Canarsie Man Arrested for Killing Wife, Stabbing Son

An arrest has been made in the fatal stabbing of a Canarsie resident, Antoinette Stewart-Gordon, 47.

One day after Stewart-Gordon was killed, police arrested her husband, Lewis Gordon, 45, and charged him with murder and criminal possession of a weapon on Monday, December 23rd.

Police said the suspect allegedly stabbed his wife in the neck and abdomen inside of 942 East 81st Street, between Flatlands Avenue and Avenue J, around 9:30 p.m. on Sunday, December 22nd. Gordon also allegedly stabbed the couple's 15-year-old son, causing a laceration to his hand.


Both victims were taken to Brookdale Hospital where Stewart-Gordon was pronounced dead, and the 15-year-old victim was reported in stable condition.

Firefighters Battle Snow and Flames at Two Alarm Fire

Another High-Rise Fire Strikes at Sprawling Apartment Complex

Firefighters quickly contained an apartment fire in Spring Creek on Friday afternoon, December 20th, the third residential fire in Starrett City since October.

Units arrived to find heavy smoke on the 13th floor of 1475 Geneva Loop around 4:55 p.m. Over 100 firefighters from the 58th Battalion quickly deployed hose lines and tapped into the standpipe on the 12th floor to get water to douse the fire. Searches throughout the apartment and floors above were negative.

The fire was placed under control at 5:40 p.m. Fire marshals are investigating the cause of the fire.

A fire destroyed a 19th floor apartment at 45 Twin Pines Drive on October 21st, followed by a fire at 1515 Pennsylvania Avenue on November 13th.

Views of Saturn and Jupiter at Winter Solstice Event in Seba Park

Views of Saturn, Jupiter, several constellations and many, many stars were the highlight of the Marine Park Alliance's (MPA) Winter Solstice event on a frigid night in Seba Park along Gerritsen Avenue.

Dozens of local stargazers turned out for the event, which was the final in the MPA's "Festival of Lights" winter events series and was held on Saturday, December 21st, in conjunction with NYC Parks and the Amateur Astronomers Association.

With five telescopes of different calibers and knowledgeable participants from the two nonprofits and the Parks Department, attendees were able to not only learn about the stars, but also to see them as close-up as the average person can hope to get.

"We're wrapping [the year] up with our Winter Solstice celebration to mark the shortest day of the year — or, to put it differently, the longest night of the year — and to commemorate the darkness, the pit of the year, you might say," MPA Executive Director Scott Middleton said. "We're happy to have families out here and learn a bit about the night sky and to take advantage of the darkness. I think often people think of darkness as a bad thing, but it's helpful to turn that sentiment on its head and think about what the darkness offers us."

While it was a freezing night, families and individuals did show up to the event and lined up to peek at the view from each unique telescope. Members of the astronomy club explained to stargazers what they were seeing in the night sky and ways to recognize different constellations.

MPA staff and volunteers also showed star maps to attendees and passed out hot chocolate and lollipops.

The most exciting views of the night were Jupiter with four of its moons — clear enough that you could even see some of the color banding on the planet — Saturn with its ring and the Pleiades star cluster.

"I like to remind people to look up every once in a while," Amateur Astronomers Association Observing Committee Co-Chair Rori Baldari said. "I like to remind people that we are all citizens of a beautiful, mysterious and vast universe. And while most of the time, we're just running around with our daily activities and things we need to do, just every once in a while, take a moment to look up and realize that there is an entire universe above our heads. We live within that universe as much as we live anywhere else."

Santa generously gave a variety of gifts to all the students, for all age groups. In addition, there was holiday music for the kids to get into the holiday spirit.





First Hanukkah Event at Brooklyn's Home for the Holidays Lights Up the Night

Armed with a lighter and umbrellas, a cheerful group of community members turned out for Brooklyn's Home for the Holidays' first-ever Menorah Lighting Celebration, held on the very rainy fourth night of Hanukkah.

Brooklyn's Home for the Holidays is a residential home, at 1102 East 72nd Street, that creates huge decoration displays for every holiday, led by decorator and resident Austin Ferrazzano, 23. Currently, the home is decorated for Hanukkah, Christmas and Kwanzaa in a joint set-up.

This year is the 10th annual Hanukkah display Ferrazzano has created at this location and the Menorah Lighting Celebration honored the anniversary and the

"Thank you for everyone who has come out, not only for Hanukkah, but for the holiday season; it means the world to me," he told the Canarsie Courier. "We're here, rain or shine, bringing everyone together and making everyone happy. I wish everyone a prosperous Hanukkah season.'

The event, arranged with the help of Ferrazzano's neighbor, Rachel, featured homemade kosher minilatkes (really just tater tots to give the feel of a Jewish potato pancake) and the lighting of an oil menorah by a local rabbi who requested to remain anonymous.

"Austin honestly brings so much light," Rachel said. "The first time I came here, I thought this was a real community thing, like the community came together - I didn't realize this is a one-man show. He does this all by himself. The fact that he brought both of the holidays together is beautiful.'

Event organizers also passed out colorful dreidel gummy candies and baggies of chocolate gelt coins to children in the small crowd.

The rabbi led the group in the traditional Hanukkah prayer and spoke positively of Ferrazzano's display.

"Hanukkah represents the miracle of light over darkness and if there is one individual that represents light over darkness, it is Austin, who brings light to the whole neighborhood," the rabbi said. "We want to thank you for your light. I really believe that this amazing presentation is where everyone comes together. You bring unity to the neighborhood."

As always, the Hanukkah display takes up the leftmost lawn of the house and along East 72nd Street.

A sign made of blue dreidels, spelling out "Happy Hanukkah," greets visitors, sitting atop a sea of blue string lights covering the grass. A tall menorah presides over the lawn, being shown off by two polar bears wearing traditional Jewish garments. To the side, a display case depicts two kids celebrating the Festival of Lights with a menorah, dreidels, latkes and presents, with the Jewish Star of David hanging above it all.

The joint Christmas-Hanukkah-Kwanzaa display will be lit every night, weather permitting, through the end of Hanukkah and will be followed by the Valentine's Day display in February



The display includes a large display case and lights.





Little Old Canarsie



For many years, the late John Denton graced the pages of the Canarsie Courier with his column, "Little Old Canarsie." Born here in 1899, Mr. Denton's knowledge of the area and memories of his life in Canarsie from the time he was a boy until he died at the age of 85 quaintly chronicled the early history of the community, from the era when there was nothing here but dirt roads, to modern times. So popular was Mr. Denton's column that the Canarsie Historical Society looked upon it as a "byword" and an authentic account of the life and times of our burgeoning community from the turn of the 20th Century to the present.

This "Little Old Canarsie" column was originally published in the Canarsie Courier on January 4, 1973.

New Year's Day

As we think how we celebrate the coming of the New Year of 1973 when most of us go out and spend as much as fifty dollars or more per couple for the occasion in the various halls used for weddings, etc., it is nice to look back at the time the Family Group along with some neighbors would sit up and wait for the sound of the church bells and factory whistles ringing in the New Year.

For those of us who so desired we could go to the churches and listen to some fine services while others stayed at home and when it hit 12 o' clock, would go out in the street, rattling various gadgets and beating on old dinner pots and pans; and then going back and forth to neighbors' homes for a drink (for those who took the hard stuff and Cider) or soft drinks for the others.

Next day which was New Years Day some would go around house calling on friends while others would visit their favorite bars. On Ave. L next to the railroad tracks of the B.R.T., formerly the Canarsie & Rockaway Beach R.R. was Henry Wimpheimer and his Mrs. who operated the bar and in the front a package liquor store where they had large barrels of wine and bottled goods. In those days you got your port wine or sherry right out of the barrel and when we kids went to buy a bottle for the house for our parents, Mrs. Wimpheimer would give us a small glass of port but first she asked us whether we were allowed to have it. In those days they knew who could be sold a bottle as we kids were not allowed to open them if we knew "what was good for us."


In the year of 1910 you could buy "Wilson Whiskey" for a dollar a quart and get 10 cents back for the empty bottle or a pint of "Polly Brand" for fifty cents (no taxes on liquor in those days). If you walked up a block on the corner of Ave. K and E. 95 St. was the big hotel and bar of Richard Behrman and later owned by Daniel Peycke who had a bar in front and a backroom and bowling alleys on the side by the railroad tracks where you could go and spend a pleasant afternoon. In those days no one was allowed to be at the bar on Sunday so they would sit in the back room and drink and then a law was passed called the "Raines Law" where they were supposed to serve drinks on Sunday only with a meal so most bars had a plate of sliced bread which they would put out every Sunday, in case an Inspector walked in but if you tried to eat one of those slices of bread, you would probably break a couple of teeth, as the same plates came out every by Henry Abrahams who with son Robert had a large following of old timers of those days,

This was the starting point of bringing on Prohibition for a fourteen year period, first in 1918 when they were not allowed to serve our boys in uniform and then in 1919 until 1933, no one at all. (Except at the unlicensed speakeasys.)

The next place to visit was Henry Krier's on E. 92 St. between Flatlands and Conklin Ave; and then on Glenwood Rd. & E. 95 St. Helgans and Ammerman's, where you would be greeted by Pete Helgans or George Ammerman, the proprietors; then down the block, corner Conklin & E. 95 St., Abrahams' Hall and bowling alleys and upstairs meeting rooms which was owned

by Henry Abrahams who with son Robert had a large following of old timers of those days, who mostly worked hard for a living in good old Jamaica Bay. Then we could go up on the Parkway at Smith's Lane and stop in at Harms Hall owned by Fred Harms and his congenial bartender "Doot" Bebensee. Alongside the bar was the hall used for weddings, minstrel shows, and political meetings.

In those days very few ladies went into these places but they used to go New Years calling in the afternoon of Jan. 1st and stop into any home which usually had a Christmas wreath on the door as a welcome sign to stop in for a drink and chat for a little while.






