Starting a Block Association

By Jibreel Jalloh

In a city as big as New York, it's easy to feel like the decisions shaping our neighborhoods happen far away behind closed doors in City Hall or in boardrooms we'll never see. But real power starts right outside your front door, with neighbors knowing each other's names, looking out for one another and working together to solve shared problems. That's the heart of a block association — and in Canarsie, we could use more of them.

A block association isn't just about summer cookouts and block parties though those help build community. It's a grassroots, resident-led group that can tackle quality-of-life issues quickly, from fixing broken streetlights to stopping illegal dumping. It's a way to organize for safety by partnering with local precincts, hosting community walks and improving street lighting. It's also about beautifying our streets, checking on seniors during storms and making sure everyone has access to help in a crisis.

When a block association speaks, it's not just one voice — it's dozens of households united. That collective voice carries weight. In recent years, Canarsie has faced rising costs, safety concerns and quality of life issues. Strong block associations make sure we're not just reacting to problems — they put us in a position to shape the solutions.

Beyond advocacy, they bring neighbors closer. When you know the people on your block, you're more likely to



wave hello, keep an eye out for each Email us at team@theflossy.org, and other's kids and notice when something's wrong. That connection makes our streets safer, friendlier and more vibrant.

Starting a block association is easier than most people think. Begin by talking to a few neighbors to see who's interested. Host a simple meeting on a porch, in a living room or at the park — and pick one or two priorities to focus on. Reach out to city resources like the Community Affairs Unit for guidance. Most importantly, be consistent. Even small monthly meetings build trust and momentum over time.

If you're ready to get started but aren't sure where to begin, The Flossy Organization can help. We've worked with residents to launch block-level initiatives and connect them with the tools, contacts and support they need.

we'll help you take the first step.

Strong blocks make strong neighborhoods, and strong neighborhoods make sure Canarsie stays a place where people look out for each other and have a real say in its future. Don't wait knock on a door, make that call and start building the block you want to live on.

Two Shot at Party Hall

Two men are in critical condition after being shot at Jam Rock, located at 900 East 52nd Street, in the early morning hours on Sunday, August 10th.

Police from the 67th Precinct responded to the location, near Farragut Road, around 1:30 a.m. where they found the victims: a 59-year-old male, who was shot in his chest, and a 35-year-old male, who was shot in his abdomen, according to police sources. The suspect fled in a light-colored sedan.

Both victims were taken to Kings County Hospital by EMS in critical condition, police said.



Triple Shooting Near Restaurant

Police are investigating a triple shooting that left three men wounded outside the Island Seas Lounge, at 1440 Utica Avenue, on Monday, August 4th.

Officers from the 67th Precinct arrived at the location, near Farragut Road, around 4:35 a.m. where they found a 26-year-old man with a gunshot wound to the left leg and a 38-year-old man with a gunshot wound to the left hand.

The victims were taken by EMS to Brookdale Hospital in stable condition, according to police.

An unidentified man, in his 20s, told police he was shot in his left leg. Police said that he did not remain at the scene.

A trail of blood could be seen near a BMW without a license plate, as police conducted an investigation.

Two Shot, Florida Man Fatally

Two men were shot in front of 160 Glenmore Avenue, near Powell Street, on Sunday, August 3rd, and unfortunately one of the victims did not survive his injuries.

Police from the 73rd Precinct responded to the location, near the Powell Playground, around 12:35 a.m. where they found a 41-year-old male with multiple gunshot wounds to his leg and a 42-year-old male with a gunshot wound to his stomach.

EMS took both victims to Brookdale Hospital. The 41-year-old was listed in stable condition, but

Johnny Hughes, the 42-year-old victim, was pronounced dead at the hospital, police said. He was a resident of Kissimmee, Florida.

Sixty-Ninth Precinct and Community Celebrate National Night Out Against Crime

The true spirit of National Night Out Against Crime was on full display at Canarsie Park, on Tuesday, August 5th, when community members, elected officials, civic leaders and members of the 69th Precinct got together for an evening of fun, laughter, games, live music, dancing and great food.

The purpose of the event was to promote camaraderie and foster good relations between the NYPD and the community. The celebration was sponsored by the 69th Precinct Community Council and began with prayers from a host of clergy. Father Edward Kane from Holy Family Church, Reverend Gesner Sagesse and Pastor Mullery Jean-Pierre from the 69th Precinct Clergy Council, and Pastor Windsor Nelson prayed for continued unity within the community. They implored special blessings on the leaders and especially first responders who put their lives on the line daily.

The occasion, which attracted hundreds of constituents, was attended by Congressman Hakeem Jeffries, Congresswoman Yvette Clarke, Assemblywomen Jaime Williams and Monique Chandler-Waterman, Councilwoman Mercedes Narcisse and Councilman Christopher Banks, as well as representatives from the offices of Governor Kathy Hochul, Mayor Eric Adams, State Senator Roxanne Persaud and Assemblywoman Nikki Lucas.

The elected officials commended Gardy Brazela, president of the 69th Precinct Community Council, for organizing the annual event but more so for his commitment and dedication to community building. "When we do our National Night Out, we come together, and it is us coming together and lifting each other up that makes all the difference in gaining the victory," Clarke said.

She presented Brazela, whom she referred to as "that bridge to the precinct that every community needs," with a proclamation from the House of Representatives, expressing gratitude and appreciation to him and the Community Council for their devoted service. The group also received similar commendations from Hochul, Adams and Persaud.

Clarke then introduced Jeffries, who told the gathering, "It is always a blessing to be here in Canarsie. I'm so appreciative of your hard work and the work that's being done, the partnership between the police and the community, to keep our neighborhoods safe."

A plethora of community partners including CERT, E.N.O.U.G.H., My Time Inc., The Flossy, CABS, Met Council, One Brooklyn Health, *Canarsie Courier*, Brooklyn Canarsie Lions, Canarsie Merchants Association and the Kings County District Attorney's office, as well as NYPD Explorers and NYPD Recruiters, were also present. They shared information about resources available through their organizations and gave away trinkets and bags with other goodies.

The NYPD also distributed boxes of non-perishables in addition to serving hot dogs, hamburgers, snacks and other refreshments. The celebration also included a Black History art display from one resident. There were games and special treats for the children who ran around and played or rode their bikes and roller skates. A young boy seemed quite smitten with two turtles and a bird that were brought to the celebration.

Deputy Inspector Dion Hinds, commanding officer of the 69th Precinct, lauded the Community Council and Community Affairs Unit for hosting the event. He also extended special thanks to the elected officials for their ready support in making the occasion possible.

Brazela also expressed thanks to the elected officials and community partners who came together to make the event a success. He included special "welcome back" appreciation to Brooklyn Bureau Chief Frank Giordano, who at one time served as commanding officer of the 69th Precinct.

Councilwoman Farah Louis and Assemblyman Kalman Yeger welcomed the crowd and reminded everyone that our cops put a lot on the line to protect and serve the community. Fred Kreizman, Commissioner of the Community Affairs Unit, presented Captain Abdullraha Hussein and the precinct with a proclamation.

Elected officials greeted attendees, and Councilwoman Mercedes Narcisse could be seen playing cornhole with a few youngsters.





Canarsie Says Goodbye to Fallen Hero: Hundreds Mourn Security Guard Killed in Midtown Shooting

A local hero was honored as the Canarsie community gathered to say goodbye to one of its own, Aland Etienne. On Saturday, August 9th, the 46-yearold security guard who was killed in the mass shooting at 345 Park Avenue on July 28th was laid to rest. The Guarino Funeral Home was filled with mourners: family, friends, union colleagues and elected officials, all honoring a sacrifice that reached far beyond Brooklyn.

During the service, his best friend spoke about texting Etienne during the shootings, saying, "Hey, something is going on in your area." Etienne never responded, and the next day he found out that his lifelong best friend was a victim of the mass shooting. Cries from loved ones filled the funeral home, some sending chills down mourners' spines.

Among the mourners was Cadley, who was emotional yet composed. "Alan is my dad's cousin. They grew up together in Haiti. He was like a big, bright bowl of sunshine," she said. "Any room he walked into — you noticed him. Always smiling, full of energy. He loved his family and his brothers. When I first met him at 18, he immediately started talking about them. He was very supportive. He loved his kids. He'd sit down, listen and say, 'Breathe. Pray. You got this.' I still can't believe he's gone. It's ridiculous — no gun control, and all these politicians just sit there. If you met him, you would have loved him."

His colleague Al, who worked with him at Blackstone, shared a touching memory of their daily chats: "We talked every day. My name's Alan too, so he'd say, 'What's up, Alan?' and I'd reply, 'What's up, Al?' He was a really cool brother. We'll miss him. We all loved him there." He paused, grief clear in his voice. "They gave us time off and therapy at work, but it's hard to deal with. It's unimaginable."

Etienne's bravery on that tragic day was commemorated throughout the service. While stationed at his post when the shooter entered the building in Midtown Manhattan, the security guard tried to stop the assailant's progress by halting the elevator — an act that likely saved lives at the cost of his own. Investigators reported that he ducked behind the security desk, trying to secure the building before he was fatally struck.

Union leaders referred to him as a quiet hero. Manny Pastreich, president of 32BJ SEIU, described Etienne as "a dedicated security officer who took his job seriously," praising his commitment and calling him "a New York hero."

The sanctuary was filled with sorrow, but it also overflowed with love. Voices shared stories of Etienne's kindness, resilience and joy. Community leaders urged for stronger protection for frontline security staff and for tougher nationwide gun safety laws. Councilwoman Farah Louis highlighted the pain felt across the Haitian community and stressed the importance of mental health support and legislative reform.

As the service ended and Etienne's casket was carried out into the warm August light, the crowd followed in quiet tribute. Some held hands, while others carried flowers. The streets of Canarsie seemed to pause in respect, honoring a man who gave everything so others could be safe.

Aland Etienne leaves behind his children, including a brave young son who served as a pallbearer, his grandchildren, partner Rachelle Paoli and a grieving community that will remember his sacrifice. His legacy — a story of service, hope and love - will live on. A GoFundMe campaign is nearing \$200,000 to support his family.






