What's the Plan for 945 East 108th Street?

A major property in our community — the former nursing home at 945 East 108th Street — was quietly sold for \$11.4 million to a private investor, Abraham Posner, through the company, 913 East 108 LLC. This 33,000-square-foot facility once cared for older adults in Canarsie. Now, rumors are spreading that the new owner plans to convert it into a men's shelter — without a single conversation with the community.

Let's be clear about what Canarsie does need: housing that serves the people who already live and work here.

Our neighborhood needs truly affordable housing for working families who live here that are being priced out of Brooklyn. We need union-built housing that pays fair wages to local labor and supports stable careers. We need community-based developments that prioritize Canarsie residents — teachers, transit workers, doctors, nurses, first responders, retirees — the very people who have kept this neighborhood strong through every crisis.

Developers and city agencies must stop treating Canarsie as a dumping ground for projects decided elsewhere. We are not just a ZIP code on a map. We are a community of homeowners, renters, workers and small business owners who deserve a seat at the table before decisions are made — not after the deals are done.

That's why we're gathering for a Community Rally on Friday, November 14th, at 5:30 p.m. at 945 East 108th Street. This is about demanding transparency and insisting that new development reflects our priorities, not someone else's profit margin.

The future of Canarsie must be shaped by Canarsie. Our message is simple:

Build for the people who already call this neighborhood home. Build for the workers, the families and the next generation. Build with us — not behind closed doors

FDNY Mourns Firefighter Killed in Line of Duty

The FDNY is mourning the tragic line of duty death of Firefighter Patrick D. Brady of Tower Ladder 120. On Sunday, November 9th, members of the FDNY placed purple and black bunting at a ceremony held at the firehouse where Brady served, at 107 Watkins Street in Brownsville.

Brady, 42, an 11-year-veteran of the Department, suffered a medical emergency, which went into cardiac arrest, while operating on the roof of an all hands fire at 9407 Kings Highway, a six-story apartment building located between East 94th and East 95th Street in East Flatbush, around 9:30 p.m. on Saturday, November 8th.

Brady was treated at the scene by FDNY first responders and rushed to Brookdale Hospital where he was pronounced dead.

Mayor Eric Adams said that Brady gave his life protecting the city we all love and expressed his deep sympathy to his entire family. "There is no sacrifice that is more selfless than the actions that took place that evening," he said.

Brady came from a firefighting family with two cousins, Jimmy and Brian, in the elite Rescue Company 2, along with cousins and uncles. He leaves behind his wife, Kara.

"The entire FDNY is heartbroken over the loss of Firefighter Patrick Brady. Firefighter Brady was a dedicated public servant, and firefighting was in his blood," FDNY Commissioner Robert S. Tucker said.

A wake for Brady will be held at the Marine Park Funeral Home, 3024 Quentin Road, on Friday, November 14th, from 2 to 4 p.m. and 7 to 9 p.m.

His funeral will be held at the Church of St. Francis de Sales in Belle Harbor, Queens, on Saturday, November 15th, at 11 a.m.

Firefighter Patrick D. Brady is the 1,163rd member of the FDNY to die in the line of duty.

Empower Your Health: Breast Cancer Awareness

Medicine and technology have evolved, and preventive medicine can save lives. The month of October paid homage to Breast Cancer, a deadly yet curable disease.

Mammograms offer several benefits that can significantly improve health outcomes. One of the most notable advantages is the ability to detect breast cancer in its early stages. When cancer is found early, patients often face less aggressive treatment options and have a higher chance of survival.

Monitoring breast health regularly helps catch any identifying changes early, allowing for timely medical interventions before cancer can develop. Early detection not only opens up various treatment options but also enables

them to be customized to each patient's unique needs, resulting in better care. Recent improvements in imaging technology have made mammograms more reliable, helping reduce false alarms and the stress they cause. There's also a new technique called "AI-Enhanced Breast Cancer Detection" that can find signs of cancer beyond what the human eye can see. Beyond the medical implications, there is a psychological aspect to consider. Knowing that one is taking proactive steps for their health can alleviate anxiety and foster a sense of empowerment. Regular screenings provide reassurance, enabling individuals to feel in control of their health journey and to educate others in their communities.

"I'm a Survivor" -- The Valerie Bozeman Story

In 2011, Valerie Bozeman's yearly mammogram came up undetected. In early 2012, while exercising, she felt a pain in her upper right breast that raised alarms. Following a mammogram and a sonogram, she was diagnosed with stage 1 aggressive breast cancer at the age of 54. Although Bozeman, a longtime Spring Creek resident, had faith in her medical team, the diagnosis made her fear the worst, believing that this disease would end her life. "When you hear the C word, you think it's a death sentence," she told the Canarsie Courier. Bozeman entered survival mode and began her journey through surgery and treatment. Her chemotherapy lasted six months, following one month of radiation, and she recalls, "Every time I went to treatment, I cried; I couldn't believe what I was going through."

Determined to put cancer behind her, she surrounded herself with the right people. Bozeman emphasizes the importance of maintaining a positive support system. She was fortunate to have supportive friends and family, as well as new connections she made along the way. However, she did lose some people along the way, explaining, "People can't handle the transition that you are going through. Six months is a long time, and you learn a lot about who is truly there for you and who is not." During her treatment, she lost her hair and experienced limitations in her mobility.

Thirteen years after her recovery from breast cancer, she still reflects on her experience and worries about a potential recurrence. To this day, she suffers from neuropathy due to the side effects of chemotherapy, stating, "That's my reminder of what I went through."

Bozeman is now a two-time cancer survivor, having also conquered bladder cancer years after her breast cancer diagnosis. Her advice to anyone currently battling cancer is to stay strong, keep your faith and know that there will be light at the end of the tunnel. And for those who solely get mammograms, ask your physician for a sonogram as well. She actively supports those affected by cancer by participating in walks and events. Her goal is for her community to come together each year to walk through Spring Creek Towers in honor of those who have lost their battle, those who are fighting and those who have survived cancer.

Bozeman gratefully celebrated her 67th birthday at the beginning of November. Happy Birthday, Val!

Another Successful Lustgarten Pancreatic Cancer Research Walk

It was a crisp fall morning, but festive teams of people gladly showed up for the 15th Annual Lustgarten Pancreatic Cancer Research Walk, held near the Carmine Carro Community Center, located at 3000 Fillmore Avenue, in Marine Park on Sunday, October 26th

Everyone was ready for the 8:30 a.m. start time, where warm bagels, pastries and coffee were served, and participants could casually appraise the amazing community donations that became coveted raffle prizes -- and if you got cold, you could visit the tent that sold warm hoodies along with other must-have items.

Geena Bell-Partnow has hosted this annual walk every year in honor of her beloved mother, Joanne Bell, who passed from pancreatic cancer in 2010. Every year, the walk, and the number of sponsors and supporters, grows.

One could not help but notice the generous donations of the community businesses on the festive tables that were raffled off after the walk, and there was much chatter over the autographed Chevy Chase "Griswold" ice hockey jersey from Hobby Box and the \$100 Michael's of Brooklyn gift certificate. All profits go directly to Lustgarten Foundation Pancreatic Cancer Research.

Community Board 18 District Manager Sue Ann Partnow and Partnow's mother-in-law addressed the crowd before the walk, recognizing the generous local businesses that offered their support and encouraged participants to reciprocate that support by frequenting those establishments. The local businesses, civic associations, community members and the 63rd Precinct were hailed for their contribution to the annual success.

Sydney Carlin from Slope Fitness in Park Slope got the crowd warmed up and limber, ready for their laps around Marine Park with Zumba.

Partnow acknowledged and called out all the teams that showed up to represent a life that was lost or for someone who is fighting the battle with pancreatic cancer. "It is so important for us to raise awareness so that others have an earlier diagnosis, better treatment and more successful outcomes," Partnow said. She also applauded the crowd and the community for raising a total of over \$350,000 since the walk's inception.

Everyone gathered at the starting line, Partnow counted down and the crowd was off, making the walk around Marine Park. There was more Zumba and a cool-down session at the finish line, before thrilled raffle winners were announced.

Pancreatic cancer is one of the toughest cancers to detect and treat. Partnow and the teams, families, volunteers and supporters that show up and walk in remembrance of someone beloved help raise awareness and contribute to research for patient survival.

Over Two Million New Yorkers Cast Their Ballots in Mayoral Election

New York City elected its first Democratic Socialist mayor – Zohran Mamdani, who took 50.4% of the vote, at the largest turnout for a mayoral election in history.

Locally, Democrats won big, including incumbent candidates.

The 34-year-old Queens assemblyman won against former Governor Andrew Cuomo (41.6%), who ran as an Independent after losing to Mamdani in June's Democratic primary, and Republican candidate Curtis Sliwa (7.1%). Mayor Eric Adams, who dropped out of the race but whose name remained on the ballot, took 1% of the cha Felder (District 44).

Early voting in NYC, which took place over nine days, from October 25th to November 2nd, saw over 735,000 voters. During the General Election, on Tuesday, November 4th, more than one million voters showed up at the polls to cast their votes.

Incumbent Democrat Mercedes Narcisse was reelected as councilwoman for District 46. She secured 67.9% of the vote and ran against Republican Athena Clarke (27.6%) and Conservative Dimple Willabus (4.5% of the vote). Willabus competed in the June Primary Election, on the Democratic ticket, only securing 17% of the

In Districts 45 and 48, respectively, Councilwomen Farah Louis and Inna Vernikov will serve another term, as will Councilmen Chris Banks (District 42) and Sim-

Likewise, incumbent Democrats Jumaane Williams was reelected as Public Advocate and Antonio Reynoso will serve a second term as Brooklyn's Borough President.

Manhattan Borough President Mark Levine will become New York's next City Comptroller.

There was a total of six proposals on the ballot, with large controversy over ballot proposals 2-4, which all passed. Those proposals concern affordable housing and will fast-track the process to build more affordable housing, remove final review by the City Council and create an Affordable Housing Appeals Board, made up of the Borough President, City Council Speaker and Mayor. Opponents say the proposals will place more power in the hands of developers and remove community input.



Residential Population and Retention Rates on Par with City in District 22

Members of Community District Education Council 22 (CEC 22) gathered for their monthly meeting at the District Office, located at 5619 Flatlands Avenue, on Wednesday, November 5th, which was also streamed live to the public via Zoom. While the group ordinarily meets on the first Tuesday of each month, the meeting was moved to Wednesday due to Election Day.

The highlight of the meeting was an informative presentation, given by NYC Department of Education District Planning Coordinator Lucia O'Brien. She explained that the Office of District Planning (ODP) creates annual strategic plans for all 32 Community School Districts through ongoing conversations with input from school communities and stakeholders.


According to data compiled by ODP, both the K-5 and grade 6-8 residential populations in District 22 declined by 6% between 2019-2020 and 2024-2025, which was on par with citywide numbers, as the overall K-12 residential population declined by 8% since 2019-2020.

O'Brien also discussed how the Citywide Average District Retention Rate (the percent of students living in a district who enroll in a district school in that district) was 54% for K-5 and 49% for grade 6-8. In District 22, the District Retention Rate for K-5 students was 53% and grade 6-8 was 40% during the 2024-2025 school year. The

group also learned that from 2023-2024 and 2024-2025, 62% of 5th-graders enrolled in a District 22 middle school and 36% of 8thgraders enrolled in a District 22 high school.

The data provided indicates that District 22 has an excess of 205 K-5 seats and 1,808 grade 6-8 seats. Of District 22's 48 school buildings, the ODP determined that nine are underutilized, 15 are overutilized, five have 150 to 299 excess seats and four have 300 plus excess seats. This data is especially useful as it will be used to inform ODP's work and will help determine whether redistricting will need to be considered in the near future.

The next meeting of CEC 22 will be held at the District Office, located at 5619 Flatlands Avenue, at 6:30 p.m. on Tuesday, December 2nd.





New York Homeowners Fight for Common Sense

One community's stand against government overreach and misinformation



Across New York City, working-class homeowners are caught in the middle of a policy storm that they were told was never meant for them. Local Law 18 was supposed to rein in illegal hotel operations, not punish the families who live in and maintain their own homes. Yet that's exactly what's happened. In neighborhoods like Canarsie, Flatlands and East New York, residents who worked their whole lives to own a piece of the city are now being treated like lawbreakers — all because they're trying to stay afloat in one of the most expensive cities in the world.

Intro 948-A — also called the *Homeowner Relief* and Safety Act — was written to restore fairness and balance to New York City's short-term-rental laws by reaffirming the clear legal distinction between private dwellings and commercial housing. Under state law, one- and two-family homes are private residences - not part of the city's long-term rental housing stock. These are the homes of working families, not corporate investors or absentee landlords.

When Local Law 18 was first introduced, its City Council sponsors made it explicitly clear that it would not impact private dwellings (one- and two-family homes). These homes do not fall under commercial housing regulations. Yet through enforcement and reinterpretation, that line has been blurred - and small homeowners are now being targeted as if they were large-scale operators. That distortion of legislative intent is one of the key injustices Intro 948-A seeks to correct.

Unfortunately, much of the public narrative has been shaped by corporate- and union-backed lobbying groups that have tried to frame this as a battle between Airbnb and the hotel industry — or worse, between tenants and landlords. That framing is completely false. The homeowners represented by New York Homeowners Alliance Corp (NYHOA) are not landlords running apartment buildings or commercial properties; we are small, primary-residence homeowners who live in our homes with our families. We are not part of the long-term rental market, nor are we competing with it. The real issue here is about fairness, autonomy and the right of ordinary New Yorkers to make ends meet in the homes they occupy.

NYHOA is the only nonprofit organization in this debate that has never received a single penny from any special-interest group - not from Airbnb, not from the Hotel Trades Council (HTC) and not from any corporate entity. We are entirely self-funded by small homeowners, many of whom are struggling to stay afloat amid rising property taxes, inflation and a cost of living that continues

to squeeze the middle class. While others have spent their resources waging media battles, we've spent ours doing the hard work — researching the law, drafting real solutions and meeting in good faith with City officials, HPD, the Mayor's Office and the Office of Special Enforcement.

Intro 948-A is not a rollback or a loophole. It preserves all existing safety and tenant protections while correcting a misapplication of Local Law 18 that unintentionally punished the very people it was never meant to affect. It is a balanced, narrowly tailored measure that respects homeowners' rights while maintaining enforcement against bad actors and illegal hotel operators.

At its core, this bill is about restoring common sense. It ensures that New York's housing policies serve people — not politics, not corporations and not the competing agendas of special-interest lobbies. Local Law 18's overreach has already pushed many small homeowners, including seniors and first-generation immigrants, toward foreclosure. That is not justice. That is economic cruelty masquerading as housing policy.

The City Council will hold a public hearing on Intro 948-A — also known as the Homeowner Relief and Safety Act — on Wednesday, November 20th at 10 a.m. at City Hall.


Homeowners and residents are encouraged to attend — even if they do not testify — to stand in support of small homeowners across New York City who live in their own one- and two-family private dwellings. This is about protecting the fundamental rights of property owners and preserving the autonomy of the families who make up the backbone of our neighborhoods.

This hearing is a pivotal opportunity to show unity, demand fairness and remind City Hall that the rights of homeowners are not negotiable.





Captain Peters, who was posthumously promoted from lieutenant, began his service with the NYPD in 1984, first at the 67th Precinct where he served for 12 years before transitioning to the 69th Precinct where he remained until his passing on October 20th. By all accounts, he epitomized "Fidelis Ad Mortem" -- the NYPD's motto. "He was committed to the Canarsie community where he lived, working alongside local boards, businesses and faith leaders on initiatives including graffiti removal, bike registration drives and neighborhood watch programs," his daughter, Shem-

eka Brathwaite, who sang "His Eye Is on the Sparrow," shared.

Peters' grandson, Elias, also rendered a musical selection of "Lift Every Voice and Sing." Other relatives and friends did scripture readings and tributes that spoke of the impact Peters had on their lives -- as a favorite uncle, beloved friend, doting grandpa – guiding, supporting and even, at times, spoiling.

Peters was also eulogized by his 69th Precinct family, which included former Deputy Inspector Dion Hinds; Auxiliary Coordinator, Officer Dukens Riche; Clergy Council President and Auxiliary Lieutenant, Rev. Cecil Moonsam; Clergy Council member, Dr. Cheryl Ault-Barker; and Auxiliary Officer, Chaplain Faith Williams, who also offered words of comfort and prayers.

Riche told hundreds of mourners, "Peters was, in the purest sense of the word, a public servant. What drew him to the call of an auxiliary officer was not a paycheck, but this remarkable sense of duty and a deepseated belief in making our community a better place and safer. He gave his time freely, accepting the risks and the responsibility without reservation."

"He was always professional, compassionate and courageous," Riche continued. "Peters dedicated countless hours away from his family because he simply felt the call to help his community. The true measure of a person is the impact they have on others, and our presence here today is a testimony to that fact."


State Senator Roxanne Persaud and Assemblywoman Jaime Williams also spoke glowingly of Peters and awarded him, posthumously, a citation that encapsulated his many years of selfless service to the community. The award was accepted by his children, Richard Peters Jr. and Shemeka Braithwaite.

Peters was also an ordained deacon at United Lifeline Deliverance Church of God. Lifeline's Senior Pastor, Rev. Dwight O. Hall, delivered the sermon, reflecting fondly on the times he and Peters shared every Sunday. Hall emphasized the importance of making one's sojourn on earth count - just like Peters did -because no one knows the time nor the hour.

Soon afterwards, the mournful blasts from a shofar blown by Apostle Leeds Jean, heralded the exit of Peters' casket from the funeral home. The Honor Guards, NYPD, family and friends who were waiting outside performed a solemn salute as Peters was carried to the hearse.


