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New York Will Never Forget

This week marks the 25th anniversary of the September 11th terrorist attacks — one of the darkest days in the history of New York City and our Nation.

Many of us can still recall exactly where we were when the unimaginable happened. I remember being abruptly picked up from my local elementary school, P.S. 276, and the look on my teachers' faces as tears rolled down their eyes. Even now, I remember the color of the sky that tragic day.

We remember the thousands of lives stolen that day. We remember the families who sent loved ones to work that morning and never saw them return home. We remember the firefighters, police officers, paramedics and all first responders who, in an extraordinary act of courage and selflessness, ran toward danger as thousands of others desperately tried to escape.

And the loss did not end when the smoke cleared. In the days, weeks and months that followed, thousands more descended on Ground Zero. They searched for survivors, recovered the fallen and helped our city begin to rebuild. Many were exposed to toxic conditions that would follow them for the rest of their lives. We have continued to lose members of our 9/11 community to illnesses connected to their service at Ground Zero.

We honor them all. As a New Yorker, I believe we owe these heroes and their

families an eternal debt of gratitude. Think about the courage it took to enter those buildings. They did not know the people they were trying to save. They did not know what awaited them above. They did not know whether they would ever make it home to their own families.

They went anyway. That selflessness represents the very best of New York. Now, 25 years later, our responsibility is also to ensure their stories live on. An estimated 100 million Americans are too young to remember September 11th firsthand. For an entire generation, 9/11 is history rather than memory.

Our promise to "never forget" must therefore mean more than remembering once a year. We must teach the next generation about the unimaginable loss our city experienced, but also about the bravery, compassion, unity and service that followed. In our darkest hours, strangers helped strangers, neighbors cared for neighbors and first responders put the lives of people they had never met ahead of their own.

Remembrance must also be matched by action. This anniversary, I encourage New Yorkers who are able to support organizations that continue to care for first responders and families affected by September 11th, including the FDNY Foundation and the NYPD Sergeants Benevolent Association Widows and Children's Fund.

Twenty-five years later, New York's

debt to those who sacrificed has not diminished. We remember those we lost. We stand with those still living with the effects of that day. We care for the families left behind. And we honor, always, those who ran toward danger when our city needed them most. We will never forget.

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Brownsville**Press Conference Held at Site of Homicide****By Robert Pearl**

Elected officials and a gubernatorial candidate held a press conference in Brownsville on Tuesday, September 1st, to address the fatal shooting of MD Yousuf and criticize New York's criminal justice policies.

Yousuf, a hardworking father and immigrant from Bangladesh, was killed on August 23rd during a robbery at American Best Wings & Pizza, 842 Rockaway Avenue. Bronx resident Jesus Acosta, 31, was subsequently arrested in connection with the Brownsville homicide and a second killing in the Bronx (see "Bronx Man Arrested for Two Homicides, Two Days Apart," *Canarsie Courier*, September 3rd).

Speaking outside the business, Nassau County Executive and Republican gubernatorial candidate Bruce Blakeman blamed state criminal justice policies and the release of violent offenders, saying, "What was the purpose of letting this violent felon out?" He questioned how such an individual could have been released before allegedly committing two murders. "How many families have to be hurt and torn apart before we get some sanity in our criminal

justice system?"

Blakeman pledged that, if elected governor, he would "appoint people to the state parole board, who put safety first, who put communities first, who care about public safety."

State Senator Steve Chan also spoke, calling for greater support for police and emphasizing the need to give officers the tools and laws necessary to do their jobs.

Assemblyman Michael Novakhov said the tragedy reflected broader problems with the criminal justice system. "This is insane. This has to end," he said, adding that he believed changes were needed.

A 25-year-old man who was stabbed twice in the torso did not survive his injuries.

Police from the 67th Precinct responded to a 911 call of an assault outside 882 Albany Avenue, between Church Avenue and Linden Blvd., around 5:30 p.m. on Friday, September 4th.

The victim, identified as Christopher Davey, of East Flatbush, was taken by EMS to Kings County Hospital in critical condition, where he

was later pronounced dead, police said.

There are no arrests, and an investigation is ongoing.

Detectives are investigating the homicide of a 32-year-old man who was shot on Labor Day, Monday, September 7th.

Officers from the 73rd Precinct responded to 350 Bristol Street, between Dumont and Livonia Avenues, where they found the victim, Cleo Daniels, of Bedford-Stuyvesant, with a gunshot wound to the head around 8:35 p.m.

The victim was rushed by EMS to Brookdale Hospital in critical condition and was later pronounced dead at the hospital, according to police.

Officers recovered multiple shell casings at the scene.

There are no arrests, and an investigation is ongoing.

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Flatlands Resident Competes in Psi Games – It's Not Just a State of Mind

It doesn't take a mind reader to know when a colleague, friend or family member has a special skill they're proud to showcase ... or maybe it does!

For Kings Highway/Flatlands area resident, and former *Canarsie Courier* contributor, Dave Lewin, honing in on one's psychic abilities takes patience and belief in the power of the mind. Lewin recently participated in the annual Psi Games – competing in the Remote Viewing (RV) category (the practice of obtaining impressions about a distant or unseen subject, purportedly sensing it with the mind).

"To understand these abilities, you have to suspend disbelief," said Lewin, who spent many years meditating and had quite a few paranormal experiences that he couldn't prove were real or tangible. "There was never anything I could objectively show anybody about some of my experiences. It's all subjective."

Lewin, a mindset coach, actor and consciousness explorer, told the *Canarsie Courier* that he's endured quite a bit of out-of-body experiences and lucid dreams – things he couldn't demonstrate.

However, a friend engaged him in Reiki healing when his late father was sick years ago.

"My friend put me and my family in a spiritual place where we knew we could communicate with my Dad. To me, there was something real about this energy. Then when my Mom was sick, something came over me that told me to pray for her. So, we prayed together out loud – and again, I suspended my own disbelief ... then there was this crazy flash through my mind and I just thought, 'Wow, okay, that was strange.' But other stuff started happening, and I began further researching psychic abilities."

Lewin was also a member of NYC's First Church of Religious Science. Taking courses in scientific prayer

gave him more insight on the science of faith and the mind. He began his journey watching YouTube videos about spoonbending, which isn't actually bending metal cutlery with one's mind, but rather focusing on it so that it becomes manually pliable. He followed "The Phenomenon Project" podcast host Kory Moo, who discusses paranormal experiences, skywatching, expanded consciousness and even UFOs.

A Brooklyn native, Lewin unlocked more abilities – focusing on telekinesis/psychokinesis (moving objects from afar without contact). Numerous experiments and practice implored him to apply for the Psi Games, which were hosted in North Carolina from July 31st to August 2nd. The competition pushes mental boundaries of human potential, including an array of psychic areas like mind sight, dowsing, psychokinesis and precognition.

According to Psi Games guidelines, in order to compete, each individual must undergo an assessment specific to their skills. The assessments are designed to ensure that participants demonstrate skills above the possibility of chance. Contestants sat on a panel on the stage where vital signs were monitored and recorded during the demonstrations.

Lewin noted 26 people competed in the prestigious games, with eight finalists in each category. Judges included scientists, top neuroscientists, researchers and members of the Stargate US Military program.

"They had us do remote viewing on a laptop; most remote reviewing is just done on pen and paper," he said. "So, they gave us a stylus and mouse pad to make marks about the place we had to describe. I was sure I was gonna win, but I came in fourth on the panel."

Lewin admitted RV wasn't a discipline he originally trained for, as telekinesis/psychokinesis was his specialty, but he tried an RV Tournament to challenge

himself. "I know how to do remote viewing the way someone would know how to make bread," he explained. "You know the ingredients, but you've never made it. I wound up being pretty good at it."

Lewin has learned that many of us have undiscovered psychic potential – and most of us have psychic intuition/experiences all the time. "We chalk it up to 'I just had a feeling,'" he laughed. "Most people don't use their abilities or try to understand them. I discovered a myriad of psychic abilities I didn't even know I had."

Lewin wants to compete again next year and was recently interviewed by Moo about his journey with the Psi Games (<https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=JPmpOSJCwvs>).

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Canarsie Civic Leader Maria Garrett Honored as Brooklyn Greening Hero

For more than two decades, Canarsie resident Maria Garrett has spent countless hours pulling weeds, clearing invasive plants and organizing volunteers to protect the Fresh Creek Nature Preserve. Now, her grassroots conservation work is receiving borough-wide recognition.

Garrett is among the community members featured in "Brooklyn's Greening Heroes," a portrait and oral-history exhibition at the Brooklyn Botanic Garden. The display marks the 30th anniversary of the garden's Greenest Block in Brooklyn competition and highlights residents who use environmental stewardship to strengthen their neighborhoods. The exhibition remains on display through October 25th.

Standing beside a large photograph of herself taken at the preserve near East 108th Street and Avenue M,

Garrett described seeing her neighborhood represented at the historic institution as an emotional moment.

"This is my passion, this is what I do, and this is what I love," Garrett said during the garden's anniversary celebrations. "I'm so happy to be here, and I'm honored to be featured."

For Garrett, who leads the Fresh Creek Civic Association and has lived in Canarsie for three decades, the recognition is primarily an opportunity to spotlight her home neighborhood. She noted that the honor helps counter negative stereotypes about Canarsie and showcases its community strength.

Garrett's involvement with Fresh Creek began more than 20 years ago when residents grew concerned over severe neglect. Because the property carries a Forever Wild designation, municipal, state and federal agencies initially disputed who held maintenance responsibility, leaving weeds to grow waist-high along neighborhood sidewalks.

Rather than accept the administrative deadlock, Garrett attended city workshops and researched environmental regulations alongside her daughter, a political science student. She eventually connected with the NYC Parks Department's Natural Resources Group to establish a formal restoration plan.

Beginning around 2009, stewardship teams began removing invasive species — including phragmites, mugwort, Japanese knotweed and tree of heaven — and replacing them with native trees and shrubs.

When Superstorm Sandy struck the coastline in 2012, the storm temporarily halted restoration work but highlighted the critical role natural buffer zones play in flood prevention. Garrett subsequently joined the New York Rising Community Reconstruction process, successfully advocating for tide control infrastructure to prevent storm surge backups into residential sewer systems. Native plants like sumac and black-eyed Susans were also planted to absorb excess groundwater and preserve local wildlife habitats.

Garrett's advocacy has spurred wider local interest in urban greening. In recent years, nearby locations including Flatlands 7th Street and Rockaway Parkway have earned honors in the boroughwide Greenest Block contest.

Norine Medas of the Canarsie Merchants Association emphasized that expansion of urban forestry directly impacts public health and economic vitality by adding shade, mitigating extreme heat and improving the pedestrian experience along commercial corridors.

Today, Garrett continues to coordinate public cleanups through the Partnership for Parks while visiting the preserve multiple times a week to perform hands-on maintenance.

While boroughwide accolades are welcome, Garrett says her primary motivation remains setting an example for her children and grandchildren while protecting what she considers Canarsie's greatest natural asset.

AEEJ Holds 23rd Annual Remembrance Day at Holocaust Memorial Park

Neighbors and friends gathered at Holocaust Memorial Park in Sheepshead Bay on Sunday, August 30th, for the Association of East-European Jewry's (AEEJ) 23rd Annual Remembrance Day, "No One Is Forgotten — Nothing Is Forgotten," honoring the six million Jews murdered during the Holocaust and those killed in the October 7, 2023, terrorist attacks in Israel. The annual ceremony was led by AEEJ President Bella Gubenko, in coordination with her daughter, Svetlana Gubenko.

The gathering brought together Holocaust survivors, World War II veterans, families, elected officials, community leaders, representatives of the Consulate General of Israel and members of the community.

The program opened with a rendition of "The Star-Spangled Banner" and the Israeli National Anthem, including the presentation of American and Israeli flags, remarks by Holocaust survivors, a moment of silence, memorial candles and the release of white doves symbolizing remembrance, hope and peace.

A major theme throughout the ceremony was the importance of remembering the Holocaust while confronting antisemitism and hatred today.

Among the dignitaries and officials participating in the remembrance ceremony were Eyal David, deputy consul general of Israel in New York; Alexander Gurevich, representative of Brooklyn District Attorney Eric Gonzalez; State Senators Steve Chan and Jessica Scarcella-Spanton; Assemblymen Michael Novakhov, Alec Brook-Krasny and William Colton; representatives of NYC Comptroller Mark Levine; Brooklyn Chamber of Commerce President and CEO Randy Peers; Ari Kagan, senior advisor to Senator Chan and AEEJ co-founder; representatives of COJECO and other community organizations; and other community and government representatives who joined in honoring the victims and supporting the AEEJ's annual remembrance tradition.

David told those gathered that remembrance "cannot remain passive," calling on the community to stand against antisemitism and bigotry. "It's a collective duty for all of us," he said, while honoring Holocaust survivors and World War II veterans as an inspiration to future generations. Also in attendance was Rabbi Zalman Liberow and his wife, Chana, of Chabad-House of Flatbush.

Chan emphasized the importance of the memorial site to the local community. "This memorial park may not be the biggest, it may not be the grandest, but it's ours," Chan said, describing it as "sacred space" for reflection on the tragedies of history.

Novakhov also addressed the rise of antisemitism and the need to defend Jewish life and Israel. He pre-

sented citations recognizing Bella Gubenko and AEEJ leadership for their work preserving Jewish heritage and serving the community.

The ceremony also featured the awards presentation for winners and participants in the 15th Annual International Youth Contest, "Never Again!" — underscoring the event's emphasis on passing Holocaust memory and its lessons to younger generations.

As speakers repeatedly stressed throughout the ceremony, the message of the day remained clear: No one is forgotten, and nothing is forgotten.

Going Batty for Bats at Bats! Night Walk

Bat enthusiasts gathered at the Gerritsen Beach Library, at 2808 Gerritsen Avenue, on Thursday evening, August 27th, to check out Marine Park's very own bats.

The Brooklyn Public Library, Marine Park Alliance (MPA) and the Gotham Bat Conservancy (GBC) organized the Bats! Night Walk, where the MPA and the GBC took bat lovers to the park to view bats flying at night.

GBC's President and Director of Bat Conservation Science Ryan Mahoney and Executive Director Roxanne Quilty gave a presentation at the library, talking about what GBC does and educating attendees on the species of bats that live in New York, including their diet and habitats, as well as the purpose they serve in the environment.

Founded in 2022, GBC has promoted education on the essential role of bats, provided materials and resources for ecological restoration of bat habitats and have increased bat populations in New York and beyond.

Mahoney discussed the nine bats, categorized into two groups, which call New York home. Cave bats hibernate in winter, and tree bats migrate south. Six species of cave bats are the Big Brown Bat, Little Brown Bat, Northern Long-Eared Bat, Indiana Bat, Tri-Colored Bat, Eastern Small-Footed Bat and Eastern Red Bat; the Hoary Bat and Silver-Haired Bat are categorized as tree bats.

Delving into bat facts, Mahoney noted that bats are insectivores or insect eaters and are therefore essential for insect control, saving \$23 billion per year in agricultural losses and reducing the need for pesticides.

However, one devastating fact is that more than 90% of the bat population in NYC was decimated by white-nose syndrome, a devastating fungal disease, and by human activities such as tree, meadow and prairie removals.

Nevertheless, GBC is working to resolve this issue. After the presentation, they took attendees out to see some bats.

Visitors saw the Big Brown Bat, Little Brown Bat, Eastern Red Bat, Silver-Haired Bat, Hoary Bat and the Tri-Colored Bat.

"Bats are a misunderstood animal," Mahoney said. "Most people are afraid of bats and have preconceived notions about them. It's good to talk about them and bring people out to show them what they really are. That's what we're doing here – showing that they're harmless and helpful."

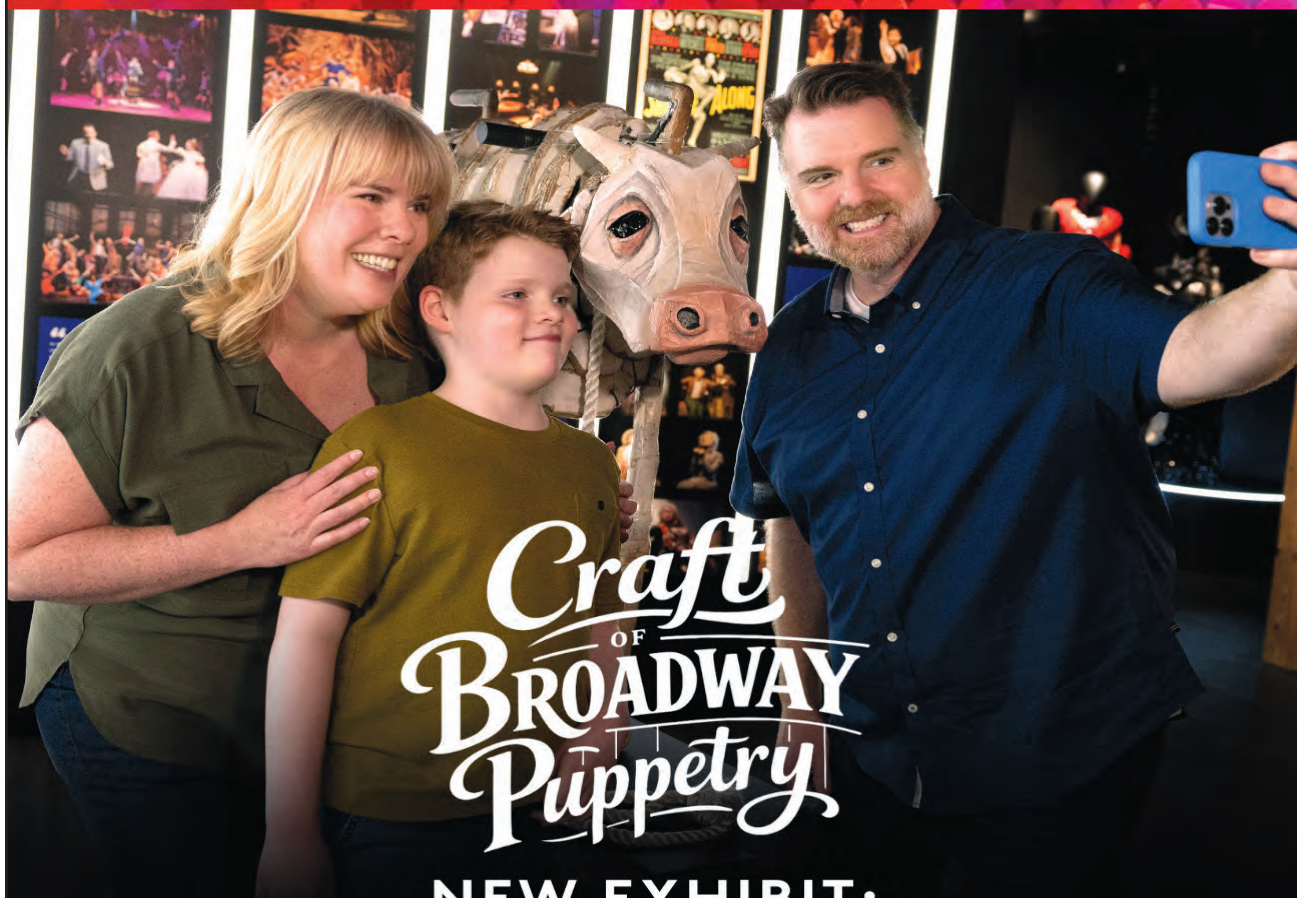
The night walk showed that New York bat wildlife isn't something to be intimidated by, but something to learn from and appreciate.

"I've seen this program four times and every year, it's exciting," MPA board member Margot Perron said. "The GBC is doing great stuff; sharing it with the public is a lot of fun. You heard that outburst when the two bats were coming at the same time, and everybody's reaction was, 'Wow!'"

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Jamaica Bay Riding Academy Closes After 54 Years

After 54 years, the Jamaica Bay Riding Academy, located just off the Belt Parkway, at 7000 Shore Parkway, has closed and many members of the local community believe it may be for the best.

While the academy has been a family-owned business and a longtime fixture in the lives of professional and amateur equestrians for generations, some had expressed concern over the condition of the facilities and the welfare of the horses.

When word began circulating that the owners had been outbid and lost their long-term lease on the 11.8-acre property, many assumed the horses stabled there would simply transition to the new leaseholders. However, a desperate plea for help posted on an equestrian

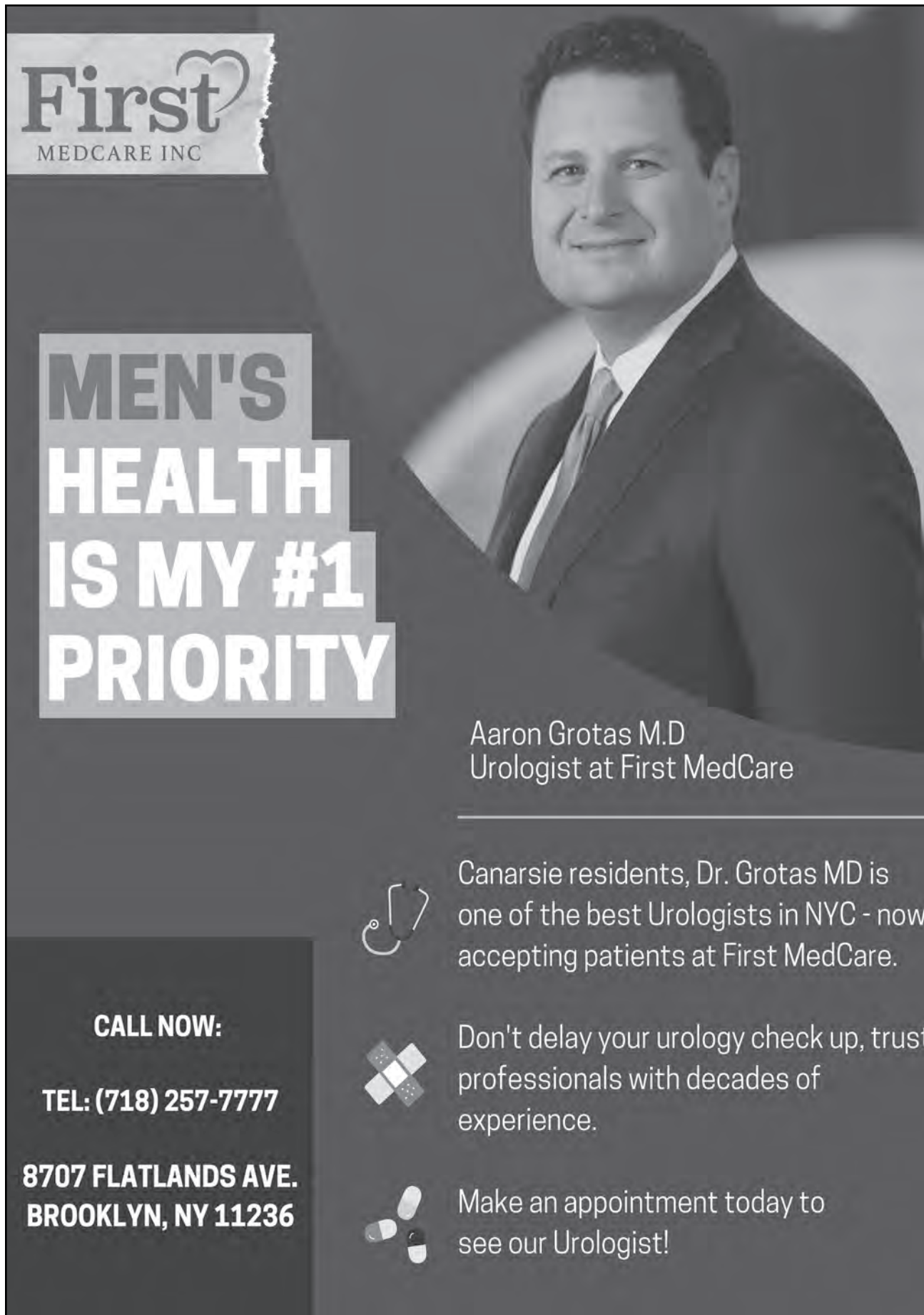
forum by someone who claimed to be a former trainer told a very different story.

The poster shared a detailed list including more than 20 schoolies and trail horses that would be headed for auction or sold to a dealer/kill buyer if they were not purchased by mid-June, many of which were described as seniors who were lame, thin and had a variety of serious medical conditions. Some alleged that a handful of horses had to be euthanized since they were in such poor condition, but the post was later refuted by the owners.

“While it is bittersweet to say goodbye, we are happy knowing they will now spend their days resting, grazing and being cared for with the same love they have always known,” the owners explained on their website. According to a report by another publication, 35 of the 50 horses stabled at the academy were taken in by private individuals, while the remaining horses are being cared for at 13 Hands Equine Rescue Inc., a nonprofit organization Upstate New York.

The property, which is owned by the National Park Service, includes a 37,320 square-foot main building/arena, a 15,840 square-foot boarding stable with 95 box stalls, a 1,250 square-foot isolation building with five box stalls, and multiple paddocks and turnout fields. A new 10-year lease agreement has been established with the Brooklyn Equestrian Center, and the company is currently undergoing major renovations at lightning speed.

While it is still unconfirmed as of press time, the site is expected to be a destination and will reopen to the public this fall. The Equestrian Center will offer boarding, lessons, trail rides, competitive events, summer camp, family-friendly dining and a tack shop.

Perseverance Pays Off!

We in the Canarsie community had been working for five months to get two inoperable fire hydrants replaced along Rockaway Parkway on both sides of Avenue N. Both were at 90 degree angles. One was covered in weeds and hardly noticeable. According to store owners, it had been broken for three years. The other one was totally noticeable and was stamped "1921." Two lifesaving icons were withered by time and from cars backing into them.

Many a call was made to 311 by numerous people with no results. Word of mouth did not work either. An entire area of Canarsie had no water available in case of fire.

Thankfully, Congressman Hakeem Jeffries recently held a "Congress on Your Corner" event at Holy Family Church where he was informed of the problem. He and staff members, including Jonah Warner, are responsible for two new working fire hydrants in Canarsie. Thank you so much!

Pastor Rosa Sanchez from God With Us Ministries said in her opening prayer, "Thank you, God, for showing us how to show appreciation for those who take care of the human beings that You created."

Following Sanchez's invocation, Apostle Leeds Jean blew several joyful blasts from his shofar.

Many medical workers from area hospitals utilized their lunch break to be at the service. Monroe lauded their sacrifice as he extended appreciation to them. "In all of the work that you do, just remember that we love you and we want to say thank you from the bottom of our hearts."

Sydana Passley-Smith, a nurse from Downstate Hospital, told the *Canarsie Courier* she is grateful that someone recognizes and appreciates the service nurses and other medical professionals provide.

Jean Sony Beauvoir, deputy inspector of the 67th Precinct, also thanked Monroe and the BCQL for their support and public acknowledgement of the NYPD's faithful service. "The support we receive from you is very important and much appreciated," Beauvoir stated. "We are also grateful to have your partnership to make sure that we have a safe Labor Day weekend," the deputy inspector added.

Monroe, who once led the GodSquad, has worked in tandem with the NYPD and various Clergy Councils for years, providing training on public safety and other protocols during Labor Day and J'Ouvert celebrations. "What could we do without your support," he asked of Beauvoir. "I know there's a lot of pressure and a lot of tension in the air, but I want you to know that we are praying for you," Monroe assured the deputy inspector.

Each attendee was presented with a small care package as a token of appreciation. The service concluded with a benediction offered by Monroe who gave thanks repeatedly "for those who have served."
