Suspect in Double Shooting on the Run

Detectives from Patrol Borough Brooklyn South are looking for a suspect who shot two men at Farragut Road and East 39th Street on Thursday, June 19th.

Officers from the 67th Precinct responded to a 911 call of an assault in progress and found a 28-year-old man with a gunshot wound to the back of the head and a 27-year-old man with gunshot wounds to his arm and leg around 4:20 p.m.

EMS rushed both victims to Kings County Hospital where the 27-year-old was listed in stable condition, while the 28-year-old was listed in critical condition, according to police.

Officers also found a BMW with several bullet holes in the driver's side window.

No arrests have been made, and an investigation is ongoing.

Dispute Leads to Fatal Stabbing

A 33-year-old man was stabbed to death in the vicinity of Livonia Avenue and Cleveland Street over the weekend.

Police from the 75th Precinct arrived at the scene around 3:30 p.m. on Saturday, June 21st, where they found the victim with a stab wound to his torso. He was taken by EMS to Brookdale Hospital, where he was later pronounced dead, police said.

The victim's identity is being withheld pending family notification.

A dispute at a Laundry King in Sheepshead Bay led to the death of one of the victims.

Police from the 61st Precinct were called to the scene of the assault, at 39 Neptune Avenue, around 10:40 p.m. on Sunday, June 22nd. They found a 54-year-old male with a stab wound to his torso and his 19-year-old son with a laceration to his forehead.

Police said that the two men were involved in an argument with another man outside the laundromat that spilled into the Laundry King.

Both victims were taken by EMS to NYU Langone Hospital – Brooklyn, where the



54-year-old victim succumbed to his injuries. The 19-year-old victim was listed in stable condition.

A motive behind the dispute is unknown.

There are no arrests, and an investigation is ongoing.

Despite the cold weather and gray skies, families gathered at Dr. John's Playground, located at Gerritsen Avenue and Avenue X, on Sunday, June 15th, for another event in the Just for Kids series, presented by the Marine Park Alliance (MPA), celebrating Father's Day as the Gerritsen Beach Volunteer Fire Department (known as the "Vollies") showed off their newest fire engine to the community.

The Father's Day event – "Inside a Fire Truck" – presented families with the opportunity to not only engage with themselves and other families but also share the experience of learning about a fire truck in a safe, calm environment, as well as see the tools firefighters use during a rescue.

Vollie Andrew McKenna led the tour of the new fire truck, explaining the components of the engine, such as the sirens, aerial ladder, hoses and nozzles and its very own water supply (holding up to 350 gallons of water). He also talked about the tools that are stored in the compartment, such as axes, air tanks, Halligan bars, hydraulic rescue tools, sled stretchers and helmets, among others.

"It's a good opportunity to introduce people to the fire truck, especially since it's relatively new," McKenna said. "It's a good opportunity for parents too, especially if they live in the neighborhood, to see that this is a service that's offered. We're the only neighborhood in Brooklyn that has a volunteer fire department, so I think it's good, especially since the neighborhood's changing and new people that aren't familiar with it can learn about our department and learn that there's opportunities, not only for them to volunteer and help out their community, but also to further gain skills themselves."

The Vollies was founded in 1922; for more than a century, its crew has grown to include 30 dedicated volunteers who answer over 500 calls per year, protecting life and property in the Gerritsen Beach area. The Vollies operate a fleet of four fire and EMS apparatus, as well as the new fire truck, which families photographed and children got the chance to sit in the passenger seat and turn on the sirens.

Parents got to spend quality time with their children and discover their interests.

"It's great seeing what people in the community do, and my son's been very interested in cars and fire trucks lately, so I think it's just quite an opportune time to be able to spend some time with my son and with something that he likes," Ben Pib said.

"It's one of our annual highlights and part of our Just For Kids program series and a great opportunity for kids and families to meet the first responders that keep us all safe," MPA Executive Director Scott Middleton said. "It's also an opportunity to learn some tips about what to do in the case of a fire or other emergency, how to safely evacuate and how to alert first responders so they can come."

The next Just for Kids event – "Movie Under the Stars: Under the Boardwalk" – will be held at 8 p.m. on Thursday, June 26th, at the Carmine Carro Community Center, 3000 Fillmore Avenue. Families are encouraged to wear their pajamas and bring a blanket.

McKenzie, who is headed to Brooklyn Technical High School this fall, already has big plans for his future. "I want to be a forensic scientist," he said with excitement. "Brooklyn Tech actually has a forensics department, so that's one of the reasons I chose it. I'm really looking forward to exploring that path."

When asked how he stays on top of his studies, McKenzie offered thoughtful advice: "Bring home





your old worksheets and go over them every now and then. Don't wait for the test to study. But also, don't stress too much - you have to give yourself time to relax too."

The event wasn't just about individual recognition; it was also a celebration of collective success. The gala showcased the strength of District 18's community, where educators nurture not just academics, but the whole child, and where parents and families are active partners in student achievement.

Throughout the evening, award recipients were called to the stage amid applause and cheers. Each student had their name pronounced with care, their school and grade proudly announced, and their stories briefly shared -- a detail that made the event deeply personal and emotional for many families.

The evening also featured a special dance by a ballroom dancing duo; the pair also did a mini dance class for the guests. As the night drew to a close, attendees left with smiles, bouquets and certificates in hand, but, more importantly, with a renewed sense of purpose and pride. Despite the torrential downpours on Saturday, June 7th, family and friends of Cliff Roye turned out for the networking event and ribbon-cutting ceremony celebrating the 25th anniversary of his company, Cool Tech Air Conditioning and Refrigeration, LLC.

The get-together was hosted by Kamla Millwood, president of Palatial Publishing LLC, and was held at the Caribbean American Chamber of Commerce and Industry Inc. (CACCI), located at 2121 Caton Avenue.

Dr. Jean Joseph, president of CACCI, welcomed and congratulated Roye on his achievement, stating, "Cliff, you have done a marvelous job. As a small business owner, I know it's not easy. It's okay to start, but to maintain for 25 years is a plus." She then presented him with a gold medal, on behalf of CACCI.

Joseph credited her predecessor, the late Dr. Roy Hastick Jr., who founded CACCI in 1985, for creating a space where small businesses could be nurtured and supported.

Ken Marable, who represented the Brooklyn Chamber of Commerce (BCC), also applauded Roye for his perseverance and leadership, noting that creating a thriving small business is no easy task. "I commend you for taking that step forward," he said to Roye. "The small business is not easy to do," he emphasized.

The BCC ambassador stated that the accomplishment was significant and deserved recognition. Turning to the guests, Marable added, "Today, we are going to celebrate Cliff Roye for his tenacity, for his vision and just for him being himself -- working hard."

Roye credits Cool Tech's longevity and overall success mainly to his personal work ethic. After graduating from college, he worked with another HVAC company for three years before acknowledging, "I can do this myself. So, I just started my own company."

He quipped that that was the beginning of his 16hour workdays. And though the hours were arduous, Roye said he was determined to make things work. He shared with the *Canarsie Courier* that there were also times when the money did not come in as expected, because clients did not always pay on time. But he stated the quality of the service he provided was never compromised.

His self-discipline, great customer relations and his love for the job were also major factors that allowed him to grow Cool Tech to an M/BE-Certified company with five trucks, six employees and a number of capable subcontractors.

Roye thanked everyone as they surrounded him for a ribbon-cutting that marked the beginning of his next 25 years in business. "It is great to have family and friends come out and celebrate my 25th anniversary. Being in business for 25 years, as you've already heard, is no joke. It's serious business," he stated. He praised Hastick, with whom he had celebrated prior milestones, for his vision of business networking, explaining that that kind of support was crucial.

"And that's what Dr. Hastick's legacy is all about -- bringing businesses together," Millwood commented, before presenting Roye with a proclamation from State Senator Roxanne Persaud.
