#### District 22 Members Explore Anti-Bullying Strategies

Members of Community District Education Council 22 (CEC 22) convened at the District Office, located at 5619 Flatlands Avenue, on Tuesday, October 7th, for their monthly meeting, which was also streamed live via Zoom to the public.

The group recognized that October is Bullying Prevention Month and discussed the objective of the NYC Public Schools anti-bullying campaign, "Kindness over Bullies," which aims to create a learning environment that is free of harassment, intimidation and discrimination, by combating bullying on two fronts -- prevention and intervention.

To prevent bullying before it starts, students are educated on the root causes of why kids bully and are encouraged to do their part to foster a culture of respect and acceptance, both in school and online.

There is also a strong emphasis on intervention, as students are encouraged



to step in to stop physical and verbal bullying behavior when it does happen. Students are encouraged to not just be a bystander, but to speak up, offer help and tell a trusted adult when they see bullying happen.


Officers from the 69th Precinct responded to a 911 call for an assault in the vicinity of Rockaway Parkway and Seaview Avenue on Saturday, October 4th

#### One-Year-Old Boy's Death Ruled a Homicide

Police found an unresponsive 1-year-old boy inside a Brownsville apartment, and his death is now being ruled a homicide.

Police from the 73rd Precinct made the tragic discovery when responding to a 911 call at 203 Newport Street, a 174-unit affordable housing complex located between Rockaway and Thatford Avenues, around 5 p.m. on Friday,

October 3rd.

The unconscious toddler, identified as Anthony Casey, was taken to nearby Brookdale Hospital where he was pronounced dead, police said.

There are no arrests at this time, and an investigation is ongoing, but the Medical Examiner's Officer reported that the little boy suffered blunt force injuries to his torso.

#### **Trapped Firefighters Rescued After Floor Collapses in Private Home**

Firefighters rescued two trapped firefighters after a floor collapse at 771 Williams Avenue, between Linden Boulevard and Dewitt Avenue, around 6 p.m. on Friday, October 10th.

While en route to the two alarm fire, members saw a heavy column of smoke in the air. Shortly after arriving on scene, they encountered heavy fire in the rear of the first floor of the two-story private residence.

About 120 members were battling the blaze, using five hose lines, when suddenly the floor above them collapsed, sending firefighters from the second floor onto the first floor and trapping them under heavy debris.

The 58th Battalion declared a mayday for firefighters in distress; this activated the Firefighter Assist Search Team (FAST) of Tower Ladder 120 who were at the scene. Their purpose is to remove downed or trapped firefighters. Other units from the FDNY's Special Oper-

ations Command of Squad Company 252, Rescue Company 2 with the collapse rig, Squad Company 1 from Park Slope and Rescue Company 4 removed the debris and firefighters from the complex operation within 15 minutes

The fire was placed under control at 7:45 p.m. The FDNY Fire Marshal's Office will determine the cause and origin of the fire.

Rescue paramedics took three firefighters and one civilian to Brookdale Hospital in stable condition, according to FDNY Chief of Operations Michael Meyers.







Prayer vigils are usually held on a monthly basis in crime-prone areas of Canarsie.







A solemn and emotional gathering took place on Sunday, October 5th, at Holocaust Memorial Park, at Emmons Avenue and Shore Blvd., marking two years since the October 7, 2023, Hamas terrorist attacks on Israel. Organized by Assemblyman Michael Novakhov, the Sheepshead Bay event brought together local leaders, faith organizations and community members to honor the victims and demand the safe return of all remaining hostages.

"Let's show our unity, because only together we are invincible," Novakhov said, addressing a crowd that included local clergy, civic groups and families of survivors. "Forty-eight innocent people remain in inhumane conditions. We demand their immediate return — the living and the dead."

Attendees observed moments of silence, prayed and read aloud the names of the known living hostages, including one IDF soldier held captive since 2014. Musical performances by local artists, including Ellina Graypel's moving rendition of "Hatikvah," accompanied the ceremony.

The event was attended by Ariel Noyman, founder of Run For Their Lives Sheepshead Bay; representatives from Chabad of Sheepshead Bay; The International Fellowship of Christians and Jews; American Russian-Speaking Jews Alliance; United Zionists; and The Association of East-European Jewry with founder Bella Gubenko and daughter Lana Gubenko. Elected officials in attendance included Assemblyman Alec Brook-Krasny and former Councilman Ari Kagan. Many neighbors in the community, including Holocaust survivors, were present.

Flags of Fellowship, a grassroots organization uniting people of all faiths in solidarity with Israel, joined the vigil, displaying blue-and-white flags throughout the park.

Local activist Stephanie Neta Benshimol delivered a powerful interfaith message, quoting directly from the Koran — "O my people! Enter the Holy Land which [God] has destined for you" (5:21) — as a declaration of the Jewish people's historic and spiritual connection to the land of Israel, recognized by the Muslim holy book. "We stand with America. We stand with Israel. We will not stop until every last hostage returns home," she said.

Novakhov later thanked attendees on his social media post:

"Sometimes music speaks louder than words ... thank you to everyone who came to support, helped and performed. It was both my honor and my duty to organize this moving event. Bring Them Home Now!"



#### **Breaking Developments Following the Vigil**

Just days after the Sheepshead Bay commemoration, the world received unexpected and historic news, when President Donald Trump announced in a Truth Social post that Israel and Hamas have agreed to the first phase of a peace plan, which includes the imminent release of all hostages and Israel's troop withdrawal as initial steps toward lasting peace.

Israel's Cabinet early Friday, October 10th, approved Trump's plan for a ceasefire in the Gaza Strip and the release of all remaining hostages held by Hamas, marking what could be the end of the two-year war.

Under the agreement, all 48 hostages — 20 alive and 28 deceased — are to be returned. Israel is set to withdraw its troops to a newly agreed line, while Hamas will release hostages and approximately 2,000 Palestinian prisoners. Five border crossings, including Rafah, will reopen, and humanitarian aid will begin flowing immediately.

Trump, speaking from Washington, declared, "They are all coming back on Monday," as families of hostages in Tel Aviv and Jerusalem celebrated with tears and prayers.

The deal, mediated by Qatar, Egypt and Turkey, aims to bring a "strong, durable and everlasting peace," according to Trump's official statement.

For the Brooklyn community, one of hope and resilience, the timing of the announcement felt providential. The same week they prayed for unity and deliverance, hope was restored. "Perhaps our prayers were heard," one attendee said, reflecting on the event.

In Holocaust Memorial Park, the refrain "Am Yisrael Chai — the people of Israel live" echoed once more, this time with a renewed sense of faith that peace and justice may finally be within reach.

#### Park Pals Explore Gardens in Hopes of Spotting Butterflies

The tiniest Park Pal scientists were in search of pollinators at a Marine Park Alliance "Just for Kids: Park Pals Pop-up" event, held at the gardens near the Carmine Carro Community Center, at 3000 Fillmore Avenue, on Saturday, September 27th. They were drawn to the milkweed plant, near the bocce courts, in hopes of a monarch butterfly sighting, and a team from the Jamaica Bay-Rockaway Parks Conservancy (JBRPC) made sure to engage and intrigue all plant-sized scientists, aged 5 and under.

JBRPC Director of Education and Public Programs Delilah McBride explained what pollinators (animal helpers) were and read a book explaining how caterpillars change into butterflies. She encour-

aged the children to think about what they would look for during the garden exploration. Many raised their hands, and some called out, "flowers, bees and butterflies." Several wanted to share that they had either been stung or knew someone who had been stung by a vicious bee (everyone can relate).

JBRPC Education and Public Programs Manager Caitlin Deblois led toddlers and their parents on a scavenger hunt of nature items around Marine Park. Children were handed magnifying lenses with lanyards for tiny scientists to put around their necks, cards with picture items that they needed to locate (pink flowers, soil, butterflies, shady areas, sunlight, etc.), and they were sent on their way to explore.

Deblois also shared her knowledge about an application called Seek with parents and how it can identify plants. All you have to do is point your phone toward the plant, snap a shot and you can become an expert.

Everyone was serious about their discoveries. "Be the pollinator," one parent said, as their child blew the puff from a dandelion ready to carry its seeds the distance.

All tiny scientists reconvened in the Carro Center to participate in culminating activities that everyone enjoyed. Some children moved the pretend pollen and flowers to different areas at the pollen sensory station; a lot of the children transformed into their favorite pollinator in the dramatic play station, and most made sure that they planted in recyclable pots, something they could take with them and that would foster growth.

McBride wanted working parents to be able to take advantage of local, free educational programs, available during the times when busy parents were free (on the weekends or when kids don't have school)

JBRPC Park Pals will be holding another pollinator session at Floyd Bennett Field, during Open House New York Weekend, on Sunday, October 19th, at 10 a.m.

proudly served this community with passion and purpose. We've created spaces for culture, mentorship and hope - investing our time, energy and resources into building Canarsie up, not tearing it down.

Yet today, the reality is alarming.

Small businesses — the true backbone of any neighborhood - continue to struggle, left to fend for themselves without consistent support or vision from leadership. Instead of progress, Canarsie is sliding backward, worse off than it was a decade

to survive, too many elected officials remain focused on photo opportunities and political games rather than real solutions.

Funding flows into unproductive organizations that fail to meet their core missions, serving instead as political arms and personal platforms for influence. Meanwhile, Canarsie's families and businesses are paying the price.

Franchise corporations are celebrated as if they were local mom-and-pops, while real small business owners - those who

For the past five years, TriniJam BK has ago. While residents and entrepreneurs fight pour their lives into this community — are ignored. #### Office of District Planning Presents Proposal to Create a **New Site for District 75 Students at CEC 18 Meeting**

\*Terms and Conditions apply.

The New York City Department of Education Office of District Planning (ODP) shared information on a proposal to create a new site for a District 75 (D75) elementary school at the Community Education Council for District 18 (CEC 18) meeting on Monday, October 6th, held at the District Office, located at 1106 East 95th Street.

Guest speaker and ODP Associate Director of Brooklyn North Planning Chris Gurley explained that they partner with school communities, CECs, superintendents, community stakeholders and other affiliations across NYC public schools to assess the needs and priorities within districts and design plans throughout the planning process, which includes community input. Any school that requires significant changes, like the current proposal, will need to follow the Chancellor's Regulation A-190 where their proposal will be reviewed for approval.

The re-siting outline for District 18 (D18) would involve moving 1st-graders from P.S. 235 Janice Marie Knight School, at 525 Lenox Road, to P.S. 235 Annex (K855), located at 5811 Ditmas Avenue, which has underutilized capacity.

This move would allow the student population to be more evenly distributed between the two buildings and would provide the space that P.S. 235 needs for student support services such as speech and occupational therapy. Principal Nicola Grants, along with others, thinks that future 1st-graders, instead of kindergartners, will benefit from the extra year and easier transition to their 2nd-grade year at P.S. 235.

First-graders (current kindergarten students) from P.S. 235 would join P.S. 235 Annex (K855) kindergarten students for the 2026-2027 school year in a building that would still have the capability to hold a new D75 eightsection program.


A new program would open seats for D75 students that have been traveling up to 45 minutes outside D18 to access their IEPs (Individualized Education Programs), giving them the opportunity to attend a school in their own neighborhood. Integrating D75 and general education students teaches students to learn tolerance, deference and acceptance from their peers.

Gurley explained that community engagement and feedback is a crucial part of the planning process. Representatives from offices will attend meetings, hold virtual opportunities to allow questions and ensure that every voice is heard.

There will be a virtual joint public hearing on November 5th at 6 p.m. that will allow the community an opportunity to listen to the proposal and a chance to comment and ask questions. Contact your local CEC member for the link or email cgurley@schools.nyc.gov.

"We saw this as an opportunity to be responsive to Principal Grant's ideas for how she can better support her school community and also we saw the opportunity to address the D75 needs that we have in D18," Gurley said.

CEC 18 will hold its next meeting at 7 p.m. on Monday, November 3rd, at the District Office.



#### Visitors Get Up Close and Personal with Birds of Prey

Although clouds and the threat of heavy winds and rain loomed over the area, the weather held out long enough for bird lovers to experience the thrill of seeing real-life raptors up close and personal at the Salt Marsh Nature Center, at 3301 Avenue U, on Saturday, October 11th.

Hundreds of visitors had the rare opportunity to meet and greet a variety of impressive predatory birds, also known as raptors, at the eighth annual Raptorama! festival, a collaboration of NYC Bird Alliance, American Littoral Society and the Marine Park Alliance Forever Wild Committee.

Families with young children, professional and amateur nature photographers, and bird aficionados alike were mesmerized by the majesty of the birds of prey and were very eager to learn more about them, as falconry-gloved handlers walked around with the perched raptors.

All of the birds on display had been rescued and rehabilitated, and while unable to return to the wild, they now serve as ambassadors of their species by doing important community outreach work that contributes to avian conservation.

While the largest birds -- Montana, the Bald Eagle; and Augie, the Eurasian Eagle-Owl -- made the biggest impressions on visitors, there were a number of other, smaller species who were also absolutely captivating, like an adorable little Kestrel, a Peregrine Falcon, a Raven, a Western Barn Owl, a Red-Shouldered Hawk and Red-Tailed Hawk.

Children were also invited to create their own Kestrel and Osprey bird gliders, observe monarch butterflies and explore the Nature Center throughout the educational event.
