "The decision to renew this lease without considering the voices of those who call this place home is a profound disappointment and a new level of disrespect, reflecting major disregard for the fabric of our community."

As the lease renewal moves forward, the community remains committed to fighting what they believe is an unjust and unsafe use of the park's natural resources, a negative impact on their quality of life and an undue burden on taxpayers.

Body-Worn Camera Footage Released in "L" Train Police-Involved Shooting of Four

An alleged knife-wielding fare evader pleaded not guilty to multiple charges, including attempted assault, on Friday, September 20th, from his hospital bed after he was shot by police inside a Brownsville subway station.

The accused fare evader, Derell Mickles, 37, jumped the turnstile at the Sutter Avenue station on the "L" line and threatened police when asked to leave, on Sunday, September 15th (see "Knife-Wielding Man Shot by Police at Sutter Avenue Station," Canarsie Courier, September 19, 2024). Mickles, who was charged with attempted assault, criminal possession of a weapon and fare evasion, pleaded not guilty to all charges.

On the day of the shooting, police said numerous commands were given to Mickles, who has 20 prior arrests, to drop his knife, but he did not comply and made verbal threats to the officers. They fired several shots after failed attempts to use a non-working Taser, and Mickles was shot in the stomach. Unfortunately, the gunfire hit three additional victims, including Gregory Delpeche, 49, who was struck in the head. The innocent bystander was on his way to work at Woodhull Hospital when he was shot. Another innocent bystander, a 26-year-old woman, was grazed by a bullet, and an NYPD officer was also shot in his left armpit.

An announcement by prosecutors to file charges against Mickles sparked a protest at the Sutter Avenue station two days later, on September 17th. Protestors demanded police accountability and said not enough was done by police to de-escalate the situation.

The anti-NYPD protest was promoted by a group called Swipe it Forward, a campaign that is working to end the criminalization of people who can't afford to pay subway fares. Members of the group swiped customers in at the Sutter Avenue station that night. At least 18 people were arrested for disorderly conduct.

NYPD Chief of Patrol John Chell said the incident "was not about fare evasion" but rather an incident about "a person in mental stress armed with a deadly weapon."



More details about the incident emerged after bodyworn camera footage was released. Chell said that there were two encounters with police, the first starting around 2:50 p.m. when Mickles jumped the turnstile in front of police and left the station after police ordered him to do so. Footage shows Mickles holding a knife while leaving the station.

The suspect returned 10 minutes later and evaded the fare again. Officers followed him upstairs to the train platform and ordered him to leave 30 times, according to Chell. A train approached the station; Mickles hopped on, and the cops followed. That's when cops used their Tasers, which did not immobilize Mickles. "They exited the train," Chell said at a press briefing, and "Mickles charged at the officers and they discharged their weapons."

Not everyone agrees with the account; lawyers and family members are calling for a full investigation.

Family members say the NYPD's actions were reckless. "There's no reason why he should not make it to work," Delpeche's cousin said.

Delpeche underwent cranial surgery to reduce swelling and is still in the hospital, clinging to life.

Fatal Shooting on Georgia Avenue

A 42-year-old man did not survive his injuries after he was shot on Sunday, September 22nd.

Police from the 75th Precinct arrived at 648 Georgia Avenue, off New Lots Avenue, around 3:45 a.m. where they found the victim suffering from gunshot wounds to his shoulder and arm, according to official sources. EMS took the victim, whose name was withheld, to Brookdale Hospital where he was pronounced dead.

There are no arrests, and an investigation is ongoing.

Suspect Arrested in Jefferson Street Subway Push

Police arrested a suspect who allegedly pushed a 62-year-old woman onto the train tracks at the Jefferson Street station on the "L" line on Thursday, September 19th.

Shadrach Ford, 30, was charged with attempted murder, criminally negligent homicide, assault, reckless endangerment, harassment and criminal trespassing on Friday, September 20th. Ford, a Nassau County resident, is being accused of shoving the victim onto the subway tracks around 5:50 a.m. after he approached the woman

and asked for a lighter. When she ignored him, he punched her in the face and pushed her onto the northbound track, causing injuries to her left ankle and right elbow, police said. Fortunately, commuters stepped in and brought the woman to safety before a train approached the station.

The suspect fled the station in an unknown direction.

EMS took the woman to Wyckoff Heights Medical Center in stable condition, according to police.

The Play That Goes Wrong

The Play That Goes Wrong is still a hit comedy-farce at off-Broadway's New World Stages, at 340 West 50th Street. It opened in London in 2014 and is still running there. A Broadway version played for two years, and this new group in its third year fills the stage with jokes, nonsense and slapstick antics that keep the audience laughing for two hours.

There is also a pre-show that warms up the audience for the comic chaos that is coming around the corner. The three British actors – Henry Lewis, Jonathan Sayer and Henry Shields – concocted this effort and set the play at the fictional Cornley University Drama Society, which is an amateur group of actors, and they will be trying to make their play within a play,

"The Murder at Haversham Manor," a success while trying to overcome their inferior dramatic skills.

This comedy outruns, outpunches and out-pratfalls the old silent film comedies of Hollywood. Steve Martin and Martin Short would be great stars. They try to keep the play's "Murder" theme in shape, but most of the time, however, the play's lunacy has full scope. The play is not as sophisticated as Michael Frayn's Noises Off, 1982's similar farce, yet The Play That Goes Wrong to me serves a wider audience or as the notes in the program say: "Anyone from a child of 8 to 100 years is welcome." The Friday night I was there, it was packed with laughter from every age! Including me!

CB18 Meetings Resume after Summer Break

A public hearing by the NYC Department of Environmental Protection's new Bureau of Coastal Resilience and a resolution to a disputed land use issue were highlights of the first meeting of Community Board 18 (CB18) after their summer hiatus, held on Wednesday, September 18th, at 1097 Bergen Avenue.

"We have a massive challenge here in New York City," Deputy Commissioner of Coastal Resilience Laurian Farrell said, on how to protect New Yorkers from flooding along its 520 miles of coastline. "In New York City, we've typically seen hurricanes starting from mid to late August, running to November, so we're on high alert right now for hurricane season and this year, in particular, is one where we're seeing a lot of hurricane activity, more than average."

Infrastructure plans to install floodgates and sea

walls, create wave breaks, raise land and reinforce shorelines are some of the coastal resilience methods used to prepare for intense storms and resulting storm surges through \$15 billion in federal funding awarded to NYC after Superstorm Sandy.

The bureau's work to conduct studies, coordinate and plan to implement and operate the city's coastal resilience infrastructure is just beginning and may take 10 to 20 years to complete.

Farrell discussed how residents can prepare now to keep their homes and families safe in the event of an emergency. She recommended that they look into FEMA flood insurance as many home insurance policies do not cover floods.

She will return in the future to discuss and get feedback on specific projects the Army Corps of Engineers will be planning for the community. Helpful websites include FloodHelpNY.org and FloodSmart.

Apart from the usual announcements, CB18 Second Vice Chair Maria Garrett, filling in for the Chairperson and First Vice Chair, informed attendees that hotly contested plans to rezone and build a seven-story, mixed-use building at 5602 Flatlands Avenue have been scrapped and a buffet restaurant will be built there instead.

Local leaders, civic presidents and community members attended a press conference spearheaded by Assemblywoman Jaime Williams at the site in December to protest the plans, perceived as the beginning of Mayor Adams' "City of Yes" proposal, which the community is vehemently against.

"We went out there and we let our voices be heard," Garrett said, praising Flatlands Civic Club President and CB18 board member Joan Gilbert for rallying the community and raising awareness about the plan.


During the remainder of the meeting, most of the community updates involved numerous activities over the summer and other news. Many of the discussions centered around trash, dumping and overgrowth in a number of parks, medians and green spaces throughout the district.

CB18 District Manager Sue Ann Partnow went on a drive-through of some of these areas with Brooklyn Parks Commissioner Marty Maher. She recounted how he told her that when he started over 40 years ago, there were well over 1,200 men and women working in the Parks Department and now there are less than 600, and there's more to do and fewer people to do it.

A similar situation exists with Sanitation, which has a manpower shortage. Training is taking place for additional workers.

Partnow also said that following the enactment of Sammy's Law, the NYC Department of Transportation announced that speed limits will be reduced to 20 mph near select locations. One of those streets is near a school on East 96th Street, between Avenue D and Foster Avenue.

She also spoke about new dining shed regulations and that as of October 1st, there will be an increase in NYC parking rates at all NYC municipal parking garages and fields.

Other ongoing developments in the area include the installation of a tide gate chamber, which has water level sensors that help control the flow of water on East 108th Street and Avenue K; excavation on Kings Highway from Avenue K and Flatbush Avenue; reconstruction of the median and work along Flatlands Avenue from East 57th Street to East 80th Street for B82 Select Bus Service construction; filming of Season 4 of the *Godfather of Harlem* in Canarsie; and tree pruning scheduled from now until 2029.

Councilwoman Mercedes Narcisse announced that she was able to secure city funding of \$400,000 to P.S. 114 to upgrade their auditorium, \$299,000 to Marine Park JHS 278 for security cameras and \$250,000 to Lenox Academy for technology upgrades.

Sabrina Dieujuste, Director of Constituent Services for Councilwoman Farah Louis, reported that there were numerous complaints to her office about smoke shops and they have been working with the Sheriff's office. Out of 30 smoke shops, 15 have closed down since May; the remainder were in other community boards.

Her office is continuing to address ongoing complaints about a shelter located on Kings Highway, near Foster Avenue and the triangle-shaped green space across from it where there is a lot of trash and unsavory activities taking place. Overgrown weeds and trash are another ongoing problem along Kings Highway, but efforts to remove them have been hampered by staffing shortages.

Similarly, dumping and trash have been a problem at Canarsie Park, Amersfort Park and Sunners Playground, according to Parks Committee Chair Violine Roberty. She reported that reconstruction of the Marine Park Oval is in its third stage and is expected to be completed in November, JHS 278 playground is expected to be in construction in fall 2025 and funds have been allocated for construction in Bildersee Playground.

Additionally, Canarsie Park's work with basketball court renovations, path reconstruction, the rear end of the cricket field, drainage, benches, the baseball field and the potential for a soccer field is ongoing.

Brief presentations were also made by Assemblywoman Monique Chandler-Waterman, Michael Benjamin for State Senator Kevin Parker, and Roslyn

Campbell, who is the new liaison for the Brooklyn Borough President's office.

SLA and Cannabis Committee Co-Chair Jamaal Carryl reviewed numerous actions to be voted on for several area businesses. After review and with restrictions for one applicant, all were approved in a vote of 27 yes and one abstention.

District Leader Frank Seddio proposed changes to the election process and the term of the current officers. He also requested a 3% salary increase for CB18 staff members, specifically the district manager, assistant district manager and community assistant positions. This follows an unconfirmed 5% increase approved for staff positions last year according to the September 20, 2023 CB18 board minutes.


Seddio's proposals were motioned and seconded and will be voted on at the next scheduled meeting of the board on Wednesday, October 16th, at 7 p.m.





Dara Mormile, Brooklyn Chapter leader for the Salgi Esophageal Cancer Research Foundation, organized and established the event to honor her father, Joseph Mormile, who lost his battle with EC in 2010. Her goal is to raise awareness of the deadly cancer, as well as funds for research

This year's 5K was dedicated to Michael Flores, who spoke at last year's event. He was battling EC but sadly passed away on Wednesday, September 11th, at the age

proud people, and I feel inspired by people coming out and joining us," said Mormile. "I met Michael at the event last year, but prior to that, I connected with him through another EC platform. I had mentioned my event and he said, 'I'm a fighter' and he came to the 5K. Afterwards, I followed his journey on Instagram and Facebook. I was hoping that he would come back today. It was a personal loss to me in a lot of ways after meeting him."

Flores' family was in attendance and spoke fondly of his character. "I can't say enough things about Michael. I'm his brother, but he took on a father role in my life," said David Flores. "He was a great, caring guy, loving, made sure everybody was happy, made sure there was peace among family. I wish he was here. I'm glad for this cause, especially this 5K for my brother. Hopefully we get more awareness of this cancer. It takes people a lot quicker."

According to the American Cancer Society, men are at a higher risk of developing EC than women. In the United States, the lifetime risk of esophageal cancer is around 1 in 127 for males and 1 in 434 for women. Among the risk factors for EC are Gastroesophageal Reflux Disease, persistent heartburn, obesity, poor nutrition, tobacco use, excessive alcohol consumption, inactivity and Barrett's esophagus. Unfortunately, there aren't any routine or accepted screenings to detect EC early on; therefore, early testing is crucial.

In 2024, an estimated 22,370 will be diagnosed with EC, and there will be an estimated 16,130 deaths from EC.

Due to construction which closed a section of the park's oval, the 5K course was two loops around the park's perimeter.

The men's winner was Nick DiVanna, and the women's winner was Fabiola Collier, They each won a \$50 gift card from Dick's Sporting Goods. Second place winners were Tomer Shoham and Kiera Haggerty, respectively; each won a charcuterie board, custom-made and donated by one of the participants.

Priscilla Moronta, Michael Flores' sister, shared a touching memory. "Michael intended to be here today. On Monday, he said to me, 'Hey, Priscilla, I think I need a wheelchair for this thing, so you got to go take a walk, so you can get practice pushing me.' That shows Michael's spirit. He always wanted to raise awareness for this. We're in the process in establishing a foundation in his name to bring awareness and try to get endoscopies covered for people

As of Sunday, September 15th, the campaign raised almost \$11,000. The 5K itself raised \$500 through raffles and donations, all of which will go to funding a noninvasive tool to detect EC in its early stages.

"I want to get some more sponsors on board, but I'm also trying to find a five-year survivor to speak about how they made it, how they survived the struggle," said Mormile.
