From Canarsie to the World: Building Power and Changing Policy

Over the weekend, the Obama Foundation featured our journey in their newsletter, highlighting the incredible work happening right here in Canarsie. It was surreal to see our community's story amplified on such a global stage - a reminder that the work we're doing to build power and create change has significance far beyond our own neighborhood.

When I started The Flossy Organization, we didn't have much no big budgets, no staff, just a group of neighbors united by heart, fire and a shared belief that we could change the trajectory of our community. Our first fight was to stop a harmful pesticide facility from being built dangerously close to a school bus depot and a local fresh produce market. We organized under the banner "Toxic Facility? Hell No!" and against all odds, we won. That victory wasn't just about stopping one project; it was about proving to ourselves and our neighbors that we do have the power to shape our future.

Since then, we've continued to fight for Canarsie. After the tragic shooting of a young man named Jamere Jones, our community came together for a two-year campaign that secured \$1.6 million to launch a Cure Violence site in Canarsie. This initiative brings resources like Violence Interrupters, mental



health care and job training directly to the people who need them most. It's already making a tangible impact, helping to reduce shootings and bring healing to families who've endured unimaginable pain.

Being part of the Obama Scholars program this past year has given me the chance to dream even bigger. I've learned from some of the most brilliant minds, met fellow changemakers from around the world and even had the opportunity to bring them to Canarsie to see firsthand what we're building together.

To my neighbors in Canarsie: don't let anyone talk you out of your dreams, goals or purpose. Our story proves that even when resources are scarce, when belief and community are strong, anything is possible.

This story is about us, the people of Canarsie, standing up and showing the world what's possible when we rise together.



Ceiling Collapse at IHOP Injures Nine People

An investigation is underway after a portion of the ceiling at the Georgetown IHOP collapsed while patrons were enjoying their breakfast last week.

A 10-foot by 10-foot section of the ceiling collapsed at the pancake house, located at 2101 Ralph Avenue, around 9:25 a.m. on Friday, September 5th, causing minor injuries to nine patrons.

Engine Company 309 and Tower Ladder 159 arrived at the location, which was undergoing minor renova-

tions, including the building's sign, roof and exterior lighting.

Five of the injured were taken to area hospitals, while four refused medical attention.

The collapse of the ceiling is believed to be due to water damage from the roof, but an investigation is still ongoing by the Department of Buildings (DOB).

The DOB issued a violation to the owner for failure to maintain property.

Stabbing at IHOP Leaves One Dead, One Wounded

Detectives from the 69th Precinct arrested Wilber Salazar Rios, 44 of Hempstead, Long Island, on Sunday, September 7th, in connection to the stabbing death of Starrett City resident Hector Reinoso-Perez, 67, inside an East New York IHOP two days earlier.

Rios was charged with murder, assault with intent to cause serious physical injury and criminal possession of a weapon.

Police said the suspect allegedly stabbed Perez and another man while they were cleaning the IHOP lo-

cated at 11000 Flatlands Avenue, between Louisiana and Williams Avenue, at the end of their shift, around 10:40 p.m. on Friday, September 5th.

Officers found Perez with a stab wound to the torso and a 41-year-old male with a slash wound to the hand. EMS took Perez to Brookdale Hospital, where he was later pronounced dead. The 41-year-old victim was not hospitalized.

Crime Scene detectives were still processing the scene Saturday morning, where they removed two pieces of evidence.

Driver of Stolen Uber Killed After Hitting Building

The driver of a stolen Uber car was killed after he crashed into a building at Flatbush Avenue and Avenue J on Monday morning, September 8th

Firefighters and officers from the 63rd Precinct responded to the chaotic scene around 2:40 a.m., where they found a Honda Civic spilt in two and the driver ejected from the vehicle.

EMS took the 41-year-old car thief to Kings County Hospital where he was pronounced dead a short time later, police said.

A preliminary investigation revealed that the deceased stole the idling car from Regent Place and Flatbush Avenue, according to its 42-year-old owner who told police he left the car running when he exited the car. The robber then hopped in, sped southbound on Flatbush Avenue and jumped the curb, crashing into a building and also hitting a tree, snapping the car in two.

There is an ongoing investigation by the NYPD's Highway Collision Unit.







Sliwa Opens Brownsville Office, Building Urban Republican Movement Across NYC

Curtis Sliwa, Republican candidate for New York City mayor, officially opened his new campaign office on Friday, September 5th, drawing a large crowd of supporters and community members. The office, located at 55 Hegeman Avenue, represents part of Sliwa's strategy to expand his presence in neighborhoods that he says have been "abandoned" by the city's current leadership.

At the ribbon-cutting and press conference, Sliwa emphasized his roots in Brownsville and nearby East New York, recalling his upbringing in the neighborhood and his decades of activism with the Guardian Angels. "I don't forget where I've lived. I don't forget where my seeds have been planted," Sliwa told the crowd. "I am the street candidate, the subway candidate, the people's mayor."

Sliwa framed his candidacy as an alternative to Mayor Eric Adams and other Democratic rivals, who he accused of abandoning working-class New Yorkers while spending billions on migrant services. One supporter said bluntly, "Adams sold us out, and he should get out of the race." Another, who voted for Adams in 2021, said they switched allegiance after seeing "all the money and giveaways for people that don't even belong in this country ... while our communities were left in poverty."





The event included voter registration, lawn signs and palm cards. Notably, the campaign recorded a party switch from Democrat to Republican, underscoring Sliwa's appeal to disaffected voters. He also highlighted what he called a new class of "Urban Republicans"— working-class, blue-collar citizens who once formed the backbone of the Democratic Party but who he says are now finding a home in his movement. "We don't apologize for who we are. We are the party of law and order, the party that protects working people, the elderly, women and children," Sliwa said.

The day also featured community recognition for Sayf Ramses, a local entrepreneur and organizer who overcame homelessness and challenges in the justice system to become a business owner and leader in Brownsville. Sliwa praised Ramses as an example of resilience and the kind of leadership he hopes to see thrive across New York City.

Janine Aquafredda, candidate for Brooklyn Borough President, was also present, praising Sayf for being a great community leader, organizer and entrepreneur. "The city needs leaders like him and Curtis Sliwa to represent our city," she said.

The Brownsville office opening follows other campaign stops across the boroughs, including southern Brooklyn and appearances at citywide events such as the West Indian Day Parade. With the General Election set for November 4th, and early voting beginning October 25th, Sliwa vowed to keep pressing his message in every neighborhood. "I will never forsake you when I'm mayor," he promised, to loud applause.

Supporters left energized, with chants of "Curtis, Curtis!" echoing outside the new headquarters. As one attendee put it: "Curtis Sliwa is our only hope — he talks the talk and walks the walk with the people."

On Sunday, August 10th, the Meyer Levin Youth Steel Orchestra filled the heart of Times Square with lively music. The orchestra's incredible performance for World Steelpan Day celebrated the talent and dedication of East Flatbush students on one of the world's most famous stages.

Each year, a new group of 6th-graders from the Meyer Levin School for the Performing Arts, located at 5909 Beverley Road, start their journey to become part of the advanced steelpan band.
