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A Place for Sunsets, Not Sirens

Canarsie Pier is more than a waterfront destination. It is where families come for fresh air, neighbors take walks, fishermen cast their lines and young people gather with friends. It is part of the shared life of our community. That is why the recent violence near the pier demands more than our grief — it demands our action.

The killing of 30-year-old John Garvin near Canarsie Pier on August 9th is devastating. Police believe the shooting followed a dispute. Whatever the circumstances, a disagreement ended with a man losing his life near one of our neighborhood's most cherished public spaces. The pier should be a place of peace and connection, not fear and grief.

His death came after a troubling string of shootings in recent weeks: a man shot inside the Bayview Houses in early July, two people wounded on Glenwood Road on July 17th and another man shot outside an event space near Avenue D in early August. These incidents should alarm all of us.

They should not erase the progress New York City has made. Citywide shootings and murders have fallen, and Brooklyn has reported historic declines as well. Canarsie's experience shows why citywide numbers alone are

not enough. A neighborhood can still face painful bursts of violence even as broader trends improve.

The answer is not to dismiss progress or declare victory. It is to deepen the work.

Canarsie needs sustained public safety investments: getting illegal guns off the street, holding shooters accountable and preventing violence before it occurs. That means more year-round jobs for youth, mentoring, recreation, mental health support, credible-messenger programs and safe places for young people to gather.

It also means real investment and economic development throughout our neighborhood. Too many residents, especially young people, lack direct access to local jobs, training, business opportunities and career pathways. A safer Canarsie requires more than responding after a shooting. It requires giving people a meaningful stake in their future.

We should support small businesses, invest in our commercial corridors, expand workforce training and apprenticeships, and ensure that new investment creates jobs for Canarsie residents. Our parks, public spaces and waterfront should be active, welcoming community assets.

Violence often begins long before a



trigger is pulled. It grows from unresolved conflicts, hopelessness, retaliation and a lack of opportunity. We must address those conditions with the same urgency we bring to the crime scene.

Canarsie Pier belongs to all of us. So does the responsibility to protect it. Canarsie deserves safety today and economic opportunity for the future.

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Canarsie Pier – Scene of Fatal Shooting

A Canarsie man did not survive his injuries after he was shot several times at the Canarsie Pier in the early morning hours of Sunday, August 9th.

The shooting occurred around 3:15 a.m. in the vicinity of the Belt Parkway and Rockaway Parkway, according to official sources. Police from the 69th Precinct responded to the pier, where they found the victim, John Garvin, 30, with multiple gunshot wounds to his head and body.

The victim was taken by EMS to Brookdale

Hospital where he was pronounced dead.

There are no arrests, and an investigation is ongoing.

State Orders Local Venue to Shut Down Over Missing Workers' Comp

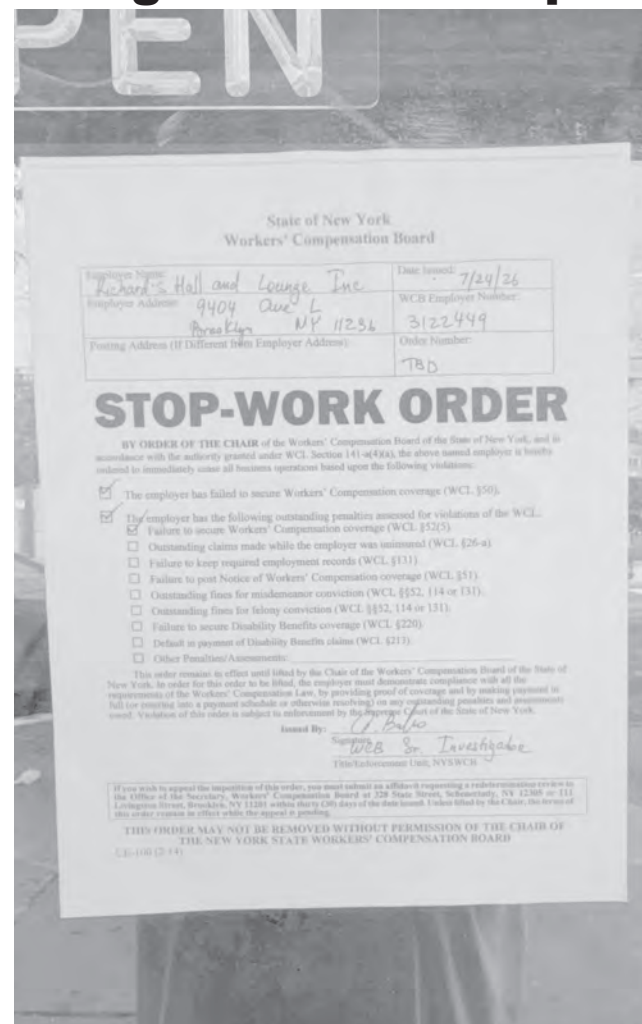
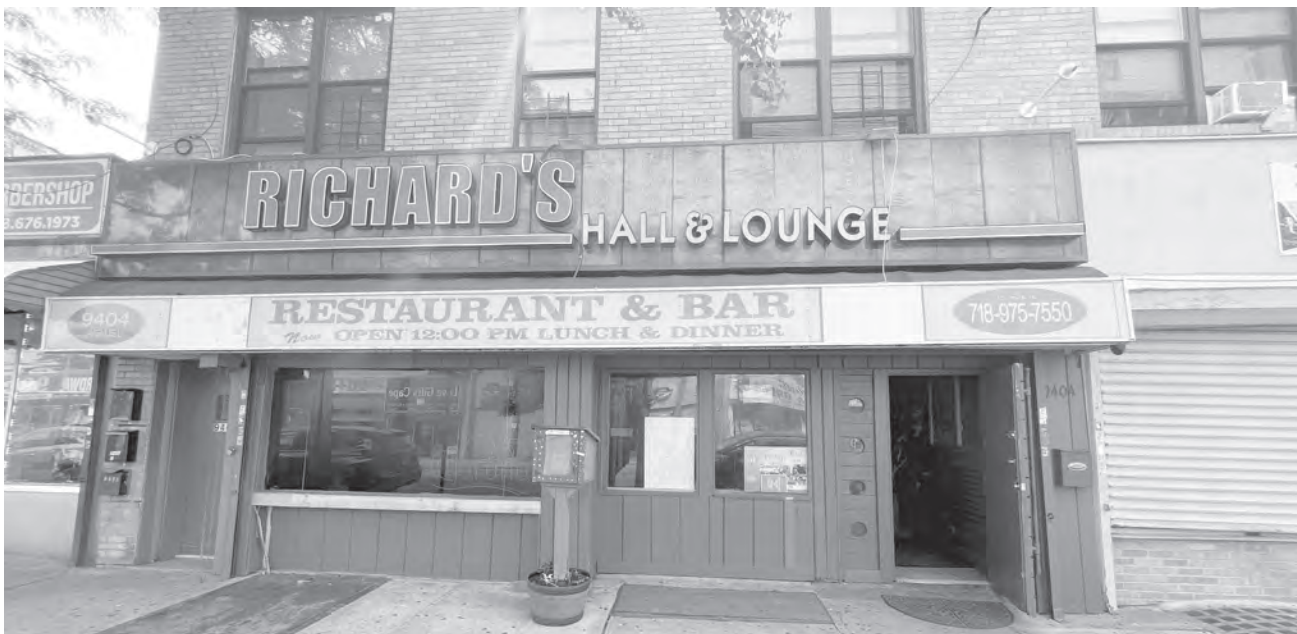
A local venue and restaurant was forced to lock its doors after state regulators caught the business operating without mandatory workers' compensation insurance.

Richard's Hall & Lounge Inc., located at 9404 Avenue L, was served a bright orange stop-work order by the New York State Workers' Compensation Board. Posted on July 24, 2026, the notice cites the establishment for failing to secure required coverage for its workforce and points to outstanding penalties tied to the violation.

Under state law, the order requires the business to immediately cease all operations. To reopen, Richard's Hall must submit proof of proper insurance coverage — which guarantees medical care and wage replacement for employees injured on the job — and clear all unpaid state assessments.

The notice warns that removing the orange poster without explicit approval from the Workers' Compensation Board chair is a violation that could bring further legal enforcement.

Requests for comment sent to Richard's Hall & Lounge were not returned prior to publication.



Firefighters Contain Late Night House Fire

Firefighters battled a late night house fire in Canarsie on Thursday, August 6th.

Members from Engine Company 257, Tower Ladder 170 and Battalion 58 responded to 1060 East 81st Street, between Avenues J and K, around 11:35 p.m. to find fire on the first floor of a three-story, attached brick private dwelling.

About 65 firefighters deployed three hose lines to quickly extinguish the main body of fire. FDNY officials said there were no injuries at the scene of the fire, and the blaze was placed under control at 12:15 a.m. on Friday morning, August 7th.

The FDNY Fire Marshal's Office will determine the cause and origin of the fire.



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New York Strengthens Anti-Trafficking Efforts with Transportation Awareness

World Day Against Trafficking in Persons is observed on July 30th. Human trafficking is a hidden crime that can take place in neighborhoods, homes, businesses and especially within transportation systems. Traffickers use roads, public transit, airports and rest stops to move victims unnoticed.

State Senator Roxanne Persaud spoke with Department of Transportation ("DOT") Commissioner Marie Therese Dominguez about the vital role transportation workers and the public play in spotting and reporting trafficking in her YouTube series, *Conversations with Senator Persaud*. Dominguez emphasized that the DOT oversees the movement of people and goods across the state, including roads, bridges, public transit, ports and airports.

Persaud, chair of the Senate Social Services Committee, described human trafficking as a growing threat that hurts communities, including her own district. "Human trafficking

affects us all," she said, adding that people might notice warning signs without knowing what they mean.

Traffickers exploit transportation systems to move victims. DOT employees, such as inspectors, are trained to spot warning signs and report anything suspicious to law enforcement, especially in places like rest areas and truck stops where it is harder to keep track of what is happening.

Legislation sponsored by Persaud provided this effort with additional support. Signed into law in November 2025, it added the DOT, Department of Motor Vehicles and New York State Thruway Authority to the state's Interagency Task Force on Trafficking in Persons. This change recognizes that transportation agencies can help watch for trafficking in places traffickers might use.

Dominguez emphasized that the DOT is especially important because its employees are present throughout New York's transportation network every day. With workers monitoring

roads, commercial vehicles, transit systems, rest areas and other travel locations, the agency provides additional trained eyes in places where trafficking may otherwise go unnoticed. "We have a lot of eyes on the roadway," she explained, underscoring how transportation employees can help identify concerning behavior and quickly alert law enforcement.

Transportation workers play a unique role. DOT motor carrier inspectors regularly check trucks and other commercial vehicles operating across New York. They may also work alongside State Police, allowing them to report suspected trafficking when warning signs appear during inspections. Dominguez said that teaching transportation employees what to look for increases the number of people who can spot trafficking. "If we see any of those signs of trafficking, we're reporting them," she said.

There is no single sign that proves trafficking, but unusual or controlled behavior can be a warning.

Some signs to watch for are someone controlling another person's movements, victims who seem scared, quiet or very dependent, and groups being closely directed. Wearing clothing that does not fit the situation or showing discomfort can also be a warning sign. "Oftentimes, you'll have people who are dominant," Dominguez said, talking about people who stop others from speaking freely or making their own choices.

Persaud recalled witnessing two young women walking outside in cold weather while a man appeared to be watching them from a nearby car. When the senator offered assistance, the younger woman appeared interested, but the older woman quickly stepped in. Persaud later contacted the NYPD about the situation. The conversation showed that trafficking is not limited to one gender, age group, income level or neighborhood. It can affect women, men and children in cities, suburbs and rural areas.

That familiar slogan, "If you see something, say something," applies here: If you witness something suspicious, report your concerns to authorities who can handle the situation safely. New York law requires trafficking-awareness posters in airports, bus terminals, truck stops and other major transit points. DOT places educational materials, hotline numbers and QR codes in rest areas to help victims discreetly seek help. Restrooms can sometimes provide one of the few moments when a victim is temporarily separated from the person controlling them.

Haitian TPS Has Ended: What it Means for New York's Immigrant Workforce

In response to the end of Temporary Protected Status (TPS) for Haitians and Syrians on Monday, July 27th, *The Haitian Times* hosted an event on July 30th at the Brooklyn College Student Center, 2705 Campus Road, where political, business, labor, nonprofit and educational leaders gathered to discuss the impact on New York's immigrant workforce.

The leadership breakfast, "Leading Labor in a Changing Immigration Landscape: Responses to Federal Policy Impacting Immigrant Workforce in New York City," was presented by the Hotel Association of New York City, in partnership with the Federation of Haitian Chambers of Commerce and the CUNY Haitian Studies Institute (HSI). It was moderated by Macollvie J. Neel, special projects editor, *The Haitian Times*.

Featured speakers included Vijay Dandapani, president and CEO, Hotel Association of New York City; Faiza Ali, commissioner, NYC Mayor's Office of Immigrant Affairs (MOIA); Councilwoman Rita Joseph; Stephanie Delia, executive director, Little Haiti BK; Dr. Shirley Leyro, associate professor, BMCC/CUNY; HSI Assistant Professor and Director Dr. Marie Lilie Cerat; and others.

The end of TPS protection for Haitians who may have lost their TPS-based work authorization and legal status has repercussions that not only affect immigrants, workers and employers whose industries rely heavily on an immigrant workforce, but also everyone whose lives they touch in the roles they previously occupied.

"For many, this conversation is about immigration policies, but it's also about our workforce, our economy and the future of New York City," Ali said.

Ali and other speakers emphasized that TPS holders are not just numbers but hardworking people who have spent years and even decades building their lives here. They serve our communities as nurses, health aides, educators, entrepreneurs, restaurant workers, construction workers and business owners. They own homes, pay taxes and fill critical work shortages, while raising families and contributing to society.

Uncertainty, confusion and anxiety have blanketed the community, evidenced by stories of empty buses, businesses and streets where a once thriving Haitian community traveled and worked freely.

The primary recommended resource was MOIA's free and confidential support hotline at 800-354-0365. There is also a useful TPS FAQ available on their website.

Each situation is different and requires a personal screening and plan. MOIA can connect people to legal and non-profit services through their NYC Haitian Response Initiative. *The Haitian Times* has a list of resource links and the Brooklyn Borough President's office has a digital resource hub called Our City, Our Sanctuary.

Dandapani said that the hotel industry immigrant workforce has about 1,200 members from the Haitian community. "The borough that has the most Haitians from our industry is Queens, followed by Brooklyn," he said, adding that it is still too soon to know how the change will impact his workers.

Sandra Dieudonne, supervising attorney of the Haitian Response Initiative, spoke about the calls she is getting from white-glove law firms and people who employed TPS holders who have been providing critical services and don't know what to do.

"People used to think that immigration affects others until it affects them," she said, adding that it's not just affecting people who are working, but also young children and elderly or disabled who rely on home health support. "I'm so afraid that once this ends, that I don't know what's going to happen to them, and there are thousands that have no other option for healthcare."

Leyro said that CUNY students have a right to services in the CUNY-wide network such as CUNY Citizenship Now! She recommended connecting the bank account to an email or an international money transfer agency and to memorize emergency phone contact and alien registration numbers in case the phone becomes unavailable.

Elected officials who joined Joseph were NYC Public Advocate Jumaane Williams, Assemblywoman Phara Souffrant Forrest, Councilwoman Farah Louis, Brooklyn Deputy Borough President Kimberly Council and Assemblyman Clyde Vanel.

Restoration of federal funding cuts and concerns about separation from children in the case of deportation were discussed, emphasizing the urgent need for legal representation to prepare a power of attorney, trust, guardianship, habeas corpus and other papers.

Concerns about future food, transportation, finance and other needs were also discussed. "We need wraparound resources, including healthcare, mental health support and housing," Joseph said.

"Now more than ever, not only do we need to educate and advocate, but we need to tie our ropes together," Council said.

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Remembering Vincent Pastore

Vincent Pastore was a kid from the Bronx who had a dream that became reality. Growing up in an Italian-American family, he became a legend in his time. Before he became an actor, he was a nightclub owner, a bouncer and a chauffeur.

Starting his acting career at 40, Pastore got small parts in major films like *Goodfellows* and *Carlito's Way*. He guest starred on TV shows like *One Life to Live*, *Las Vegas* and *Celebrity Apprentice*. His tough guy image became a major role in his acting career. In 1999, he was cast in the HBO hit series, *The Sopranos*, as a mafia soldier-turned FBI informant.

After *The Sopranos*, life would not be the same for Pastore, who was in demand for guest appearances on more TV shows and films. But he always remembered where he came from and was one of the nicest guys in the business, always making time for his fans – never turning down signing an autograph or a photo op with a fan.

Canarsie resident and *Celebrity Spotlight* host Jimmy Diele said he met Pastore a few times over the years. "He was always very gracious and very down to Earth. Fame did not affect his personality in any way," Diele said Pastore helped young actors who were just starting out and enjoyed working with acting

students. He encouraged them and made it clear that if he was able to achieve what he did, that they could too.

"The last time I had the pleasure of being in his presence was in Atlantic City," Diele said. "He was doing a *Sopranos* show at the Borgata Casino with fellow cast members, Michael Imperioli and Steve Schirripa. They did a Q&A about their time on *The Sopranos* and shared many fun stories about the cast and working on the show. I had the pleasure of spending some time backstage with Vincent, Michael and Steve. It was an amazing time with really amazing actors."

"He will be missed by his family, friends and fans. He will remain forever in our hearts and live on in all his great television and film work and, of course, *The Sopranos*."

Vincent Pastore passed away on August 1, 2026. He was 80 years old.

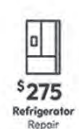
