#### **Carnival on Eastern Parkway**

Every Labor Day, Eastern Parkway bursts into a kaleidoscope of color, rhythm and culture as a sea of revelers gather for the annual West Indian American Day Carnival Parade. What may look like a massive street party is, in truth, one of New York City's most important cultural traditions — one that tells a story of survival, resilience and joy.

The West Indian American Day Carnival Association (WIADCA), founded in 1967, has carried the torch of Caribbean heritage in Brooklyn for nearly six decades. But Carnival's roots stretch much deeper. During slavery, African-descended people in the Caribbean were forbidden from celebrating their traditions. After emancipation, they claimed the streets as their stage, transforming Carnival into a celebration of freedom — infusing African rhythms and bold artistry into something wholly their own.

That spirit traveled to New York with Caribbean immigrants in the early 20th century. In the 1920s, Trinidadian Jesse Waddle hosted the first Carnival celebrations indoors in Harlem ballrooms. But Carnival could not be contained by walls. By the 1940s, she secured a permit to bring Carnival into the streets, aligning it with Labor Day. After Harlem permits were revoked, Carlos Lezama and WIADCA established Eastern Parkway as Carnival's permanent home in 1969.

Since then, the parade has grown into one of the largest cultural events in New York. Yet beyond its size, Carnival is significant for what it represents. Each



elaborate costume, each steelpan note, each masquerader on the road is a declaration of pride. Carnival says: We are here, we belong, and we will celebrate who we are unapologetically.

This year's theme, "Vive Le Carnivale!" speaks directly to that legacy of resilience. Through the pandemic and social challenges, WIADCA and the community have kept Carnival alive. The week of events — from Youth Fest to Panorama to the grand parade — ensures traditions are passed to the next generation while fueling Brooklyn's cultural and economic life.

Here in Canarsie, the connection to Carnival is deeply felt. Our neighbors — masqueraders, steelpan players, costume designers and food vendors — spend weeks preparing for this day. Our youth join junior bands and pan groups, carrying forward traditions passed down by their parents and grandparents. Unions, too, play a visible role marching proudly alongside the bands, linking the celebration of Caribbean

heritage to the fight for workers' rights and dignity. Canarsie helps power this parade, and in return, Carnival reminds us of the pride and strength within our own community.

For Canarsie and beyond, the West Indian Day Parade is more than spectacle. It is a living history lesson, a youth platform, an economic driver and, above all, a celebration of cultural survival. When the drums beat and the masqueraders dance down Eastern Parkway, they carry forward a tradition born in struggle and reborn in joy.

#### **Police Seeking Canarsie Carjacker**

The NYPD is asking the public's assistance in identifying an individual wanted in connection with a robbery that occurred in Canarsie on Friday, July 18th, and has released a picture of the suspect.

Police said the incident occurred around 9:15 a.m. in the vicinity of East 87th Street and Glenwood Road.

A 61-year-old man was sitting in the driver's seat of his parked vehicle when an unidentified individual approached his car, opened the front passenger side door and entered the vehicle. The suspect demanded that the victim drive him toward Ditmas Avenue, according to official police sources.

When the victim refused, the individual placed his hand on his waist, simulating possession of a weapon, and then demanded that the victim exit the vehicle while making verbal threats to shoot him. The victim exited, and the individual fled the location in the vehicle. Shortly thereafter, the carjacker abandoned the

vehicle and fled on foot in an unknown direction. The victim was not injured, according to police.

The suspect is described as a black male, about 5 feet 8 inches. He was last seen wearing a black t-shirt, blue jeans and black sneakers.

#### Two People Robbed at Gateway Center

Police are looking for three suspects wanted in connection to a robbery that occurred at Gateway Center mall last month. The NYPD has released photos of all three and are asking for the public's assistance in identifying them.

Around 4:30 p.m. on Monday, August 25th, an 18-year-old female and two males, ages 16 and 5, were standing at the rear of 495 Gateway Drive when two unidentified individuals approached them, according to police.

The first individual displayed a firearm and demanded money. Both of the suspects then removed approximately \$600 from the two adult victims and fled the location on foot, traveling northbound on Gateway Drive, where they later handed the money to a third unidentified individual. The three unidentified individuals fled in an unknown direction. The victims were not injured, police said.

The first suspect is described as a black male who was last seen wearing a white t-shirt and blue jeans.



The second suspect is described as a black male who was last seen wearing green pants and yellow sneakers. He has a tattoo on his chest and a tattoo of a heart on his left forearm. The third suspect is described as a black female who was last seen wearing a blue shirt and gray shorts. She has tattoos on her left arm, neck and legs.



#### **Bats Spotted During Night Walk**

Bat enthusiasts of all ages converged on Seba Playground, at the intersection of Seba and Gerritsen Avenues, in droves, on Thursday evening, August 14th, suffused in citronella, fully prepared to brave the mosquito-ridden backwoods of Gerritsen Beach, where no amount of bug spray is ever enough to repel the bloodsucking hordes.

As Roxanne Quilty, executive director of the Gotham Bat Conservancy, explained to the large group of chiropterophiles who had come to admire local bats in their natural habitat, the buggiest of areas are the best places to find bats. That is because New York bats are insectivores, some capable of eating as many as 10,000 mosquitoes in a single evening!

Quilty began the "Bats! Night Walk" event with a captivating presentation, dispelling many of the most common myths about bats and providing an excellent introduction to the nine species of bats found in New York and their usual haunts. Most were surprised to learn that bats are one of the few pollinators of night-blooming species of plants, like agave and banana, and that female bats exhibit strong site fidelity, meaning they return to the same maternal roost each year, raising their young communally.

The group also learned that bat populations are more threatened than ever before, due to a lethal, endemic fungal disease called White Nose Syndrome or pseudogymno-

ascus destructans, which is characterized by a white, fuzzy growth on the bats' muzzles, ears and wings. Quilty also discussed the science behind bioacoustics and echolocation and shared how acoustic monitoring helps the Conservancy to understand where and how bats live and informs targeted conservation strategies.

After dark, Quilty led the eager group of bat lovers through the backwoods, deep into the bush, well past the airfield and down several paths, where they successfully observed bats flying overhead and were able to witness the process of acoustic monitoring firsthand. The event was really quite a thrill and as one participant explained, "well worth the bug bites" he had endured.





#### **Gerritsen Beach**

#### **Expert Anglers Teach the Basics at Free Fishing Clinic**



There are plenty of fish in the sea, and Gerritsen Beach is the perfect place to catch some.

Families lined up at the southernmost end of Gerritsen Avenue on Monday afternoon, August 4th, to participate in a free fishing clinic sponsored by the Marine Park Alliance and the NYS Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC).

There, a handful of expert anglers educated community members of all ages on basic fishing techniques like baiting a hook, casting a line, reeling in catch and then throwing it back. First-time anglers learned that they might catch any number of fish passing through the busy waterways this time of year, including bluefish, striped bass and even sea robins.

"This is awesome," a youngster squealed as he bopped up and down with excitement, his Dad looking on proudly and videoing his son's very first fishing experience. "This is great," the boy's father told the Canarsie Courier. "We wanted to see if we would like it and now that we learned the basics, we're going to buy some rods and make this a regular thing. It's just too bad we have to throw the fish back; I was hoping to bring something home for dinner."

According to the DEC, the catch and release method is commonly practiced to "ensure that mature, healthy fish can spawn again and helps to perpetuate a fit population of quality-size fish for future angling enjoyment." In fact, the expert anglers advised participants to handle fish gently and as little as possible: to quickly snap a photo, remove the hook and then release the fish right away, minimizing their time out of the water.

It may also be a good idea to throw fish back because they could be unsafe for human consumption, according to the NYS Department of Health's website, which suggests some species in some areas could be contaminated by pollutants like PCBs and dioxin. 
