This Mother's Day Weekend, We Turn Love Into Legacy

Mother's Day is a time to celebrate love — the kind that is patient, unwavering and powerful enough to shape a life and sustain a family through anything. It is a moment to honor the sacrifices, the quiet strength and the everyday acts of care that define motherhood. But for some mothers in our community, this weekend carries a deeper weight. It is both a celebration and a reminder — of love that continues even in the face of unimaginable loss, and of the resilience it takes to keep going.

This Saturday in Canarsie, we are coming together in that exact spirit — not in mourning, but in a celebration of life — to honor Christian Josiah Joel Farrell-Montrose, a son whose presence continues to be felt throughout this neighborhood. At just 19 years old, Josiah was taken from his family far too soon in a senseless act of violence. But those who knew him speak not about how he died, but about how he lived — with warmth, sincerity and a spirit that made people feel seen, valued and supported.

And at the center of this moment is a mother's love — enduring, unbreakable and powerful enough to transform grief into purpose. This Mother's Day

weekend, we recognize the strength it takes to carry that love forward, even when faced with loss. We uplift a family that has chosen unity over isolation and a community that refuses to let a young man's life be reduced to tragedy alone. Instead, we choose to celebrate his joy, his impact and the love he gave so freely.

On Saturday, May 9th, at 3 p.m., at East 104th Street and Avenue K, we will gather for the Christian Josiah Montrose Street Co-Naming Ceremony — a powerful and permanent tribute that ensures his name, and his legacy, will live on in the very place he called home. It is a statement that his life mattered, that his story matters and that this community will never forget him.

This is a day of joy, unity and shared humanity. There will be music, food, laughter and togetherness. Children will play, families will connect and stories will be shared across generations. Because to truly honor a life is to reflect the joy that life brought into the world and to carry that energy forward in community.

In a time when too many families are still searching for answers and too many communities are grappling with violence, moments like this matter



deeply. They remind us that healing is possible when we stand together, that love can be louder than loss and that community can be a force for both remembrance and change.

This weekend, as we celebrate mothers, let us also stand beside those carrying both love and grief. Let us show up with intention and compassion.

Two Shooting Victims in Stable Condition

Two men were shot inside a building in Brownsville last week.

Police from the 73rd Precinct responded to a 911 call, arriving at 91 Junius Street, between Glenmore and Liberty Avenues, around 7:20 p.m. on Tuesday, April 28th, where they found a 35-year-old male who was shot in the right leg and a 30-year-old male who was shot in the abdomen. Both victims were taken to Brookdale Hospital in stable condition, police said.

No arrests have been made, and an investigation is ongoing.

NYPD Looking for Two Shooting Suspects

A 41-year-old man was shot in his left leg, and the NYPD is looking for two suspects wanted in connection to the shooting, which occurred in the confines of the 75th Precinct.

Around 8 p.m. on Friday, May 1st, at the intersection of Riverdale Avenue and Hinsdale Street, the victim was approached by two unidentified males who discharged several shots toward the man, striking him in the leg, according to police. Both suspects fled on foot toward Hinsdale Street.

The victim was taken by EMS to Brookdale Hospital in stable condition.

The suspects are described as black males. The first individual was wearing a black hat and face mask, black sweatshirt, black pants with blue and white stripes on the side, and multi-colored sneakers at the time of the incident. The second individual was last seen wearing a light blue sweatshirt, light blue sweatpants and black sneakers. The NYPD has released photos of both suspects.

Rapist on the Loose

An 18-year-old female was raped within the confines of the 63rd Precinct last month and her assailant has not been caught.

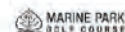

Essential Estate Planning: Protecting Your Future and Your Loved Ones

Estate planning is often misunderstood as something reserved for the wealthy or the elderly. In reality, it is a critical step for anyone who wants to protect loved ones and maintain control over their future. At its core, estate planning ensures your assets, values and wishes are honored during your lifetime and after you're gone.

On Thursday, April 23rd, State Senator Roxanne Persaud held a conversation on Estate Planning via webinar. She invited Charles Harris, director of Legal Services at Grow Brooklyn, to explain why you need a Power of Attorney, health proxy, living will and estate plan. Grow Brooklyn is a nonprofit that helps NYC communities protect their assets.

Grow Brooklyn offers free services for the following:

Power of Attorney (POA): Lets you choose someone to act for you in financial, legal or medical matters. You decide how much authority they have, so the document fits your needs.

Living Will: This document explains what medical care you want if you can't speak for yourself. It lets others know your end-of-life care and treatment choices. A living will informs doctors and loved ones which treatments you want or don't want. This includes options such as ventilators, feeding tubes,

CPR and other care.

Health Care Proxy: Enables you to designate a trusted individual to make medical decisions on your behalf if you become unable to do so yourself. This "agent" or "proxy" only acts when you are incapable of communicating your wishes due to illness, injury or incapacity. The National Institute on Aging points out that a health care proxy is important for planning. It makes sure someone who knows your values and wishes can make medical decisions for you if you cannot speak for yourself.

Discussing this topic may feel challenging, but taking the time to plan now will give you peace of mind. If you want to help your family understand its importance, consider sharing this article as a starting point for conversation. Visit growbrooklyn.org to learn more.

It's Zoom or Bust! Flatlands Civic Leader Stands Behind Virtual Meetings

To Zoom or not to Zoom.

There's no question about it – many civics have returned to pre-pandemic, in-person sessions. However, after getting pushback recently by a couple of residents to resume monthly meetings at a physical location, Flatlands Civic Club, Inc. (FCC) President Joan Gilbert stood her ground – she won't be forcing members or the rest of the community to meet in person.

A couple of residents, who are not FCC members, badgered Gilbert during the civic's Zoom call on Thursday, April 23rd, about bringing meetings back to an in-person or hybrid format at a senior center or school.

However, she defended her decision, saying, "This is for our members to decide ... and to be

honest – no one on our board wants an in-person meeting. We don't presently have a space – and we have 30 people here in attendance sharing information from all over – wherever they are. Furthermore, I'm not going to ask members to inconvenience themselves, and I'm very sensitive to people's time. Most of our members have families – and we have people to take care of, and some aren't able to leave their house and we respect their circumstances! This is a convenient way to host our meetings – it's been very successful."

Gilbert noted that virtual platforms are more frequently used by professionals and the majority of those who sign into FCC meetings are grateful for the continued updates – even if they're in transit and have to debrief the civic on

local issues.

FCC member Joyce Hibbert agreed with the sentiment, saying it's much easier for her to join the conversation virtually because health issues impact her mobility.

While one resident said she wants to get to know her Flatlands Civic neighbors, it was pointed out that there are dozens of additional in-person community meetings in the neighborhood which members attend and convene together.

The 63rd Precinct's Officer Ainsley Carter, liaison for the older adult population, hopped on the trend of providing safety advice for senior citizens, as many meetings all over the city aim to keep the elderly in-the-know about modern scams.

"We're seeing an uptick in a scam called the jewelry swap," Carter said. "Individuals are tricking our older adult population and preying on their sympathy – literally! The perps will approach a senior's car – sit and pray in their vehicles with them – and they're telling them that in order to pray with them, they have to take their jewelry off. So, what's happening is the senior is taking their jewelry off – in high dollar amounts – and they're putting themselves in the hands of perpetrators who will swap the real jewelry with fake jewelry, so after some time, once the victim gets home, they notice the jewelry they had wasn't what they left home with. They're confused. They don't know what happened at that time."

Instead of calling 911 immediately, the officer said, it usually takes seniors more time to realize they've been tricked. "These perpetrators will also try to give elderly persons a hug or an embrace so they can work on loosening and unclasping the person's chain or bracelet."

Carter prides his unit on visits to senior centers where they host presentations and two to three lectures per week. Their vital lectures range from how to safely carry a pocketbook or wallet, as pickpocketing is on the rise.

The *Canarsie Courier* asked Carter how local precincts are teaching seniors to utilize safety tools in light of the recent national abduction case of Nancy Guthrie, who was allegedly abducted from her home nearly months ago and serves as a potential reminder that older adults are targets for serious crimes as well.

"Well, of course, I can't say anything in regards to the Guthrie case, but citywide and nationwide we're trying to give older adults useful tools for their day-to-day travels – especially when they're out at night and passing dark corridors in their communities. They really need to be visible at nighttime. We advise them to put reflective keys on their keychains and if they're taking an Uber – advise drivers to wait until the residents are inside their homes before driving away. They should also walk with other people late at night and stay in well-lit areas." Carter noted that Apple AirTags can be helpful as well when worn on a bracelet or shoe, for example.

"A lot of older adults also live by themselves and have medical conditions that put them at a higher risk if they go missing," he noted. "Make sure there's some type of identification on them, so we have that history of their whereabouts. You should also laminate a paper or card for them that has contact numbers, so they can be ID'ed."

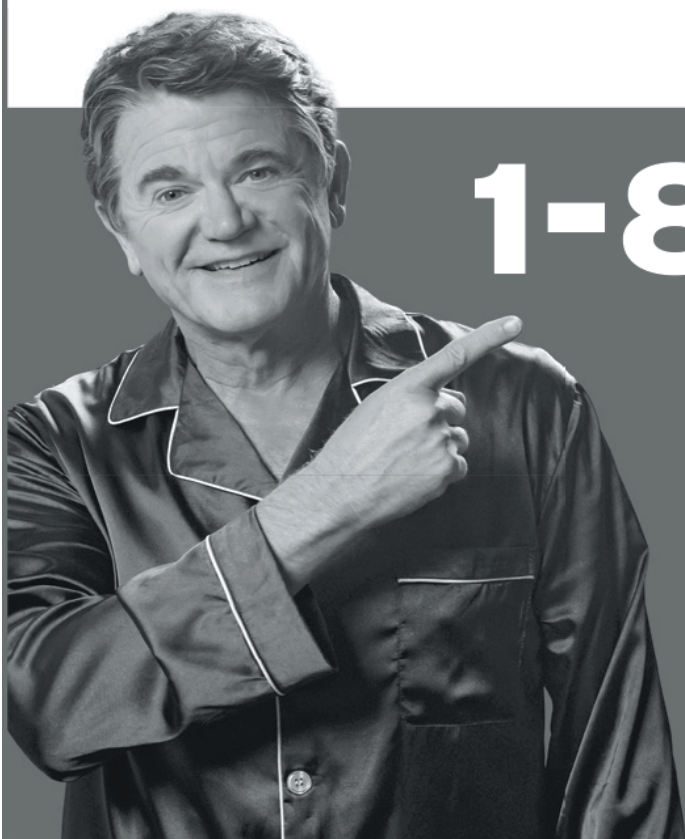
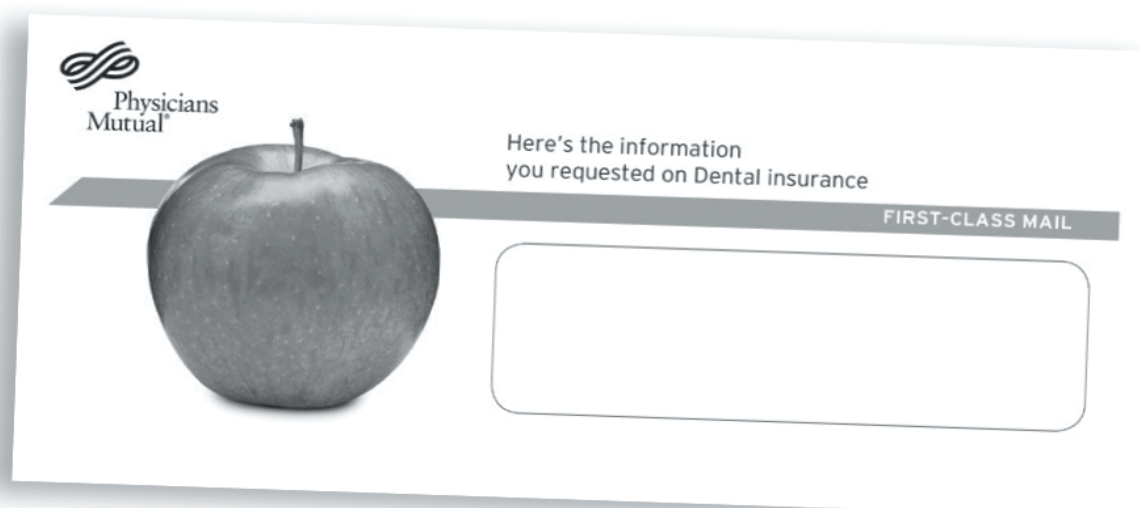

Fresh Creek Civic Calls for Halt on East 108th Street Development

The Fresh Creek Civic Association (FCCA) has worked to advocate on behalf of Canarsie residents since the group was founded, just after Superstorm Sandy. While their original focus was increased storm resiliency and future flood prevention, the group has taken on a wide variety of other challenges over the years. Recently, the group has been working to confirm rumors of what was to be a proposed homeless men's shelter, at 945-951 East 108th Street, and to ensure the community's vehement rejection of any such plan was made and loud and clear.

While the monthly FCCA meetings held at Jamaica Bay Library, located at 9727 Seaview Avenue, are always well-attended by a large, dedicated group of local residents, their meeting on Saturday

afternoon, April 25th, was different. There were so many attendees present that the meeting spilled out of the community room into the foyer and all the way through to the adult section of the library. Residents came in droves to express their strong opposition to a monstrosity being erected within their quiet residential neighborhood, currently comprised of mostly single family and two-family homes. They sought information and felt that the FCCA meeting was the only place they might actually get some answers. "No one else is telling us anything," one woman said. "This is important to us, and we have to stop it."

In fact, FCCA President Maria Garrett was able to dispel rumors of a homeless shelter, having confirmed through her research efforts that a seven-story, mixed-use, 99-unit building, with only 54

parking spots, is to be erected on the property, which was purchased by a private buyer for \$11.4 million. She explained that the property is in a flood zone, no environmental study was conducted by the Department of Environmental Protection, and any building in excess of three stories would irrevocably and negatively impact the current character of the community.

Both Garrett and Community Board 18 District Manager Sue Ann Partnow discussed the way the "City of Yes" has diminished the power community boards possess to intervene in these and other matters. "We can still say we don't want it, but we don't have that kind of power anymore where you can stop it unfortunately," Partnow said. "We always stand with the community. We can stand with you, we can fight with you, we can write letters, but unfortunately there is not a whole lot we can do now," she explained, saying the power currently rests with the City Council, Borough President and Mayor.

The FCCA will continue to demand accountability from the City and to obtain answers regarding the developer's ability to circumvent the zoning regulations that have been previously established to protect the community. They are calling for the issuance of an immediate Stop Work Order, clear, written confirmation of the intended use and occupancy classification of the building, and coordination of a public community meeting with the Department of Buildings, relevant agencies and the developer.

They may live in the "City of Yes," but Canarsie residents will continue to stand their ground and say "no" to the development slated for 945-951 East 108th Street.

Keep Your Loved Ones Safe: Warn Them of the Latest Scams and Threats

Theft and the elderly have been a recurring topic at the 63rd Precinct Community Council meetings, and it was on the agenda at the Wednesday, April 22nd meeting, held at Purpose Life Church, located at 1895 Flatbush Avenue. Attendees were advised to talk to older and vulnerable individuals to warn them about the latest acts of thievery.

Captain James Tomasulo, commanding officer of the 63rd Precinct, started the evening with an account of two phenomenal cops that apprehended a callous assailant in the act of rampage. A report was made of a man breaking a store's glass door, using a weapon that resembled a barbaric type of kettlebell and swinging the heavy weapon at people, including the cops. He stole cigars from the establishment that he vandalized. Both cops sustained minor injuries but were able to place the man in custody. Detective Timi Tomacruz and Police Officer Michael Mcglynn were honored with the March Cop of the Month awards for their composed and professional manner of arrest. Tomasulo thanked them for resolving an incident that could have ended in a disastrous situation.

Tomasulo continued the meeting with theft and scam warnings involving the most susceptible group of people – the elderly. As unbelievable as it might sound, a harmless looking person will walk up to another, pulling them into their plight with a heartwarming story and how a “simple” hug will help the situation. People will walk away feeling like they have done a good deed until they realize that their heirloom necklace is missing from their neck and they were the victim of a cruel scam. He advised that the elderly should be warned of these incidents.

Sixty-third Precinct Community Council President Greg Borruso detailed his eyewitness account in a local bank where an elderly woman stood visibly confused, not understanding why the recognized individuals that were seated before her in her trusted bank were not the same people that so specifically urged her to withdraw an absurd amount of money on the telephone. Borruso, reiterating Tomasulo's message, reminded attendees to talk to the older individuals in their lives and alert them to the latest scams.

Crime Prevention Officer Ainsley Carter also alerted the crowd that the elderly or other vulnerable individuals are being targeted for a scam through computers; an alert notifies them that their computer isn't working and they need to call a specified number for immediate assistance. Once they call that number, they are told to call another number, which gives the directive to withdraw an amount of money and proceed to deposit that amount onto gift cards. The defenseless victim will give the scratch-off code on the back of the card(s) to said computer guru until they realize the ruse or that their bank account is empty.

Carter also suggested that if it is possible, someone should be listed on the elderly family member's banking accounts to monitor unusual activity. He also urged everyone to warn people not to call unknown numbers.

The sleek, newly acquired 63rd Precinct license plate reader vehicle sat outside of the Community Council meeting location and Assemblywoman Jaime Williams, the person who secured the valuable automobile, addressed the crowd on the items that she's working on in Albany including the budget, car insurance fraud and other issues. She reminded meeting attendees that this is an election year and would love their continued support. Williams also shared upcoming events, like the Summer Concert Series that is open to any neighborhood within the District, not just Marine Park residents.

The next meeting of the 63rd Precinct Community Council will be held at 7 p.m., on Wednesday, May 27th, at the Thomas Jefferson Democratic Club, at 5809 Avenue T.

March of the Living: Walk to Remember

Under a chilly spring sky, dozens gathered on Sunday morning, April 19th, at Holocaust Memorial Park, at West End Avenue in Sheepshead Bay, for the annual “March of the Living: Walk to Remember,” a solemn and powerful tribute marking Yom HaShoah (Holocaust Remembrance Day). Participants, wrapped in blue and white, many carrying Israeli and American flags, came from across Brooklyn and beyond to honor the memory of the six million Jews and five million others murdered by the Nazi regime.

The ceremony opened with brief but moving remarks from community leaders and elected officials, including Assemblymen Michael Novakhov and Alec Brook-Krasny, people of different faiths, clergy and local advocates. Holocaust survivors — among the last living witnesses to history’s darkest chapter — stood as both symbols of resilience and reminders of the urgency to preserve memory for future generations.

Candles were lit. Stones were placed — each representing not only remembrance, but roots, heritage and the countries from which families once came. The crowd walked together along the waterfront, a living tribute to those who no longer can.

“We must never forget what happened to so many innocent people,” Novakhov said. “And we must stand strong in ensuring ‘Never Again’ truly means never again.”

Organizers and participants alike extended heartfelt gratitude to the many individuals who helped make the day both meaningful and secure. Special thanks were given to the 61st Precinct, for maintaining a strong and reassuring presence throughout the event, and to D’Anna Andrea for coordinating with the NYPD.

Clergy who offered words of reflection included Rabbi Baruch Binyamin Melman and Rabbi Shlomo Segal, while Novakhov and Brook-Krasny had words of remembrance and resolve. Stephanie Benshimol, a dedicated Jewish community advocate, brought flags, pins, stickers and signs that represent the cause.

Ariel Rebecca served as emcee. Rebecca’s role carried added significance for many in attendance. She previously led Sheepshead Bay’s “Run for Your Lives” walks — weekly gatherings held every Sunday, rain or shine, in solidarity with the hostages taken during the October 7 attacks in Israel. Those walks became a symbol of endurance, unity and unwavering advocacy, continuing until all hostages, living and deceased, were returned home. While that chapter has now closed, the spirit behind it remains deeply connected to events like the March of the Living.

This year’s gathering carried added weight. As time passes, this will be the last generation where Holocaust survivors will remain to tell their stories firsthand. That reality lent urgency to the day’s message: remembrance is no longer just about honoring the past but also safeguarding the future.

As speakers emphasized, the fight against antisemitism did not end with history, nor with any single moment of crisis. With Holocaust survivors still among us — but fewer each year — a profound responsibility to remember, to teach and to ensure that “Never Again” endures not as a slogan, but as a solemn and unbreakable covenant.

Yet even as the echoes of the March of the Living lingered, a stark contrast unfolded the very next day. The community came together, once again, against the invaders who come to quiet neighborhoods to instill



fear and intimidation.

On Monday, April 20th, a pro-Hamas protest with masked agitators organized by Al-Awda targeted Mini-Circuits, a family-owned business operating on Neptune Avenue since 1968. Demonstrators, citing alleged ties to Israel, claiming they produce military parts for the IDF stood outside the building. They then marched toward Brighton Beach with Palestinian flags, while local counter-protesters gathered with Israeli and American flags, viewing the action as intimidation against a longstanding neighborhood establishment.

Speaking from Albany, Novakhov condemned the demonstration, stating, “This is not a protest. This is bullying. This is antisemitism at its finest,” also affirming that the community “will not be silent” and “will stand against hate every time.”

The sharp contrast between the solemn Holocaust remembrance and the confrontation the next day underscored a deeper reality for many residents: that the lessons of history remain urgent and the commitment to stand against hate and antisemitism continue in the present day.

A Night of Remembrance, Resolve and Survival at Flatbush Park Jewish Center

An evening of solemn remembrance, resilience and unity unfolded at the Flatbush Park Jewish Center, located at 6363 Avenue U, on Tuesday, April 14th, as community leaders, survivors and residents gathered to commemorate Yom HaShoah 2026–5786, honoring the six million Jews murdered in the Holocaust and reaffirming the enduring pledge of “Never Again.”

The ceremony, led by organizer Lisa Jacobs and opened with remarks from Rabbi Yisroel Perelson, brought together a wide cross-section of civic and community voices. Among those in attendance were Assemblywoman Jaime Williams, Councilwoman Mercedes Narcisse and NYC Comptroller Mark Levine, each offering reflections that tied the lessons of the past to the challenges of the present.

In deeply personal remarks, Williams recalled her visit to Yad Vashem – The World Holocaust Remembrance Center in Israel, describing the profound emotional impact of walking through its halls of memory. She spoke of a darkened room illuminated by symbolic lights representing the lives lost – a moment that, she said, leaves visitors “a different person.” Williams emphasized the urgency of education, urging that younger generations must continue to learn the history of the Holocaust to guard against rising hatred and ignorance.

Narcisse offered a unique historical perspective, highlighting Haiti’s role during the Holocaust. She noted that the Haitian government issued passports and visas to Jewish refugees fleeing Nazi persecution, saving hundreds of lives. “When people are in danger, you help,” she said, underscoring the importance of solidarity across cultures – a value she said continues to define the diverse communities of southern Brooklyn.

Levine delivered a forceful and timely address, warning of the resurgence of antisemitism – both locally and globally. Drawing inspiration from survivors and their families, he pointed to the rebuilding of vibrant Jewish life in New York City as a testament to resilience. “Out of the ashes, you have built something powerful,” he said, expressing confidence that the Jewish community – and its allies – will once again overcome the forces of hate.

The evening’s most powerful moment came with the testimony of Holocaust survivor Manfred Korman, whose detailed presentation

His father’s voyage on the infamous ship, the St. Louis, which was denied asylum and turned back to Europe’s Nazi machine.

traced his family's harrowing journey through Nazi persecution. Accompanied by historical images and maps, Korman recounted his childhood in Germany, his family's forced expulsion and their desperate search for refuge.

He described the fate of relatives who boarded the ill-fated MS St. Louis, the ship of Jewish refugees turned away from Cuba and the United States, ultimately forced back to Europe where many passengers perished in the Holocaust. Korman's own story of separation, survival through the Kindertransport, disbursement throughout Europe and eventual reunion with his family in America brought the audience into the intimate reality behind historical events too often reduced to statistics.

The program also featured moving musical and poetic tributes, including renditions of "Hatikvah" and "The Star-Spangled Banner" by Chazzan Chaim Davis, as well as Holocaust-era poetry readings, read by students Giselle Hershkovich and Jacob Tarr, that gave voice to those who perished. A candle-lighting ceremony honored victims and survivors, while a choir led by Dr. Adam Shapiro performed traditional and memorial selections, deepening the emotional resonance of the evening.

Among those recognized was NYPD Chief Richie Taylor, the highest-ranking Jewish officer in the department's history, symbolizing both representation and progress. Gratitude was also extended to the 63rd Precinct Community Affairs officers, particularly Detective Tricia Navarro-Caraballo, for ensuring the safety and dignity of the gathering.

As the ceremony concluded with Kaddish and a moment of silence, the message was clear: remembrance is not passive. It is an active commitment — to honor the past, confront hatred in the present and safeguard the future.

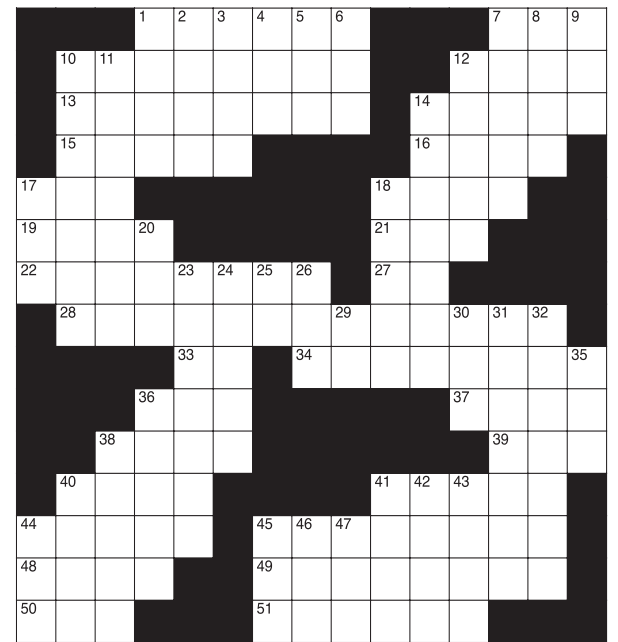

Consuming Fire Ministry Lit up Liberty Hall Cathedral with Prayers

Liberty Hall Cathedral of Praise, located at 1387 East 96th Street, was packed with clergy leaders and other guests who attended the 3rd annual Prayer Breakfast, hosted by Consuming Fire Ministries International Inc. (CFMII), on Saturday, April 25th.

The prayers offered were as liberal as the breakfast served. “I pray that every part of it will do our bodies good,” Pastor Vivian McCalman, of Healing and Miracle Church International, stated, as he said grace. “I thank You that health and healing will grow from it,” he added, as he continued to thank God for His many blessings.

Other pastors took turns praying for church leaders and pastors, world peace, government and community, including elected officials. Rev. Roy Lamazon, of Destiny Tabernacle Assemblies of God Church, outstretched his arm toward State Senator Roxanne Persaud and called on all present to do the same, as he covered her with a special prayer.

The event also featured some entertainment. Several door prizes – consisting of prayer shawls and vials of anointing and prosperity oil – were won. Additionally, two generously packed gift baskets were raffled. Guests were also entertained by 15-year-old Love Lee, who sang Jonathan McReynold’s “No Gray,” which highlighted the inner conflict of many who attempt to live in both worlds, essentially serving two masters.

“You’re either with God or without Him,” Lee announced bravely. “It’s either black or white – no gray in between,” she added.

Her simple message was expounded on by keynote speaker, Bishop Dr. Cheryl Ault-Barker, a retired NYC Department of Education principal and current senior pastor of CFMII. Her sermon centered on “Walking in the New,” a theme she reinforced with the teaching in Isaiah 43:18-19. The bishop also used two receptacles – one containing clean water, the other dirty water, to illustrate her point and the repercussion of living (or trying to live) with darkness and light simultaneously. She demonstrated that when clean water was added to the container of dirty water, it remained dirty and, conversely, when dirty water was added to the clean water, the result was also dirty.

“New requires letting go of the old,” the bishop stated and cited II Corinthians 5:17: “Therefore if any man be in Christ, he is a new creature. Old things are passed away, behold all things are become new.” She emphasized, “New is a daily walk, not a one-time event,” and gave as an example, those who attend service on Sunday, get totally immersed in it, but demonstrate completely different behavior on Monday. She urged everyone to remain on the right track with God.




Before her message ended, Ault-Barker called for all in need of additional prayers to approach the dais where she also laid hands on them individually. The event concluded with her saying an extra closing prayer of thanks and signing copies of her latest book, “Unity in Diversity: An Expository Study of Apostle Paul’s Letter to the Church.”
