No More Lives Lost to Gun Violence

Gun Violence Awareness Month is more than a campaign color or a hashtag. It is a painful reminder that in neighborhoods across this country, the sound of gunshots has become far too familiar. Behind every statistic is a family forced to bury a loved one, a young person carrying trauma or a community learning how to survive grief in public.

This month should force us to confront an uncomfortable truth: gun violence is a result of a health crisis, an economic crisis and a moral crisis.

Even as New York City has seen historic declines in shootings and homicides overall, young people continue to be caught in the crossfire. Recent reporting highlighted how youth involvement in shootings remains alarmingly high, despite broader decreases in crime. We cannot celebrate falling numbers while ignoring the lives still being stolen from our neighborhoods. One teenager lost to gun violence is one too many.

For too long, our response has been reactive instead of preventative. We wait until violence erupts before investing resources into communities that have been neglected for decades. But

if we are serious about ending gun violence, we must invest upstream — in youth programs, mental health support, economic opportunity, mentorship, safe public spaces and community-based violence interruption initiatives.

Research and experience both show that people are less likely to pick up a gun when they feel connected to opportunity, purpose and community. Across New York City, organizations on the ground are proving that prevention works. Programs rooted in mentorship, restorative justice and grassroots outreach are helping young people imagine futures beyond survival.

When young people feel heard, when they have platforms to advocate for their neighborhoods, when they are given leadership opportunities instead of labels, transformation becomes possible. Communities need sustained investment and partnership.

We must think beyond traditional approaches and treat safety holistically — addressing housing instability, educational inequities, trauma and economic insecurity alongside enforcement. Recent government efforts to expand community safety infrastruc-



ture signal a growing understanding that prevention must sit at the center of public safety conversations.

Awareness alone is not enough. Action is what saves lives. The question is not whether we can afford to invest in prevention. The question is how many more lives we are willing to lose if we do not.

# Laundromat Shooting Leaves Man Dead and Another Wounded

Crime Scene detectives are combing through clues after a man was fatally shot and another man wounded in an early morning shooting on Memorial Day.

Officers from the 63rd Precinct responded to a reported shooting inside Xpress Laundromat, at 1809 Utica Avenue, off Avenue J, around 8 a.m. on Monday, May 25th. They found a 41-year-old man suffering from multiple gunshot wounds throughout the body and a 68-year-old man with a graze wound to his foot.

EMS took the 68-year-old victim to Mount Sinai Brooklyn in stable condition, but the 41-year-old victim, identified as Kevon Lee, of Flatlands, did not survive his injuries, according to police. Lee was taken by EMS to Kings County Hospital where he was pronounced dead.

There are no arrests, and an investigation is ongoing.

# Man Crushed to Death After Falling Between Train Cars

An investigation is underway into the death of an unidentified man that was struck by a northbound "3" train on Tuesday, May 19th.

The incident occurred around 12:45 a.m. at the New Lots Avenue station. Officers from the 75th Precinct/Transit District 32 found the unconscious male on the train roadbed. EMS pronounced him dead at the scene, police said.

Sources said that a dispute occurred when a man's backpack was stolen by another rider. He confronted the individual and a fight broke out, which led between the train cars. The alleged thief fell between the gap

onto the tracks as the train pulled out of the station, crushing him to death.

No arrests have been made, and an investigation is ongoing.

# Fire Claims Two Lives, Leaves Three Others Injured

Firefighters battled a deadly blaze that took the life of an elderly woman and her adult son on Saturday, May 23rd. The fire also left three others in critical and stable condition.

Units responded to the raging fire at 1693 Nostrand Avenue, between Beverly and Cortelyou Roads, where they found heavy fire and smoke on the second floor of a three-story, brick mixed occupancy building around 6:50 a.m. The first floor of the building houses a store.

Members quickly found the deceased man and woman in their apartment. A short time later, they found a woman unresponsive and unconscious and two others in stable condition. Paramedics took them to SUNY Downstate Hospital with non-life-threatening injuries.

Fire Department personnel used three hose lines to knock down the main body of fire, which was placed under control at 7:45 a.m. Police were on scene investigating, and the FDNY Fire Marshal's Office will determine the cause of the blaze.

## Marine Park Alliance Welcomes First-Ever Program and Communications Manager

Elliot Ma has childhood memories of often visiting Marine Park with his family as a kid, driving there in his dad's old Toyota Sienna from their home in Bensonhurst. Now, he's working to support the park and what it can offer to other families who visit.

Ma is the new program and communications manager at the Marine Park Alliance, a nonprofit that offers cultural, educational and environmental programming in both the main portion of Marine Park and the salt marsh across Avenue U. This makes him the second-ever, full-time employee of the alliance.

The Bay Ridge resident began working with

the organization in early May and will be responsible for developing and facilitating new programs, running the social media accounts and applying for nonprofit funding grants.

"I'm really excited to get really into the meat of it," Ma said in an interview. "It's a beautiful park."

As he settles into his role, Ma said one of his foremost goals is to increase the amount of science programming that the organization offers, thanks to his background in environmental science. He has a bachelor's degree in marine biology and a master's in ecology — both of which give him a unique insight into the park.

"You get to see some really special wildlife,

and this is something that is very unique to Marine Park itself, just having this salt marsh attached to it," he said. "I think I'm going to be basing a lot of upcoming programming around that salt marsh, around the animals that live in there, and try to get people involved in the stewardship of the marsh."

Another goal is to get more local high school and college students involved in science and conservation opportunities at the park, which will look good on their resumes when applying to graduate programs or jobs in the field, something Ma said New York City is lacking.

In addition to increased science programming, Ma said he also wants to increase cultural and fitness programming, so there's more activities for people in the area.

"I'm all for making just more: more events, more stuff at Marine Park, more free things for people to do," he said. "It's a beautiful park; it's got a lot of space. It'd be amazing if it could be utilized more."

To be able to finance and maintain "more," it will also be in Ma's wheelhouse to write grants to earn more funding, which would hopefully go toward even more staff members in the future.

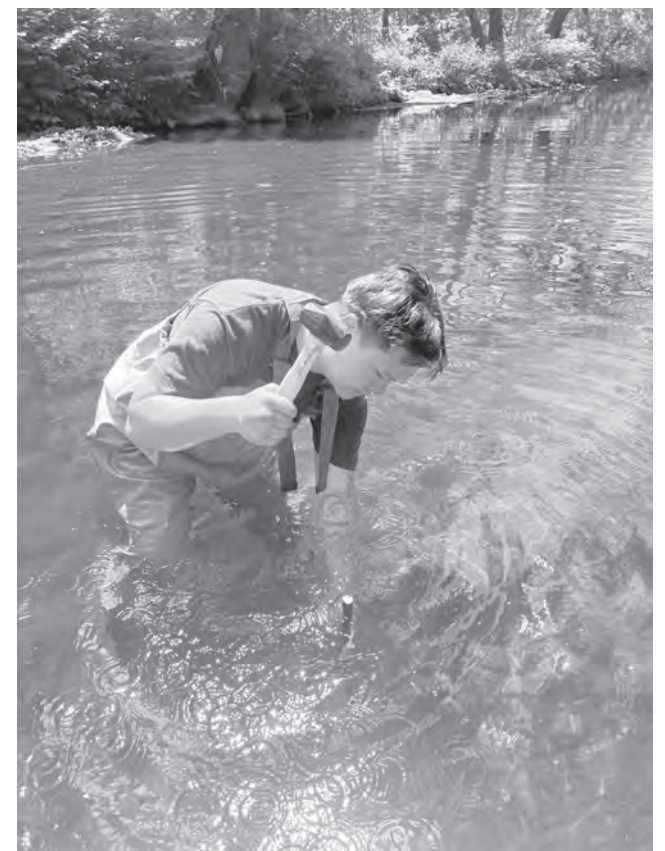
The alliance's executive director, Scott Middleton, told the *Canarsie Courier* that the team is excited to welcome Ma and have his help in expanding the organization's footprint.

"Elliot understands how parks can inspire curiosity, creativity and stewardship," Middleton said in a written statement. "We are excited for him to expand our capacity to serve Marine Park visitors through engaging, inclusive programming that celebrates both the ecological and cultural importance of this incredible public space."

At the heart of his new role, Ma said, is prioritizing the park and the people who love it.

"I'm really here to help Marine Park grow," he said.

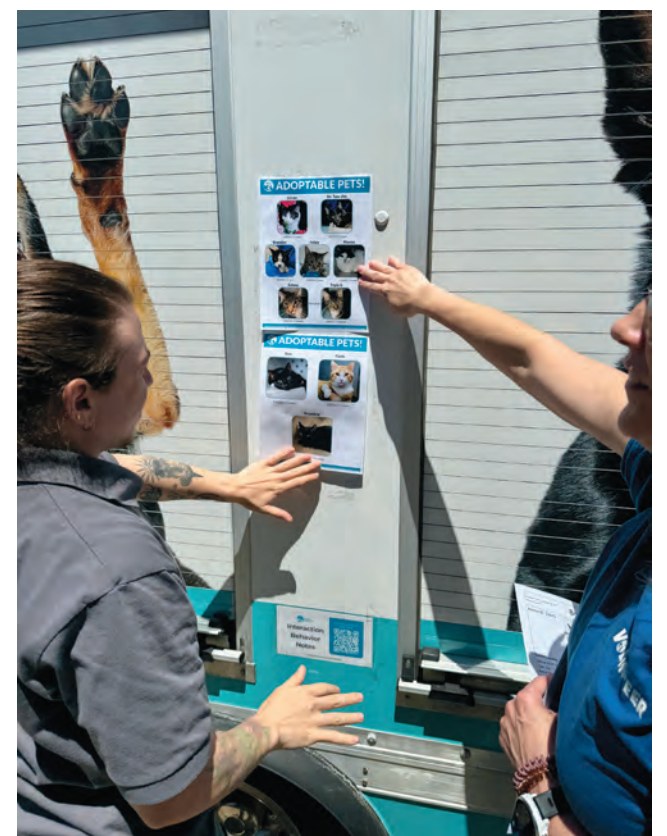

## Period Poverty Continues to Impact Canarsie and Other Communities

Period poverty remains an ongoing issue in many low-income and working-class neighborhoods across New York City, including Canarsie. The week of May 11-17 has been recognized as a time for advocacy, discussion and action on menstrual equity and the growing need to support individuals who struggle to afford feminine hygiene products.

On Tuesday, May 12th, State Senator Roxanne Persaud hosted a "Period Inequality Awareness Webinar." During the discussion, Persaud invited healthcare professionals and advocates to speak about available resources and the importance of destigmatizing menstruation.

Among the panelists was Dr. Natasha Ramsey, a school health physician at Montefiore Health System, who discussed the support available to students experiencing menstrual health challenges during the school day. "I am in the environment of the students. When they menstruate during school hours, they come down to the clinic," Dr. Ramsey explained. "We can provide medication and sanitary napkins; they are actually displayed at the front door for easy access. As soon as they enter the clinic, they can see that menstruation is destigmatized, and this is a safe place."

Although New York State has taken steps to improve menstrual equity by requiring free menstrual products in public schools, shelters and correctional facilities, many residents still struggle to access affordable products, healthcare and education on menstrual health. Through these challenges, families in Canarsie continue to face rising housing costs, food insecurity and widening economic inequality. These financial pressures can make menstrual products such as pads, tampons, liners and pain medication difficult to afford consistently. Because menstrual products are not covered under federal assistance programs like SNAP, many families are forced to pay out of pocket for essential hygiene items.

Reports on period poverty throughout NYC show that some individuals ration menstrual products or resort to unsafe alternatives when supplies become unaffordable. Advocates say this affects not only physical health but also emotional well-being, school attendance and workplace participation. Community organizations across Brooklyn have addressed the issue through donation drives, educational outreach and free distribution. The Brooklyn Public Library launched the CARE (Cycle Alliance in Every Region) initiative to combat period poverty and reduce related stigma, advocating for free menstrual products in schools and shelters. Additionally, other New York-based organizations, including Her Village, also distribute free menstrual supplies and host workshops focused on menstrual health education in underserved communities.

Highlighting the importance of public engagement, State Senator Kristen Gonzalez of the 59th District emphasized the value of healthcare fairs and resource events that connect communities with educational and medical support services.

Ultimately, period poverty in Canarsie reflects broader inequalities affecting urban communities across the country. Although organizations, healthcare professionals and citywide initiatives have made progress, advocates say continued investment and public awareness remains necessary. To address this, community members and local leaders are encouraged to support and promote initiatives that increase access to menstrual products and education, helping all menstruating individuals manage their periods safely, affordably and with dignity.

## Role Models in the Classroom: The Community Value of Career Day

Another presenter, Saindyse Germain, owner and CEO of Germain Consulting Services, shared her journey from nursing to entrepreneurship. Germain supports individuals with developmental disabilities and explained how her healthcare background helped shape her business career. "I want to teach students about the different ways to become an entrepreneur and how my nursing degree helped me achieve my goals," Germain said. By sharing her experience, Germain encouraged students to explore diverse career paths and consider how their skills and interests can lead to business opportunities.

Career Day events can also strengthen relationships between schools and their communities. Business owners, healthcare workers, tradespeople, first responders and entrepreneurs who volunteer their time often become role models for students. These experiences are especially valuable for younger students who may not yet know what careers are available to them.

As schools prepare students for an evolving workforce, Career Day remains a simple yet powerful way to inspire curiosity, build confidence and help young people envision successful futures.

## McCarthy Brothers Honored at 30th Anniversary Major Eugene T. McCarthy, USMC Memorial

Three decades have passed, yet all who knew Eugene T. McCarthy drew closer than ever to remember and honor his life and that of his brother, Dennis, at the Major Eugene T. McCarthy, USMC Memorial Ceremony held at the Major McCarthy Triangle on Avenue N and East 31st Street (Kings Highway Service Road) on Sunday, May 17th.

“To the McCarthy family, Naval Academy classmates, elected officials, the Nazareth High School community and to all our guests, welcome to this very special ceremony,” Fraser Civic Association (FCA) President and event organizer Tomas Hernandez Jr. said as he gave special thanks to those who traveled long distances to attend the event, which was held in conjunction with the Marine Corps League.

Hernandez gave a brief history of the Gulf War memorial, the first to be erected in the city in May 1996 to honor McCarthy and 278 fellow Americans who died in Operation Desert Storm. The monument, a rainbow, granite obelisk with what appears to be a piece missing from the top was designed to symbolize lives cut short.

On February 2, 1991, McCarthy and his co-pilot were killed in Saudi Arabia in a helicopter accident while attempting a rescue mission. McCarthy’s brother, Dennis, also served his country in several roles within the federal government and died of a 9/11 related illness in 2018; he has been honored alongside his brother since then.

FCA member Nancy Walby recalled how past President Barry Smith worked with local officials, fundraisers, architects and artisans in the neighborhood to make the memorial a reality. She thanked Hernandez for all the hard work he has done every year to keep the memorial a shining tribute.

The ceremony included traditional Taps, the Pledge of Allegiance and “The Star-Spangled Banner” presented by local students, as well as an invocation. Nazareth Regional High School Principal Robert DiRe said that the McCarthy brothers were alumni and announced an upcoming run in their honor at Marine Park.

Numerous speakers thanked the McCarthy family for their sacrifice and spoke of the importance of the occasion to continue to honor and keep alive the memory and legacy of their loved ones, and all those who served and lost their lives to preserve the freedoms we enjoy today.

Victor Gardner (aka Corky) represented McCarthy’s former classmates at the Naval Academy from 1973 to 1977 in Annapolis, MD. They traveled from all over the country to attend the special milestone anniversary event. Many of them served with McCarthy in the Navy and Marine Corps, in flight school at Pensacola,

Florida, in California or overseas in Okinawa, Japan.

Each alumnus raised his hand as Gardner called out each of their names. He then introduced McCarthy's former roommate in the Naval Academy, Shawn Morrissey, who reminisced about his close friend in and out of the academy.

Special Agent Frank Tarantino, associate chief of Operations, Northeast Region for the Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA), said he remembered McCarthy as a five-time volunteer who joined the U.S. Naval Academy; served in the U.S. Marine Corps for 11 years; joined the DEA in 1988; served in Operation Snowcap, a paramilitary operation operating in South/Central America to target the drug labs and organizations that were infiltrating our country and killing Americans; and who served in Iraq, where he ultimately paid the sacrifice for this country.

Other speakers included State Senator Roxanne Persaud, Assemblywoman Jaime Williams, Assemblyman Kalman Yeger, State Senator Stephen Chan, Assembly District 59 Leader Frank Seddio, Assembly District 41 Leader Jennifer Faucher, Daniel Heredia representing Councilwoman Farah Louis, and Community Board 18 District Manager Sue Ann Partnow.

Also present were Hon. Carmen Pacheco, supervising judge in Kings County and New York City Civil Courts; retired Councilman Alan Maisel; and NYPD 63rd Precinct Captain James Tomasulo, Community Affairs Detective Tricia Navarro-Caraballo and Crime Prevention Officer Ainsley Carter.

Chan, Tomasulo and Navarro-Caraballo are veterans. Chan had a similar experience to McCarthy as a Marine and law enforcement agent and said they both served for the love of their country.

Seddio spoke about the design of the monument. "Instead of using grass, they used rock," he said. "The idea was to talk about the broken hearts of so many of our veterans' families."

Williams mentioned the upcoming Canarsie Memorial Day Parade and said that there are over 50 veterans who served our country interred at the Canarsie Cemetery. She has been instrumental in having banners placed with the photographs of veterans from the area annually and announced that the banners will be lined up there, including McCarthy's. "It is a stark remembrance for our community that our freedom isn't free, and we have to be very thankful for all those who served our country and for even those who were never found."

# Academy for Young Writers Takes a Tour of the Canarsie Courier

Thanks to an organization called Press Pass NYC, schools across the city are establishing their own newspapers, and one East New York high school – the Academy for Young Writers – started an online publication, which is thriving.

Press Pass provides faculty training, student programs and the support needed to start a school newspaper, according to its website. The organization has launched or revived 40 student-led publications and are currently working with more schools to establish even more publications.

The school's journalism club is led by teacher Shakana Jayson. The club, made up of 11th- and 12th-graders, paid a visit to the *Canarsie Courier* on Thursday, May 14th. The young journalists got an introduction to an old-fashioned newsroom and learned the ins and outs of a print publication. They especially enjoyed looking at our bound archives, which date back to the 1960s. They were surprised by advertisements for blouses costing only \$1.99 at a Canarsie women's shop and even a TV Guide in our older papers, as many of them have never actually seen one.

Students asked a lot of intelligent questions, including how our paper handled the COVID-19 pandemic, our coverage of 9/11 and our thoughts about AI (Artificial Intelligence) in journalism. They shared how they developed a love for writing. Some of them see journalism careers in their future while others simply enjoy writing and want to hone their skills.

If you missed this year's Art Show, be sure to catch the next one, coming in Spring of 2027.



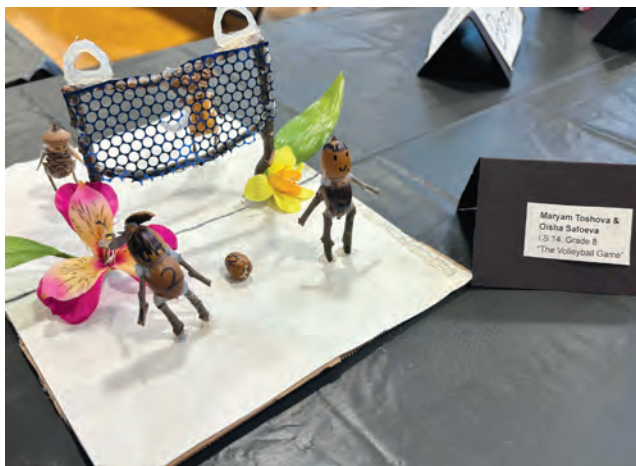

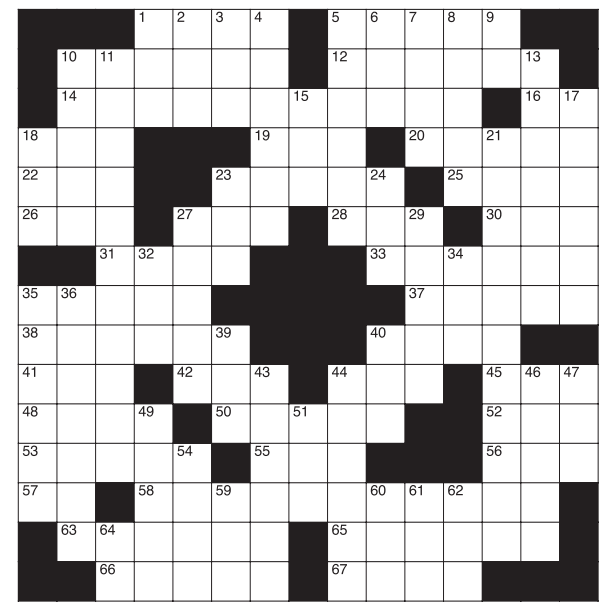
