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Haitian Heritage Month and the Ongoing Fight for TPS

Each May, Haitian Heritage Month arrives like a vibrant reminder of history, pride and perseverance. Across New York City, the sound of kompa music fills the streets, Haitian flags wave proudly in the air, and communities gather to honor the enduring spirit of a people whose story is rooted in courage and resistance. This year, however, the celebration carries an even deeper meaning as Haitian families across the United States continue fighting for the right to live safely and with dignity through Temporary Protected Status (TPS).

Haitian Heritage Month includes Haitian Flag Day on May 18th, commemorating the creation of the Haitian flag in 1803 during the Haitian Revolution — the first successful revolt of enslaved people that led to the creation of an independent nation in world history. Haiti's revolutionary legacy has long symbolized freedom and self-determination for oppressed people across the globe. In New York City, home to one of the largest Haitian populations in the country, this history lives on through cultural festivals, music, food, art and intergenerational storytelling that keep Haitian traditions alive.

Yet while Haitian communities celebrate their heritage, many are also living with uncertainty. Hundreds of thou-

sands of Haitians currently rely on TPS, a humanitarian program that allows individuals from countries experiencing war, natural disasters or extraordinary conditions to legally live and work in the United States. Haiti continues to face severe instability caused by political turmoil, gang violence, economic collapse and the lingering devastation of natural disasters. Despite these dangerous conditions, the Trump administration has moved to terminate Haiti's TPS designation, placing more than 350,000 Haitians at risk of deportation.

For Haitian families, the fight for TPS is deeply personal. TPS holders are nurses, caregivers, construction workers, small business owners, students and parents who have built lives and communities throughout the United States. Many have lived here for more than a decade, contributing to local economies, paying taxes and supporting loved ones both here and in Haiti. Their presence has strengthened cities like New York and communities across the Nation.

This year, Haitian Heritage Month is not only about honoring the past but also protecting the future. It is a time to recognize the resilience of Haitian people while standing in solidarity with families fighting to remain safe and together. The same spirit that fueled Haiti's revolution generations

ago continues to inspire Haitians today as they organize, advocate and demand justice. In the face of fear and uncertainty, Haitian communities continue to choose joy, culture and resistance — proving that their strength cannot be erased.

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String of Cars Vandalized in Canarsie Over the Weekend

Four cars were broken into on East 96th Street, between Foster Avenue and Avenue D, during the early morning hours on Saturday, May 9th.

A brick, which was found on the sidewalk, was used to break the front passenger side window of each vehicle. Home surveillance video places the time of the incident around 1:30 to 2 a.m., and footage also shows the perpetrator picking up the brick to smash the windows.

One resident discovered his vehicle had been vandalized around 7:30 a.m. That resident reported that a small amount of cash and some other small items were stolen from his vehicle.

Car break-ins are common in the confines of the 69th Precinct. This latest incident occurred right across the street from P.S. 66.

The monthly prayer vigil started off with the singing of the National Anthem, followed by "What a Mighty God We Serve."

Representatives for elected officials were also in attendance. Dorothy Lee from Assemblywoman Jaime Williams' Office announced that the annual Taste of the Caribbean celebration will be held at Holy Family on June 20th and invited everyone to attend.

Prayer vigils are usually held on the first Monday of the month at various locations in Canarsie.



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Marine Park Alliance Receives Largest Award in Organization's History

Marine Park Alliance (MPA) has been awarded a \$75,000 grant through the Hudson River Foundation's (HRF) "Advancing Habitat Restoration with Community" initiative to develop a community-driven restoration framework for Marine Park.

According to the April 30th award announcement, the project will guide future restoration of wetlands, shorelines and maritime habitats, strengthening ecological resilience and expanding access to nature for surrounding communities.

Funding will be used to "identify 5-10 priority restoration opportunities, develop early-stage designs and lay the groundwork for future capital investment."

Previous restoration efforts included

work by NYC Parks, the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers and the Natural Areas Conservancy.

In its May newsletter, MPA announced that this is the largest grant in the organization's history. "This investment supports a community-driven approach to restoring salt marsh and upland habitats in Brooklyn's biggest park," MPA Executive Director Scott Middleton said in a social media post.

The award originated from the NY-NJ Harbor & Estuary Program, funded by the Environmental Protection Agency and hosted by the HRF. MPA was one of three grantees to receive one of three new grants totaling \$260,000.

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Autism Awareness Grows in Brooklyn: Community Voices and Actions

Autism is often misunderstood, both by the public and within families, causing a major challenge for those affected. Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD) impacts communication, interaction and perception. Though awareness is increasing, stigma and misconceptions persist. Clear understanding and acceptance, not judgment, must become the norm.

On Thursday, April 30th, Assemblywoman Jaime Williams held an "Understanding Autism" webinar focused on how communities can better support people with Autism. Despite growing knowledge, outdated stereotypes still limit opportunities for people with Autism, and these beliefs must be challenged to promote real inclusion.

Autism is a complex condition, and it affects ev-

eryone differently. Each person with Autism has their own strengths and challenges. Many are very detail-oriented, creative or great at solving problems. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention states that about one in 36 children in the U.S. has Autism. This highlights why it's so important to understand and accept Autism instead of believing myths. When we do this, we help create a more supportive environment where people with Autism can thrive.

All of the presenters agreed: awareness alone is not enough. To foster real inclusion, we must address Autism as a neurological difference, not a limitation. By moving past stereotypes, we create a society where everyone, regardless of ability, can reach their full potential.

Dr. Avien Henry, a behavior analyst with 20 years of experience, is passionate about teaching others about Applied Behavior Analysis. She explained that Autism is a spectrum, and people need different levels of support. These levels can change as a person grows: Level 1 means some support is needed, Level 2 means substantial support and Level 3 means very substantial support. Because of this, she emphasized the importance of early intervention. Research shows that starting specialized programs early can improve thinking, language and daily living skills. That's why parents should get evaluations as soon as possible, starting with their pediatrician.

Parents are often the first to help when their child has Autism. From seeking early intervention to maintaining stability in daily life, their involvement helps shape their child's future and supports development.

Research from the National Institute of Child Health and Human Development shows that early diagnosis and intervention, often led by parents, can improve communication, social skills and learning. Parents help reinforce what their children learn in therapy and at school, creating the consistency that many children with Autism need to thrive. In addition to providing structure and advocating for their children, parents also offer understanding. They get to know their child's unique way of communicating, their triggers and their strengths. This insight helps educators and therapists create support plans that truly fit each child.

It's also important to remember that parents need support. Access to resources, community networks and mental health services matters. These can make a meaningful difference in their ability to care for their child. Dr. Lucina Clarke, co-founder and executive director of My Time, Inc., has seen firsthand the struggles that families with autistic children face. She and her husband started My Time because they felt that there were gaps among what schools were offering, what parents need and what kids with Autism really require. According to Dr. Clarke, parents often don't get the support they need, and that can make the whole experience of raising an autistic child really tough. She made a valid point that we all know what it's like to feel frustrated when we're not understood. But for individuals with Autism, that feeling can be a constant part of their daily lives.

Autism doesn't need to be "fixed" --- we need to understand and accept it. When we support families and create more inclusive schools, we help build a world where everyone feels welcome. In this kind of world, people with Autism are treated with respect, their voices are heard, and they're valued for who they are.

On Sunday, May 3rd, Assemblywomen Jaime Williams and Monique Chandler-Waterman, alongside Hebrew Educational Society (H.E.S.) Executive Director Moshit Rivkin, announced the assemblywomen's joint allocation of funding to launch a long-awaited Free "Learn to Swim" program. This program, aimed at improving water safety and expanding access to aquatic education for local residents, kicks off National Water Safety Month in May, a monthlong campaign focused on swim education, drowning prevention and teaching lifesaving water safety skills ahead of the summer season.

This "Learn to Swim" program ensures greater access to lifesaving swim education for our youth. The announcement, held at the H.E.S., at 9502 Seaview Avenue, drew more than 90 families from

across the community, highlighting the strong demand for accessible swim instruction and water safety programming.

Williams emphasized the importance of the initiative and the longstanding role of the H.E.S. in the community. "This community center, which has served residents since 1994, continues to uphold its core mission of education," she said. "This program will ensure that our youth, individuals with special needs and our seniors have essential aquatic skills, along with a clear understanding of the dangers associated with swimming." Williams added that we are a coastal community along Jamaica Bay and that she learned to swim at Kingsborough Community College, highlighting that this skill is a lifelong one.

Chandler-Waterman underscored the urgent need for preventative measures in communities near waterways. "For our community, this mission is deeply personal. In recent years, we have been devastated by tragic drownings, including the heartbreaking loss of our constituents, Elyjha Chandler (16) and Christian Perkins (17), on June 21, 2024. We honor their memory by taking action to ensure families in our community have access to free swimming lessons and water safety education to help prevent future tragedies. This program is about saving lives."

Rivkin, who began her journey at the H.E.S. as a lifeguard, spoke about the critical importance of water safety education. She highlighted the need to teach participants not only how to swim, but also how to identify and respond to tides, undertows and other potentially dangerous conditions. Rivkin also expressed her gratitude to both Williams and Chandler-Waterman for their partnership and continued support in bringing the program to life.

Due to overwhelming demand, registration for the program is currently full. Williams and Chandler-Waterman expressed their commitment to expanding the initiative in the future to serve even more families and ensure broader access to this lifesaving resource.

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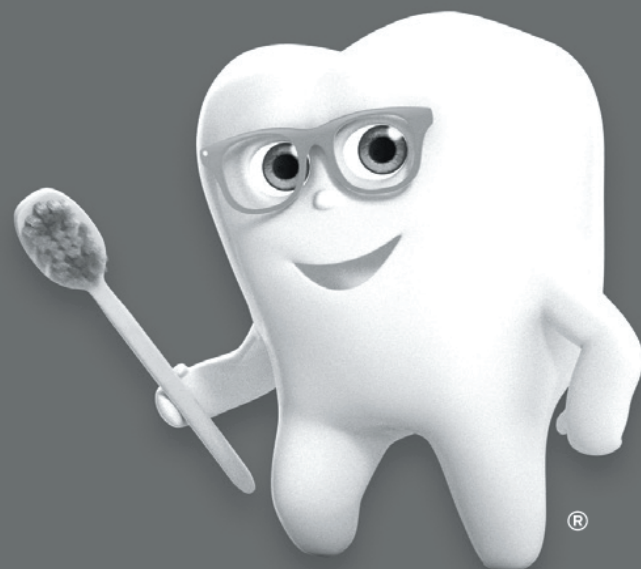
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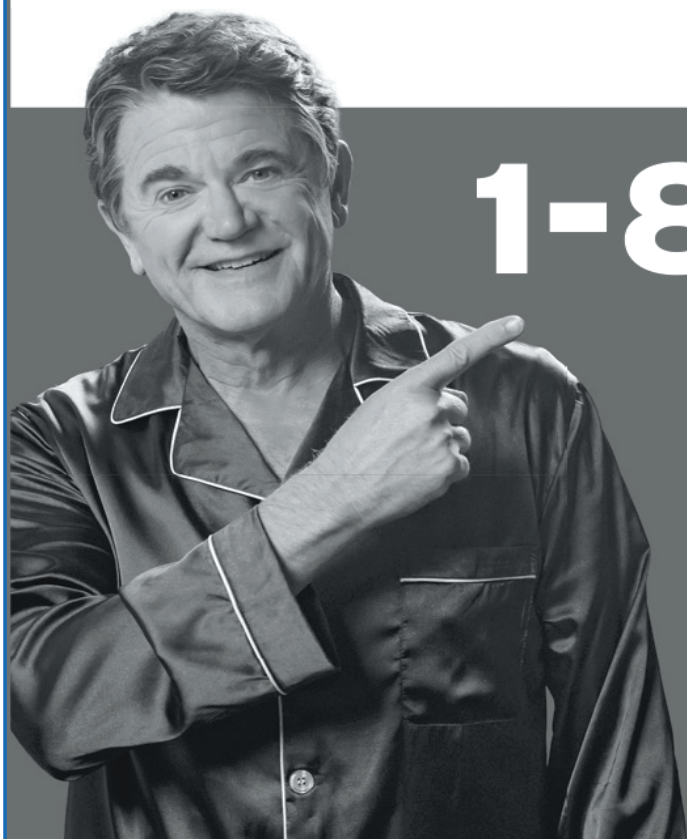
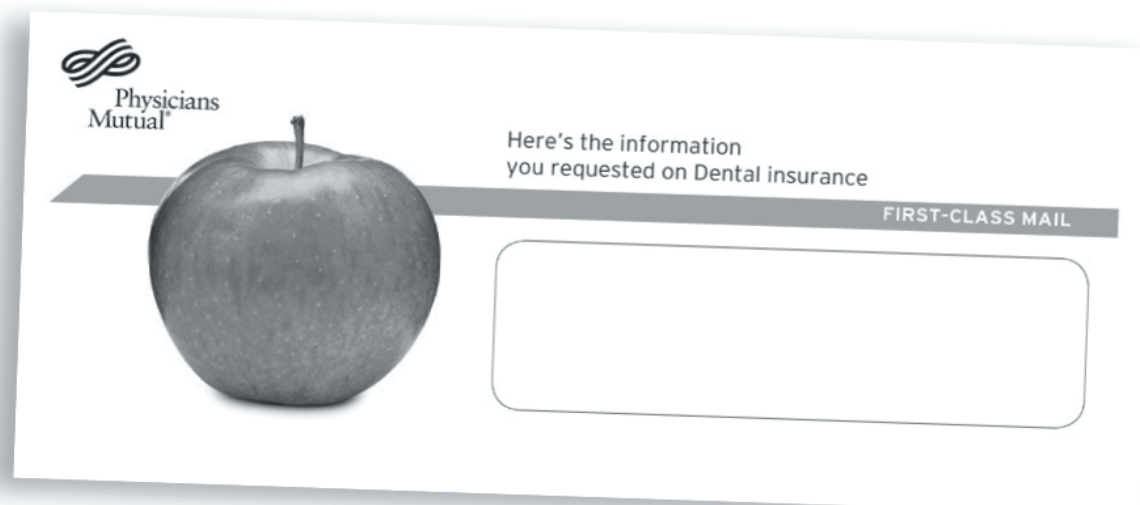

Abdul Bah Shows Blue Grit, While Jibreel Jalloh Calls Out Developer

The 69th Precinct, in association with its Community Council, held its monthly meeting on Tuesday, April 28th, at the Hebrew Educational Society (H.E.S.), 9502 Seaview Avenue. The room, which was filled with a seemingly larger police presence in an extended space, had some delays but ultimately took off on its agenda of addressing the concerns of Canarsiens.

Gardy Brazela, president of the 69th Precinct Community Council, following an opening prayer and a pitch for community contributions to support some of the Council's administrative costs, introduced Captain Sashanna Wynter.

Wynter thanked all the guests in attendance, underscoring that the Community Council meetings were among the most well-attended meetings she'd encountered in her post. Wynter then brought the conversation

to a matter of hopefulness about the 69th Precinct's future. "First of all, I'm going to start off on a high note with my Cop of the Month," she said, heralding the heroism of Officer Abdul Bah. Last month, Bah took the lead, along with a special operations lieutenant and another officer, in apprehending an armed suspect who fit the description of a gunman alleged to have fired eight shots in the Breukelen Houses.

"What I have seen from Officer Bah, I'm very certain that this is the future of the police department – of a Canarsie that I want to see," Wynter said, before summoning Bah to the front of the room and presenting him with the award.

Bah smiled from ear to ear as he showcased the framed commendation, appearing oblivious to the selfless act he exhibited recently. A parade of guests snapped selfies of the young officer, who appeared barely out of high



school. Bah then posed for an exclusive portrait with the *Canarsie Courier* as Wynter looked on proudly.

Some of the evening's speakers included Norine Medas, executive director of the Canarsie Merchants Association (CMA). Medas encouraged those who owned community businesses (including nonprofits) to reach out to CMA if they were having any issues. "Small business leaders, you deserve to thrive in Canarsie, and we know you need resources," she said. "No one needs to hide."

Medas announced an upcoming Conklin Avenue walking tour (which took place on May 1st before this writing). The walk was part of Jane's Walk NYC. Jane Jacobs, an urbanist, author and activist, promoted the exploration of one's community. Medas encouraged everyone to appreciate the neighborhood and its history. "Many of us have no idea about the beauty that exists, here, in Canarsie," she said. "Conklin Avenue was the first commercial corridor." CMA may be reached at @canarsiemerch on Instagram, and @canarsiemerchant-sassociation on FB.

Jibreel Jalloh, who heads the Flossy Organization, was one of the night's last guest speakers. After thanking Wynter and her 69th Precinct team "for keeping Canarsie safe," Jalloh brought to the forefront the actions taken by a private real estate developer to erect a seven-story building at East 108th Street without transparency made to the community.

"Thanks to Maria Garrett [president of Fresh Creek Civic Association] and NYC Councilmember Mercedes Narcisse, when we found out in September that a private developer bought that land [at East 108th street] for over \$11M, we raised an alarm," he said. "We said, 'What are you doing? And what are you building in our community?'" Jalloh said, regarding the evasive developer. As such, the community activist turned up the heat by inviting the mayor, public advocate and borough president to a meeting at the H.E.S. on Thursday, April 30th. With the support of the elected officials, Jalloh hopes to compel the developer to act honorably.

On a lighter note, once the meeting ended and guests began to disperse, William Nunn, 24, a first-timer to any such meeting, and a senior at John Jay College of Criminal Justice — CUNY who minored in public administration, delighted in meeting Wynter and querying her for career advice within the department.

"There are lots of civilian roles that are open – analysts, 911," she said. "Honestly, a lot of people think NYPD and they think police officers," Wynter added. "But there are so many non-uniform roles that make great money. Especially if you're coming with a degree that you say you are."

Nunn, who graduates in June, seemed heartened by Wynter's advice. "I'm a lifelong Canarsie resident," he said. "I want to serve my community in any way I can."

The next meeting of the 69th Precinct Community Council will be held at 8 p.m. on Tuesday, May 26th, at the H.E.S.



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Canarsie Walking Tour Brings Local History to Life

A sizeable crowd gathered at the corner of East 92nd Street and Conklin Avenue on Friday, May 1st, for the 2nd Annual Jane's Walk – a global festival of volunteer-led community tours, in partnership with the Canarsie Merchants Association and the Canarsie Historical Society.

Current Canarsie residents, former residents who came back to visit, and those from other parts of Brooklyn, and even Queens and Manhattan, showed up, eager to explore the transformation of Conklin Avenue, from Canarsie's center of commerce to a quiet country lane.

Canarsie Historical Society President, and foremost Canarsie historian, Ira M. Kluger, led the group on a truly fascinating tour down Conklin Avenue, stopping at more than 20 different notable locations along the route to discuss the people and businesses that once occupied the various buildings.

Kluger explained that in the early years, buildings along Conklin Avenue did not have street addresses. They were described as being “near the Main Road” (East 92nd Street) or “near the Railroad” (close to East 95th Street), making precise locations difficult to identify and research. He said that much of what is known today is thanks to his predecessor and mentor, John F. Denton, who chronicled a veritable wealth of information.

One of the many stops along the route

was the office of the *Canarsie Courier*, now located at 1142 East 92nd Street. The group was invited inside and had the opportunity to meet the staff, see the production area and take home copies of recent issues.

Just steps away, the group was invited inside the Canarsie Community Reformed Church (originally the Dutch Reformed Church), located at 76 Conklin Avenue, which will celebrate its 150th anniversary this year. There, they admired the beautiful stained glass windows inscribed with the names of prominent local historical figures like Christian C. Quaritius and many others.

The group visited the former sites of private homes and storefronts of so many historical local merchants and learned why Conklin Avenue eventually ceased to be the business corridor. As horses and buggies were replaced by cars and trucks, Conklin Avenue became too narrow to continue serving as the commercial district, and the businesses gradually relocated, many of them to Rockaway Parkway, which is one of the neighborhood's busiest shopping areas.

Members of the group were astounded at Kluger's uncanny ability to retain such a quantity of accurate historical information, such as dates, names and addresses, all easily referenced without any notes whatsoever. It's no wonder, then, that walk participant and *Canarsie Courier's* own Editor in Chief, Linda Steinmuller, often refers to him as a walking encyclopedia!

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The Grand Street Bridge is a swing bridge over Newtown Creek, connecting Maspeth, Queens with Williamsburg, Brooklyn.

After over 120 years, the bridge is nearing the end of its useful life: it is too narrow to accommodate current traffic, does not meet current structural nor geometric design standards, and the mechanical and electrical systems on the swing span have been heavily damaged by various weather events.

The Project purpose is to address structural and geometric deficiencies, resiliency needs, and operational reliability of the bridge for multi-modal users.

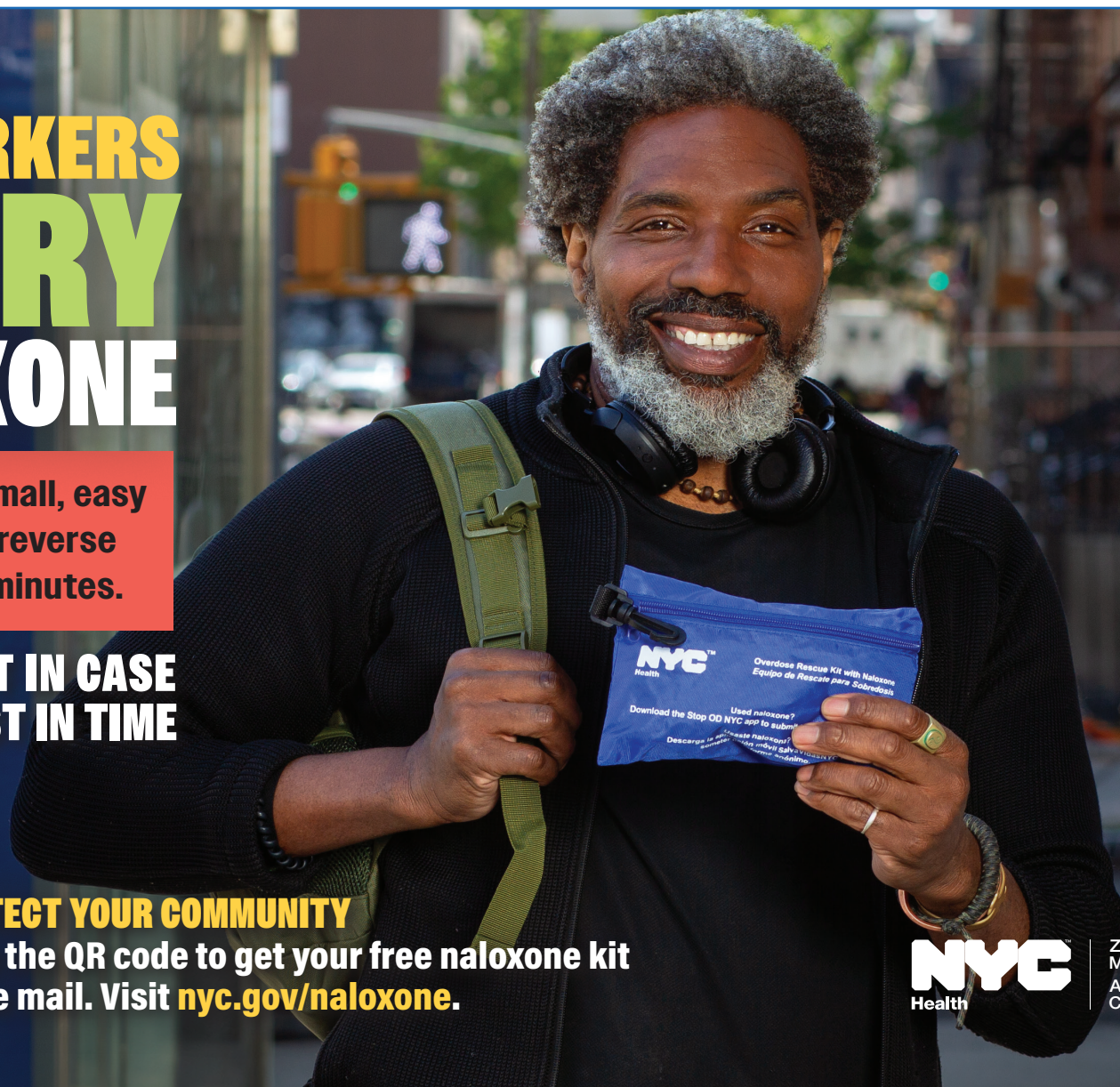
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Letter To The Editor

Historian Shares Information Regarding the Establishment of the Canarsie Courier

Dear Editor:

Thank you for publishing my recent column regarding Walter S. Patrick and reprinting my column on the history of Canarsie's earliest newspapers (see "Walter S. Patrick's Legacy: 105 Years of the Canarsie Courier" and "Canarsie's Earliest Newspapers: The Predecessors of the Canarsie Courier," *Canarsie Courier*, April 23, 2026).

In the interest of full disclosure, I would like to share the following information with your readers.

I have thus far uncovered a total of four separate written accounts pertaining to the estab-

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lishment of the *Canarsie Courier*. Two of them state that the *Courier's* first office consisted of rented desk space located in Harkavy's (actually Bernhard and Harkavy's) real estate office at 1417 Rockaway Parkway, as I stated in my recent article regarding Walter S. Patrick.

However, the other two accounts claim that the *Courier* began in a small storefront located where Capital One Bank now stands, at 1425 Rockaway Parkway. (We know that prior to the construction of the bank, which was erected circa 1952, the site was indeed occupied by a small row of storefronts.)

As the evidence at the time pointed to the 1425 Rockaway Parkway location, when we marked the site where the *Courier* was founded, we placed a plaque there. However, in reality, we are not entirely certain.

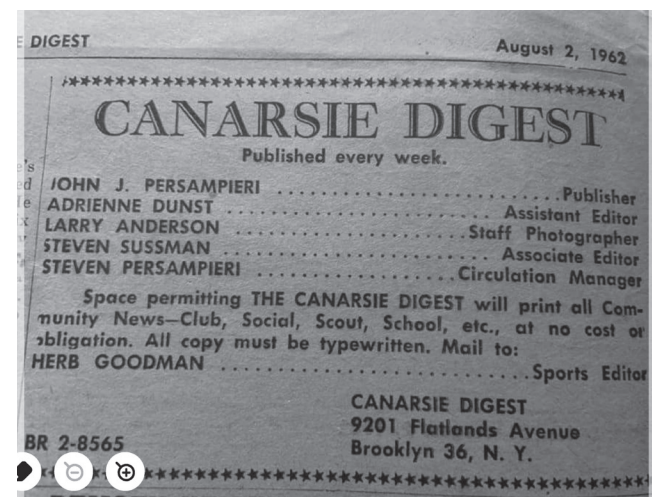
Some time ago, I visited the County Clerk's office and viewed the business certificate filed by Mr. Patrick and Lester J. Stillwell at the time that they established the *Courier*. Unfortunately, the certificate contained only the addresses of their respective residences but did not list the address at which the *Courier* would be physically located.

We will probably not know with any degree of certainty unless we are able to locate the first edition or a very early edition of the *Courier*, something that I have hoped to do for quite some time.

If my ongoing research yields additional information regarding this or any other aspect of the *Courier's* history, I will gladly share it with you and your readers.

I have uncovered two additional facts regarding the locations that the *Courier* occupied over time.

In a column that I wrote for the 100th anniversary edition, I indicated that in 1961, the *Courier* relocated from 132 Conklin Avenue to

Publishers Herman Furtzaig, Robert Lesserson and Edward Luster purchased the Canarsie Digest from publisher-editor, John J. Persampieri, thus expanding the Courier-Life Corporation. The four major weeklies, as well as several weekly, semi-weekly and monthly newspapers will still be produced from the editorial and production office located at 1159 Flatbush Avenue. An expansion of the editorial staff is also anticipated which will allow an even greater coverage of the individual area of each newspaper.

In the future CANARSIE DIGEST will receive a greater depth of coverage and vast community information including the many colorful and interesting columns which have enabled FLATBUSH LIFE, KINGS COURIER and BAY NEWS to find prominence among 100,000 readers.

According to the publishers, "the purchase of the CANARSIE DIGEST was really made possible by our readers. Their warm response to our newspapers has shown us that we are issuing the kind of informative material which best represents their communities."

The Coney Island Chamber of Commerce, consisting of the

9403 Glenwood Road. What I did not realize at the time was that for most of 1961, the *Courier's* office actually occupied the second floor of the building at 9403 Glenwood Road. The storefront on the ground floor was previously occupied by Paul's Barber Shop, and at the time that the *Courier* relocated to the building, it was occupied by the Regular Democratic Club of Canarsie. In October of 1961, when the Democratic Club vacated the ground floor storefront, the *Courier* relocated from the second floor of the building to the ground floor. It was only then that the *Courier* formally announced its relocation to 9403 Glenwood Road.

As I indicated in my column regarding the locations that the *Courier* occupied over the years, from 1966 to 1976, the *Courier* occupied the former bank building at 9201 Flatlands Avenue. To my great surprise, I subsequently learned that in 1962, a now defunct, competing newspaper, the *Canarsie Digest*, which was established in 1959, maintained its office in the very same building at 9201 Flatlands Avenue. To date, I have been unable to ascertain whether they occupied the first floor, which was subsequently occupied by the *Courier*, or if they occupied the second floor, which was previously occupied by the office of a physician, the late Dr. John F. Raycroft. In March of 1963, the *Canarsie Digest* was absorbed by a conglomerate known as Courier-Life Publications and closed their Canarsie office, subsequently operating out of the conglomerate's office, which, at the time, was located at 1159 Flatbush Avenue.

I thank you for the opportunity to share this additional information with your readers. Hopefully, there will eventually be more to follow.

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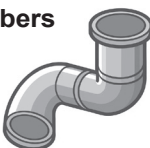

New Season Kicks off With South Asian Dance Workshop

As the weather gets warmer, people are anxious to get out of the house – on Saturday afternoon, May 2nd, visitors gathered at the Carmine Carro Community Center, 3000 Fillmore Avenue, in Marine Park, for the first event of the spring/summer season.

The Dancing into Spring: South Asian Dance Workshop was organized by the Marine Park Alliance (MPA) and curated by dance instructor Sloka Iyengar, who previously performed at the MPA's Festival of Lights – Diwali event, to showcase South Asian dances and movements.

"We're excited to kick off the season with our spring/summer program calendar and to start off with Dancing into Spring," MPA Executive Director Scott Middleton said. "We are delighted that Sloka was interested in coming back to the park for a spring-themed program. People, young and old, came and learned about some dance moves from Iyengar's culture, while also celebrating the coming of spring."

Iyengar presented several South Asian dances and other performances, including the Bharatanatyam, an Indian classical dance originating in the Indian state of Tamil Nadu. Iyengar demonstrated this special dance to her audience through her movements, focusing on balance, footwork and hand gestures. Another traditional South Indian dance form was the Padam, and the Padam that the Iyengar performed was Gaana Rengaram, a spiritual performance.

She also demonstrated hand gestures, such as a bee (Bhramara), a peacock (Mayura), a deer (Mrigashirsha), and a fully bloomed lotus flower (Alapadma), among others. These hand gestures, called mudras, are sacred ritual movements practiced in South Asian religions, such as Hinduism, Jainism and Buddhism. Mudras evoke a connection to nature and spring by enhancing meditation, channeling life-force energy and restoring mental and physical balance.

Iyengar taught attendees several Indian languages used with these dances, such as Hindi, Tamil, and Sanskrit, the latter of which is the language of the Natya Shastra, an ancient Indian text on Indian performing arts.

With dances, comes music, and Iyengar spoke of Indian musical scales (saptak), based on Sa, Re, Ga, Ma, Pa, Dha, Ni, similar to the Western solfège.

"Thanks to the MPA for having the space ready, letting everybody know, and it was a beautiful day. It was nice to see about 25 attendees show up – people of all ages showed up, people with their families or just by themselves," Iyengar said. "It was an inter-generational event, which I think are so sorely needed, and for people to learn of cultures that aren't their own."

Events such as these play a major role in bringing the community together, as they showcase that many different cultures come together to form one community.




"I believe it's important that people in New York from all over come and share their culture. They share dances, songs, their languages; events of that type are really beautiful. You see people of all ages are here," Ilona Blank of Sheepshead Bay, a mother of three, said. "This is a sense of community. It's amazing for kids to know and to learn. I always bring my kids here for different events, and I'm really grateful for the time we spend here."

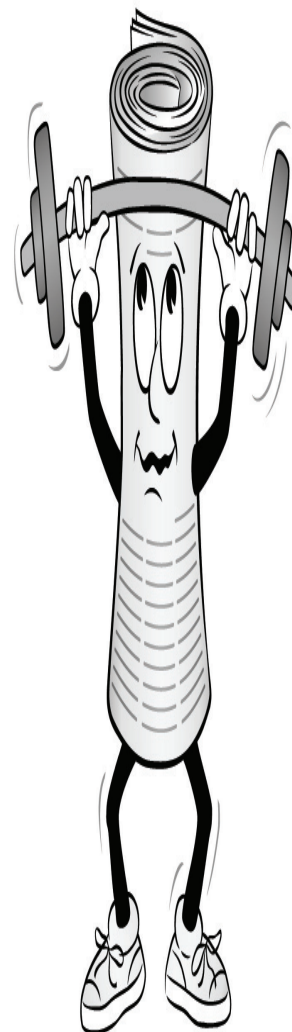
