#### Celebrating the PaleFO Cinema Mural and Canarsie Third Space

This past Sunday, Canarsie came alive with celebration as neighbors, artists and advocates gathered for the official ribbon-cutting of the PaleFO Cinema Mural and the unveiling of the Canarsie Third Space Initiative. What once lived only in imagination has now taken vibrant form — a living testament to what happens when creativity and community come together.

The PaleFO Cinema Mural -Canarsie's first-ever cinema mural — is far more than an artistic installation. It is a declaration of visibility, belonging and pride. Adorned with floral imagery and cinematic motifs, the mural transforms the iconic Jerry Building into a landmark of light and meaning. It symbolizes the rebirth of cinema in "cinema deserts" like Canarsie, where access to arts and storytelling has long been limited.

This bold vision was brought to life by Eileen Level, the founder of PaleFO Cinema and the visionary mind behind this project. Eileen's leadership, passion and perseverance turned an idea into action — a place where film and civic life intersect to remind us that access to the arts is not a privilege but a right. A teen is recovering after being stabbed in the back on Sunday, October 19th.

Officers from PSA 2 and the 75th Precinct responded to reports of a stabbing in the vicinity of Cozine Avenue and Jerome Street, where they found a 13-year-old male suffering from two stab wounds to the back around 3:30 p.m.

EMS rushed the teen to Brookdale Hospital where he was listed in stable condition.

No arrests have been made, and an investigation is


reported to police. The suspect fled on foot in an unknown direction.

# P.S. 115 Receives \$500,000 From Councilwoman Narcisse to Renovate Gymnasium

On Tuesday, October 14th, Councilwoman Mercedes Narcisse hand-delivered a check for \$500,000 to Principal Jonathan Lee of P.S. 115 Daniel Mucatel School, located at 1500 East 92nd Street, for much-needed renovations to the school's gymnasium.

Lee, accompanied by Assistant Principals Stephanie Rush and Tamella Trapp, gathered with other teachers and students in the gymnasium to celebrate the donation. "I think it's an amazing, amazing gift and an opportunity for our kids to receive this funding," Lee told the *Canarsie Courier*.

The principal noted that some "patchwork" cosmetic repairs were recently made to the gymnasium but acknowledged that major improvements, which include leveling out the water-damaged subflooring, are still needed. "As you can see, the gym looks great right now, but there are still some real problems for

our kids," he stated.

He also added that he envisions the gym being remodeled to a state-of-theart facility that includes an electronic scoreboard, retractable stairs and air conditioner and where the children could have physical education, basketball games and track-and-field. "I feel so blessed to receive this funding. Now we could really do some amazing things for our gym and kids," he stated excitedly.

Narcisse told the *Canarsie Courier* that the \$500,000 investment is part of over \$15 million in capital funding she was able to secure for District 46 in the Fiscal Year 2026 City Budget.

"Our schools deserve high quality facilities where children can learn, play and thrive," Narcisse said. "Principal Lee is a phenomenal leader and advocate for his students, and I'm proud to support the incredible work he and his team do every day."

Once a Canarsie kid, now an extraordinary recording artist, playwright and actress, Marla Mase has performed on stages all over the world, but she's never forgotten where she came from. In fact, she and her father, longtime Canarsie resident, Howard Mase, have taken their memories of growing up in Brooklyn and transformed them into a sold-out theatrical production that has delighted audiences young and old, near and far.

The brainchild of their show, Being Somebody, was a collection of short stories Howard penned in 1988, at the age of 53, during a particularly uncertain time in his life. Having just recovered from Non-Hodgkin lymphoma and unsure of his future, Howard, true to his background as a psychologist, began to reflect on his life and write his memories down, inadvertently creating a treasury of coming-of-age stories with incredibly universal themes. Howard was known to pull his collection out from time to time and greatly enjoyed reading his work aloud to small groups at social gatherings, but it wasn't until his beloved wife Roberta passed away that he shared them with Marla's friend and acting coach, Elizabeth Browning.

After hearing him read, Browning was convinced Howard's work could be adapted into a show and while he had never acted on a stage, he was open to the idea of being able to read from his script throughout the performance. A project like this was just what he needed to keep him going after losing his wife of 64 years, and it was a great way to bring him closer to Marla in a meaningful way. Not only was Marla in support of the idea, but she was also ready and willing to join him on stage, selecting stories from her own life that mirrored the themes of his and added her own musical touches, in what is, in many ways, an homage to Canarsie.

Marla opens the show with a song, a self-described scrappy kid in the 1970s, playing kickball, dodgeball, and cops and robbers in the alleyways of East 84th and 85th Streets, between Avenues L and M, on hot summer nights. She shares how that was her life at 8 years old, capturing that carefree but fleeting aspect of childhood, while also realizing how fortunate she was to have a family that made her feel so loved and safe.

While Howard grew up in the Boro Park, Bensonhurst areas and moved to East Flatbush after he got married, he finally settled in Canarsie to be closer to his wife's family, where he has remained ever since, a Canarsien tried and true. Most of the stories in the show are about Howard's early years, living with his extended family, his dog, school days, a run-in with a cruel teacher and a moment that took him from last sports pick to a hero, but the final story in his collection is about how he met his wife. It was something he added because he really wanted Roberta to be a part of this personal production.

The show's incredible success was kind of unexpected, as neither Howard nor Marla could have anticipated that it would resonate with such a wide audience, but their combined achievement is a tremendous inspiration and a testament to the power of being open to opportunities, even if it seems too late to start something new and intimidating. In Howard's words, "If you are physically able to, and mentally capable, then you are never too old to be young.'



#### **Caravan for Curtis Rolls Through Brooklyn from Flatlands to Bay Ridge**

Horns blared and flags waved as a spirited caravan of vehicles by "New Yorkers First" wound its way from the 2049 Flatbush Avenue campaign office through eight southern Brooklyn neighborhoods on Saturday, October 11th, rallying support and "get out the vote" for mayoral candidate Curtis Sliwa.

The convoy drew cheers, applause and chants of "Curtis! Curtis!" from sidewalks and storefronts as it passed through diverse communities even pausing along Coyle Street in Sheepshead Bay, where neighbors fight the ongoing battle against a "bait-andswitch" plan for a homeless shelter. Tshirts and other campaign goodies were distributed throughout the journey to its final destination.

The rolling show of energy culminated in Bay Ridge, where Sliwa officially opened his newest campaign headquarters at 8823 Third Avenue.

By the time Sliwa's team arrived, nearly 200 supporters had gathered outside the freshly opened office despite early rain. The Bay Ridge office marks the tenth campaign headquarters opened across the city — a sign of what Sliwa called "a grassroots movement powered by the people, not the political elites."

He also praised Norman "Sayf" Ramsay, district leader in Brownsville, for establishing the first Republican head-quarters ever in that neighborhood. "We are urban Republicans," Sliwa declared, saying presence in these neighborhoods show "the real diversity and reach of our campaign."

Sliwa For Mayor lawn signs and posters have been spotted far and wide throughout Brooklyn. According to one supporter, "The other campaigns are nowhere to be found."

Sliwa drew sharp contrasts with his opponents, condemning "failed one-party rule that's made this city unsafe and unaffordable." He vowed to "Back the Blue," restore NYPD's homeless outreach units and stop the "City of Yes" rezoning plan that he argued threatens working-class communities. He further told gatherers that he is the only law and order candidate that will provide safe streets and subways and renew our quality of life for all New Yorkers.

"Don't listen to the media or the polls," Sliwa declared. "The momentum is in the streets — not on TV screens or in billionaire boardrooms. We're fighting for the real New York."







#### **Electric Avenue U: Rally Turns Into Get Out the Vote March**



#### turned out to rally against the city's controversial "baitand-switch" plan on Coyle Street. What began as a peaceful gathering at 2134 Coyle

What began as a peaceful gathering at 2134 Coyle Street quickly surged into a full-blown march of community pride and defiance. Organized by "New Yorkers First" and "Save South Brooklyn," the rally brought together residents, families and business owners determined to stop the city's plan to convert a long-promised affordable housing site into a homeless shelter.

The excitement, energy and enthusiasm were electric on Sunday, October 19th, as more than 550 residents

The crowd spilled onto Avenue U, shutting down traffic as marchers made their way from Coyle Street to Coney Island Avenue. Cheers, car horns and waving hands greeted them along the route as the rally turned into a spontaneous show of unity and a call to action ahead of early voting, which begins October 25th.

Leading the charge was Curtis Sliwa, candidate for New York City Mayor, who walked shoulder to shoulder with residents and his wife, Nancy. The couple were met with thunderous applause as they made their way through the neighborhood where Sliwa had stood with residents during the earliest days of the protest.

"This community was promised affordable housing for working families — not another shelter forced on them by City Hall," Sliwa declared to roaring approval. "Day One as Mayor — no more homeless shelters in residential neighborhoods!"

The rally featured impassioned opening remarks from Ron Canterino of New Yorkers First, who fired up the crowd, urging them to "make some noise" and "stand strong." Nancy Sliwa, introduced as the "next First Lady of New York City," praised residents for their courage and resilience.

"Curtis made this a top priority because he truly cares about each and every one of you," Nancy said. "His goal is improving — not moving. You are the last line between government overreach and community preservation. So, keep up the good fight — and get out and vote!"

Also in attendance was Athena Clarke, candidate for City Council in District 46, alongside other neighborhood advocates who oppose the city's bait-and-switch of the Coyle Street project.

The protest underscored a deepening frustration across southern Brooklyn with what residents describe as top-down decisions made without local input. "Our voices matter," one marcher said. "We were promised affordable housing. We're not against helping people — we're against being lied to."

As the rally ended, the crowd erupted once more in chants of "Vote for Curtis!" and "No homeless shelter!"

— their energy unbroken and their message clear: this

community intends to be heard, both on the streets and


at the ballot box.

As of press time, one of two mayoral debates already took place with Sliwa facing off with his opponents Andrew Cuomo and Zohran Mamdani, whom he dubbed as the architect and the apprentice, respectively, of the current crime crisis, cashless bail and destruction of NYC.





The Mill Basin Civic Association (MBCA) held its first meeting of the season on Tuesday, October 14th, at Mary Queen of Heaven Church, at 1304 East 57th

Street — for the last time at this location.

Starting next month, MBCA meetings will be held at the new Thomas Jefferson Democratic Club head-quarters, at 5809 Avenue T. The next meeting will take place on Tuesday, November 18th.

"It's sad to go, but I know that this new home will accommodate all of our new members and all those who are normally here," MBCA President Paul Curiale said.

The remainder of the meeting featured a slate of community updates from elected officials, police officers and community leaders.

Both Assemblywoman Jaime Williams and Councilwoman Mercedes Narcisse spoke critically of three of the six ballot proposals — "props" for short — that constituents will be voting on during the upcoming General Election. The elected officials said that props two, three and four, if voted into law by the people, would reduce Council members' power and their abilities to make decisions.

Prop two would fast-track the process for publicly financed affordable housing by removing the sevenmonth ULURP (Uniform Land Use Review Procedure) that incorporates input from the City Council for certain affordable housing projects. In place of the standing procedure would be one of two much shorter procedures that would allow for less input from the Council and community, which both Williams and Narcisse lamented. On the other hand, it would allow housing to be approved and built quicker.

Prop three would simplify the review process for modest housing and minor infrastructure projects by creating an Expedited Land Use Review Procedure, which would in many cases remove the Council's final review of the project. Once again, the politicians expressed disapproval of this measure; on the flip side, it would allow these land-use projects to get approved and underway faster.

Prop four would alter the current land use review process by creating an Affordable Housing Appeals Board made up of the mayor, Council speaker and respective borough president. This board would get the final say on the Council's decisions to reject or change affordable housing proposals by getting to vote to overturn the Council's decision. It would directly "go above" the heads of Council members in these situations, including the member representing the location the project is being proposed for.

Williams said the ballot proposals would strip away rights from the Council and community boards and give

them to developers. Narcisse said that south Brooklyn is different from the rest of the city and while some of these props might work for other communities, they wouldn't for her district.

"Not having their input really takes away our say at the table," Williams said.

"Two, three and four are not to our advantage," Narcisse said. "[They] take us out of the equation, and you hired us, you elected people to represent you, to talk about things you disagree with."

A representative of Vote NYC, Sandra Gilmour, also spoke, apolitically, about the election and ballot proposals.

"Voting is very important," she said. "Somebody is going to win these elections. We may like the person, we may not like the person, but what we want that person to understand when they win is that they don't represent their party anymore. They don't represent the caucus; they represent the whole community."

Narcisse also explained that the City Council officially established October as Youth Empowerment Month. The Council has a range of events and activities surrounding this theme throughout the month, including a recent Youth Empowerment Summit.

"We're always talking about the problems we're having, but we're not encouraging the next generation," Narcisse said. "If the young kids had things to do, things that can structure them, they will not hold a gun. The kids would not be killing each other if their lives mattered to them, if they felt special, felt important."

Two officers from the 63rd Precinct, Officer Paul Alva and Special Operations Lieutenant John Iskaros, addressed the audience about local crime.

Iskaros ran through some of the most common crimes reported in the community that residents should protect themselves from.

Women often leave their bags unattended while shopping at Kings Plaza Shopping Center, resulting in them getting stolen. Men often leave their wallets and key fobs in their cars, whether accidentally or by carelessness, which results in theft. People are also falling for "gypsy" scams, where a seemingly nice stranger hugs them or makes physical contact in order to steal something off their person.

The cop also informed attendees that people need to do a better job at reporting suspicious behavior in the

community, such as homes that constantly have people coming in and out, which could indicate a drug hot spot or brothel.

"Crime is opportunity," Iskaros said. "They don't just pick random people; they pick whoever the opportunity is, whatever you give them."

A police issue facing the entire city is a shortage of officers and the potential for many more to retire soon. Come January, 4,000 cops will be eligible for retirement and then another 3,000 six months later, creating concerns that the department could be heavily understaffed in the coming months. Making matters worse is a shorter roster of trainees signing up for the Police Academy.

"Just to say why I brought this up; it's not to scare you — it's to prepare you," Iskaros said. "Not to have to take things into your own hands, but you're going to have to not make yourself an easy victim."

On October 10th, a mural on the corner of Avenue T and Nostrand Avenue, dedicated to the memory of slain conservative political activist Charlie Kirk, was voluntarily replaced by the artist who painted it — after complaints about its political and religious message.

The mural, created by local Marine Park artist Joe Indart, was completed the previous week and featured Charlie Kirk's image, his birth and death dates (1993-2025), and a Bible verse from John 12:23, which offended some residents who then called the business associated with the wall to complain about it.

The business declined comment and did not want to provide the absentee owners' contact information. Those who were against the mural also declined to comment publicly for fear of backlash.

Meanwhile, several residents supported Indart, who is well known and appreciated for numerous paintings around town on everything from large wall murals to firehouse doors, businesses, homes, garages, schoolyards and more.

Best known for his 9/11 murals, much of Indart's work is paid, but he also voluntarily paints over graffiti to beautify the neighborhood; he volunteered to paint the wall on that corner for that purpose.

The location of the mural is in Madison, which is its own neighborhood, but is often considered a subsection of or adjacent to Sheepshead Bay. It lies between Sheepshead Bay, Marine Park and Midwood

In that area, the demographics are predominantly white, but residents said that it is religiously and politically diverse, which is why some found the subject matter in the context of the religious text inappropriate.

Initially, Indart told the *Canarsie Courier* that he didn't specify what he was going to paint to the owners of the wall other than "some clouds and sky" because he wasn't sure yet what he would put there. Once he was informed by the owners that the mural was causing problems and complaints, he voluntarily offered to replace it with something less politically polarizing and painted two eagles in its place to restore peace to the community.

But even as Indart was painting over the mural, other residents started to complain that it should stay up and expressed anger toward those who wanted it taken down.

"The people who agree with Charlie think this is a nice thing," said a passerby who stopped to ask what was going on. "If you don't agree, just walk on by." She said that there were lots of things that she didn't agree with in her neighborhood like the lithium-ion battery storage sites and people should complain about that instead.

Michael Dunn, who lives around the corner from the mural, said that he loved the Charlie Kirk mural. "It brings people closer to God and spreads a good message about Jesus," he said.

Others took a more neutral tone and expressed appreciation for what Indart has been doing to cover ugly graffiti that has been plaguing the neighborhood.

"I'm not for or against any of the political stuff. I support the artist here and what he's doing," Marine Park resident Frank Hidalgo said. He recently organized support for another Indart mural two blocks away on Avenue R and Nostrand Avenue to commemorate 9/11.

"I just wanted to surprise the neighborhood with an homage to Charlie Kirk, and apparently I did," Indart said. "Little did I know that this neighborhood was so divided."






