This past weekend, Jewish families in Brooklyn welcomed Rosh Hashanah, the Jewish New Year. Families gathered to pause, reflect and begin again. On Sunday, the blast of the shofar — the ram's horn — sounded a powerful call to reflection. And the greeting shared across dinner tables and doorsteps was a simple one: *Shana Tova* — wishes for a good and sweet new year.

A good year can be measured in milestones. A sweet year is measured in how we treat the people around us. It is the neighbor who checks on the elder down the hall. It is the volunteer who shows up on a Sunday morning to clean the park. It is the small kindness nobody posts about.

I was reminded of that spirit recently when I joined Councilwoman Mercedes Narcisse and Josh Mehlman, chairman of the Flatbush Jewish Community Coalition, at a local food distribution, helping make sure our neighbors had food on their tables.

One of the traditions of the holiday is *tashlich*, when people gather beside a body of water to symbolically cast away the sins and short-

comings of the past year. Some mark the ritual by casting pieces of bread into the water.

The shofar is often described as a wake-up call. And if we are honest, our city could use one. Too many of our neighbors are carrying heavy loads — rising rents, rising costs and the quiet worry about what comes next. A new year will not fix those things on its own. But it can remind us of the kind of people we want to be while we face them together.

Rosh Hashanah is both personal and communal. Each person takes stock of their own life, but nobody does it alone — the holiday is observed in community, around full tables, in crowded sanctuaries. Repair is a team effort.

Brooklyn knows something about that. Ours is neighborhoods of many faiths and many backgrounds, and we are at our best when we borrow one another's wisdom. The Jewish New Year invites all of us — whatever we believe — to ask a simple question: how do I make this year sweeter than the last?

Show up. Share what you have. Learn your neighbor's name. The sweetness of a new year is not something we wait for — it is



something we make — together.

Shana Tova to all who celebrated. May the year ahead be a sweet one.

Two Charged Following Brooklyn Carjacking Spree and Police Shooting in Canarsie

A multi-neighborhood crime spree, spanning five police precincts, including an attempted armed robbery, two carjackings, a police pursuit and a police-involved shooting, ended with two suspects arrested last week.

No officers, suspects or bystanders were struck by gunfire during the series of incidents that took place on Tuesday, September 8th, police said.

The chain of events began at approximately 7:40 p.m. when officers from the 61st Precinct responded to a 911 call reporting an attempted gunpoint robbery at 1624 East 16th Street. A 24-year-old man told police that two unidentified males approached him and displayed a firearm while attempting to steal his property. The victim managed to escape without surrendering any belongings, and the suspects fled on foot toward East 15th Street and Avenue O, within the confines of the 70th Precinct.

Approximately two minutes later, the suspects allegedly targeted a 23-year-old man who was sitting inside a vehicle near 1478 East 15th Street. Police said the suspects displayed a firearm, forcibly removed the victim from the vehicle and drove away in the stolen car.

Officers later tracked the vehicle within the confines of the 63rd Precinct, where it crashed at ap-

proximately 8:30 p.m. One suspect was taken into custody near the crash site, while the second fled on foot, according to police.

Investigators said the fleeing suspect then approached a 54-year-old woman standing outside her vehicle near 2060 Kimball Street. He allegedly forced the woman away from her vehicle, took it and drove toward Canarsie, prompting another police pursuit. At approximately 8:39 p.m., officers from the 69th Precinct attempted to block the vehicle near East 100th Street and Avenue K. Police said the driver refused to stop, mounted the sidewalk and drove toward an officer.

One of the officers discharged a firearm at the approaching vehicle. The driver reportedly swerved back onto the roadway and continued fleeing. The officer was not struck by the vehicle, and no one was hit by the gunfire, according to the NYPD.

The pursuit continued into East New York, where the stolen vehicle crashed near Pennsylvania and Wortman Avenues within the 75th Precinct. Officers apprehended a 16-year-old male at the crash site. He was arrested and charged with robbery.

Police also charged a 16-year-old male around 2:30 a.m. on Wednesday, September 9th, within the confines of the 70th Precinct. He was charged with criminal possession of stolen property and obstruct-

ing governmental administration.

Because an officer discharged a weapon during the encounter, the NYPD Force Investigation Division is reviewing the shooting. The broader criminal investigation remains ongoing.

Double Homicide at Howard Playground

Two men are dead after being gunned down inside the Howard Playground in Brownsville on Friday, September 11th.

Police from the 73rd Precinct/PSA 2 responded to the playground, located at Mother Gaston Blvd. and Glenmore Avenue, around 10:25 p.m. where they found the victims -- Antoine Utsey, 35, of Bedford-Stuyvesant, and Deon Miler, 33, of Brownsville.

Police said Utsey was shot in the chest and ankle, and Miller was shot in the neck. Miller was taken to Interfaith Medical Center, and Utsey was taken

to Brookdale Hospital, where they were both pronounced dead.

There are no arrests, and an investigation is ongoing.

Firefighters Rescue Resident from Apartment Fire

Firefighters rescued a resident who was trapped in an apartment fire at 155 Wortman Avenue, between Vermont Street and New Jersey Avenue, on Thursday, September 10th.

Units received several calls for the fire around 5:15 p.m. Members from the 58th Battalion, including Engine Company 290 and Ladder Company 103, arrived to find

heavy smoke emitting from a fourth-floor apartment. They quickly found the victim and burning materials.

The victim was rushed to Brookdale Hospital by FDNY paramedics and was listed in critical condition.

About 65 firefighters used two hose lines to knock down the main body of fire, and the blaze was placed under control at 5:45 p.m. The FDNY Fire Marshal's Office will determine the cause and origin of the fire.

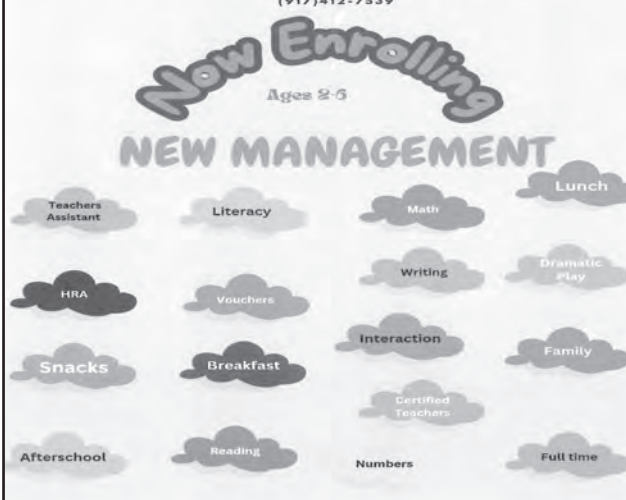

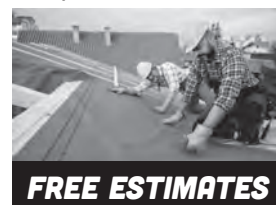

Steelpan Rhythms and High Energy: P.S./I.S. 66 Kicks Off New School Year in Canarsie

Steelpan melodies, stilt performers, a live DJ and a vibrant classroom parade transformed a standard first day of school into a full-scale neighborhood celebration at P.S./I.S. 66 on Thursday, September 10th.

The high-energy festivities began at 8 a.m. outside the campus at 845 East 96th Street, where faculty, staff and community leaders gathered to welcome students and families to the 2026–2027 academic year.

Prominent public officials joined the welcome rally, including State Senator Roxanne Persaud, Assemblywoman Monique Chandler-Waterman, Councilman Chris Banks and District 18 Superintendent Celeste Terry. Together with school administrators and staff, the elected leaders marched alongside students in a celebratory parade that led directly into the classrooms. Principal Krystle Charlemagne noted that her perspective as a mother of three deeply informs her leadership style at the 3K–8 school.

"Being a mother of three definitely has shaped my vision of how I would like to run this school because I want to give back to other people's children as I give to my own," Charlemagne said. She described the campus as an extension of the home, emphasizing that educators and families work in tandem to treat every student as family.

In addition to cultivating a supportive culture, Charlemagne outlined key academic goals for the upcoming year. Highlights include introducing financial literacy and expanding early exposure to coding, robotics, engineering and general STEM subjects for younger grades.

"Our K-2 students need that exposure," Charlemagne said, pointing to the value of early foundation building. The administration will also focus on phonemic awareness, reading comprehension, teacher professional development and the Multi-Tiered System of Supports (MTSS) framework to tailor instruction and interventions to individual student needs.

For parents, the enthusiastic kickoff set an optimistic tone. Shona, an East 99th Street resident whose son attends P.S./I.S. 66, shared her hope for his academic journey. "I'm excited for his new semester," she said. "I'm hoping that he just keeps growing with the school. I know that he's maybe not where he needs to be, but I know they're going to push him to where he needs to be."

Sixty-Ninth Precinct Pays Homage to Fallen Comrades at 25th Anniversary Memorial Service



69th Precinct officers salute fallen NYPD heroes.

On Friday, September 11th, Captain Sashanna Wynter, commanding officer of the 69th Precinct, gathered with other officers in front of the station house, located at 9720 Foster Avenue, for a ceremony in remembrance of the tragic events that shook the nation and took the lives of 23 NYPD officers, 25 years earlier.

The NYPD fallen heroes lost their lives while attempting to save others, after terrorists hijacked airplanes and flew them into the World Trade Center, on September 11, 2001. An astounding 343 firefighters and thousands of other victims also perished on that fateful day. At 8:46 a.m., the precise moment the first plane slammed into the Twin Towers, the commanding officer read a statement which reminded those present of the fallen officers' incredible valor and why their ultimate sacrifice should never be forgotten.

"At this very moment, on September 11, 2001, New York City came under terrorist attack. Almost 3,000 people died. The NYPD responded to the World Trade Center buildings in a show of strength and courage that earned us the respect of the world. Twenty-three brave members did not return from Ground Zero. We honor them daily by protecting the American way of life, for which they died on that day.

They, and each of you, personify what is best about the city, this country and our ideals. As we observe this anniversary of the tragic events of September 11, 2001, take pride in knowing that history will remember the New York City Police Department demonstrated the highest principles of service and humanity in our response that day. May events never require us to do that again," the captain stated, before reading the name of each of the 23 NYPD fallen heroes.

The memorial also paid homage to other NYPD officers who served during and after the horrific attacks but later died from illnesses associated with the tragedy.

A moment of silence followed.

Before the event concluded, Reverend Cecil Moonsam, president of the 69th Precinct Clergy Council who is also an auxiliary lieutenant, said a prayer for comfort and strength for those who lost loved ones.

The ceremony was attended by State Senator Roxanne Persaud and members of the 69th Precinct Community and Clergy Councils.

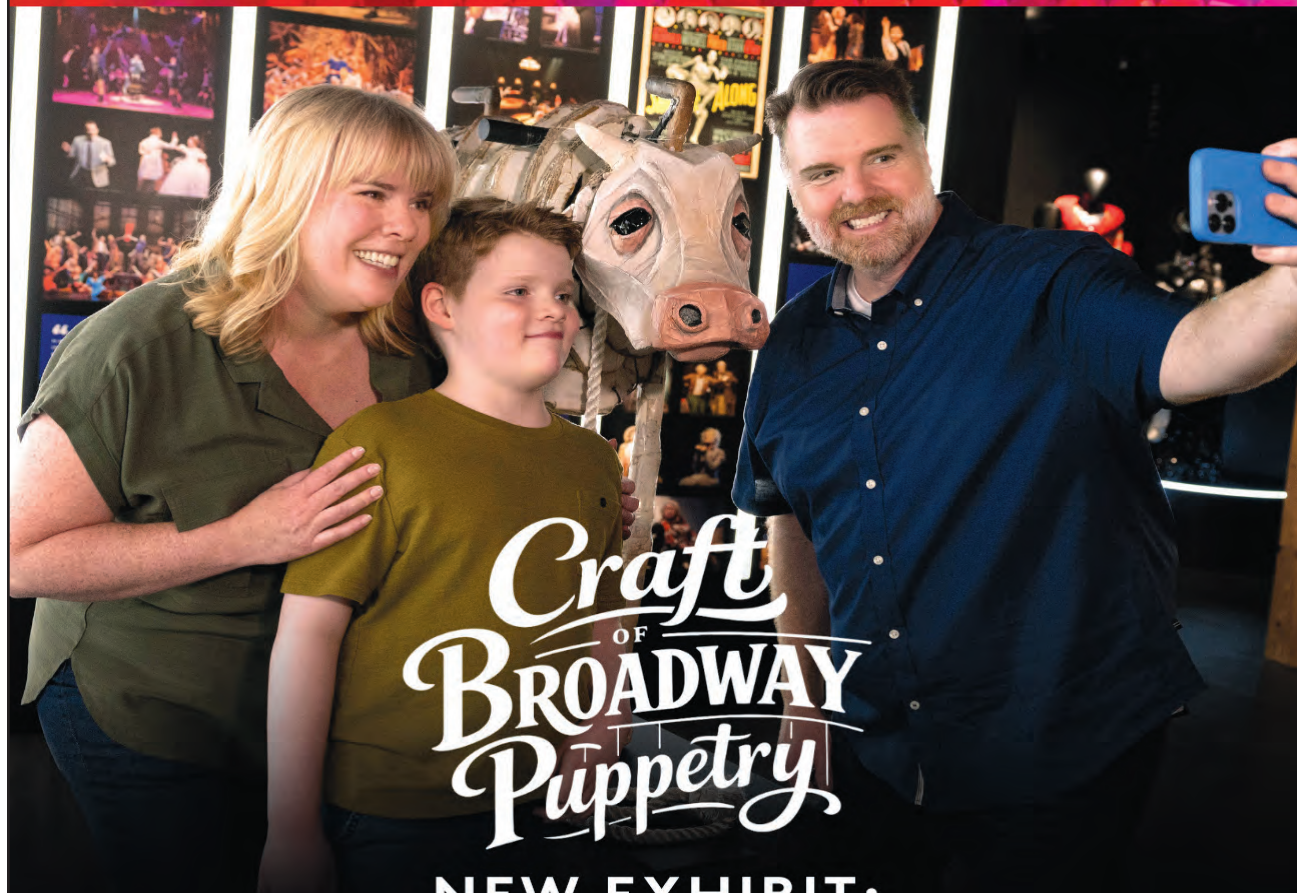

District 22 Superintendent Shares Priorities for the New School Year

Members of Community District Education Council 22 (CEC 22) gathered at the District Office, located at 5619 Flatlands Avenue, on Tuesday, September 8th, for their monthly meeting, where District 22 Superintendent Julia Bove shared her top five priorities for the new school year.

During the meeting, which was also streamed live via Zoom, Bove said her priorities include increasing the number of students reading at or above grade level, increasing the number of students performing at or above grade level in math, making schools safer and more inclusive, promoting college and career readiness, and reducing chronic absences. According to the metrics, District 22 is on track to meet all of these goals in 2027.

The group also discussed their support of the Department of Education's (DOE) one-year moratorium on Artificial Intelligence (AI) in the classroom and strict new limits on screen time. Student-facing AI is now entirely banned in grades 2K-8 and limited in grades 9-12. While no amount of 1:1 screen time is recommended for students in grades 2K-2, the DOE recommends no more than 30 minutes per day for students in grades 3-5 and no more than 45 minutes per day for students in grades 6-8. Screen time for high school students, however, depends on the individual school and the course of instruction.

The next meeting of CEC 22 will be held at the District Office, located at 5619 Flatlands Avenue, on Tuesday, October 6th, at 6:30 p.m.

Remembering Local 9/11 Heroes on 25th Anniversary

The Mill Basin Civic Association (MBCA) marked the 25th anniversary of September 11th with a moving memorial honoring local firefighters who made the ultimate sacrifice, bringing together residents, civic leaders, first responders and elected officials throughout Mill Basin and neighboring Bergen Beach.

The annual observance, led by MBCA Co-President and Millennium Development Executive Director Paul Curiale, included memorial stops honoring Firefighters Michael Roberts, Gerald T. Atwood and Gregory T. Saucedo, followed by tributes in Bergen Beach. MBCA Co-President Marilyn Vazquez also shared heartfelt remarks.

Assemblywoman Jaime Williams and Councilwoman Mercedes Narcisse joined the ceremonies to honor the local heroes who lived and served in the communities they represent.

The memorial tour made stops at Avenue L and

East 53rd Street, Avenue M and East 57th Street, Avenue T and East 57th Street, the John Malone Community Center flagpole at 2335 Bergen Avenue, and Avenue V and Royce Street. Father Tom of Mary Queen of Heaven offered prayers and a solemn tribute at the Avenue M location.

At the final stop, attendees honored Firefighter Michael Ragusa, whose family still lives nearby. Bergen Beach Civic Association Corresponding Secretary Angela Calise was also in attendance.

The Ragusa tribute carried particular significance through Christine Falco, whose father, Robert Falco, was a firefighter who worked alongside Ragusa when he was a probationary firefighter.

Falco recalled how her father remained close to the Ragusa family after 9/11, helping his parents establish a scholarship fund and organize fundraising events. Ragusa was among the firefighters whose remains were difficult to identify, and blood he had previously donated was ultimately used to provide DNA for his funeral.

Her father later offered words that remained with the family: "As far as closure, you can always turn the page, but you can never close the book." Those words took on deeper meaning after Robert Falco himself died from a 9/11-related illness in 2023. He was the 343rd firefighter to die from illnesses related to the attacks, his daughter said, recalling the 343 firefighters killed on September 11th itself.

Williams stressed the importance of ensuring future generations understand what happened and remember those who sacrificed their lives.

"It was terrorism, a terror attack that came to the American shore to hurt our neighbors, our brothers and sisters, husbands and wives, sons," Williams said. "And that is something we will never forget."

Narcisse also emphasized remembering the first responders who ran toward danger while others fled, as well as those still suffering from 9/11-related illnesses.

"We cannot forget," she said, urging residents to ensure affected families know resources remain available.

Curiale said the memorial is about more than remembering a single day and challenged residents to pass the spirit of service and sacrifice to younger generations. "These are real people living on real blocks, living within the confines of our Mill Basin, within Brooklyn, within New York, within America," Curiale said.

As the ceremonies concluded with prayers, music and moments of silence, the connection to 9/11 remained strong, bringing home the reality of the attacks while honoring the local heroes, their families and the thousands of others lost on and after September 11th.

Community Gathers to Mark 25 Years Since 9/11

Hundreds of residents, first responders, community leaders and elected officials gathered in Marine Park on Thursday, September 10th, for a solemn remembrance marking 25 years since the terrorist attacks of September 11, 2001.

Hosted by Assemblywoman Jaime Williams outside the Carmine Carro Community Center, the annual ceremony brought neighbors and families together under the enduring message: "Gone, But Never Forgotten" and "We Will Never Forget."

The ceremony opened with the Presentation of Colors and Pledge of Allegiance by Boy Scout Troop 193, followed by a stirring rendition of the National Anthem by young Richard Tang, who reminded those gathered, "We are not here to weep, but to remember their names."

The program featured prayers, patriotic music, a moment of silence and reflections from public officials and community leaders. Deacon Fred Ritchie of St. Columba R.C. Church and Rabbi Daniel Sayani of Shore Parkway Jewish Center offered prayers and reflections.

Williams, who has continued the Marine Park remembrance tradition, thanked the residents, civic organizations, houses of worship, schools, first responders and elected officials who came together. She emphasized the importance of remembering the attacks plainly for what they were. "Whatever word you try to choose, the fact remains it was a terror attack," Williams said. "The fact remains that they assaulted our soil and innocent lives were taken."

Ritchie spoke of the devastating human toll and the need to remember victims, survivors and those who sacrificed themselves to save others. "We will never forget the sense of death and destruction that fanaticism and hatred can bring," he said, while remembering "the selfless heroism" of those who responded.

Music added to the ceremony's emotional weight, with "America the Beautiful" performed by vocalist Robert Mineo and guitarist Rocco Gammone, "Ave Maria" by vocalist Lizet Deadato, followed by a moment of silence and a bagpipe tribute to the fallen.

Keynote speaker Dr. Judy Newton, a retired NYPD detective whose life and career were profoundly affected by September 11th, delivered a deeply personal account of responding in the aftermath and becoming trapped in darkness and rubble. Unsure whether she would survive, Newton said she promised God that, if she emerged alive, she would devote the rest of her life to public service.

"By His grace, I survived," Newton said. "From that moment, my life's mission was permanently altered."

Newton, who retired from the NYPD in 2012, said her commitment to service, education and community involvement only deepened. "We honor those we lost by investing in our children," she said, adding, "Remembrance matters, but remembrance must also become action."

State Senator Roxanne Persaud recalled the unity she witnessed after the attacks. "Everyone in every community came together," she said. "We did not see differences. We were all one." She urged residents to teach younger generations about September 11th as fewer people have firsthand memories of the tragedy.

Assemblywoman Monique Chandler-Waterman called on the community to "show love, compassion and unity," while Assemblymember Kalman Yeger reminded those gathered that "Never Forget" was never meant to be merely a slogan. "It was a solemn oath," he said.

District Leader Frank Seddio, who helped organize the first local remembrance after September 11th,

urged families to bring younger generations to future ceremonies. "Our job is to teach the generations after 9/11 about what this was about," Seddio said.

Community Board 18 District Manager Sue Ann Partnow shared a poem reflecting on the passage of time: "As we commemorate 25 years, we look toward Lower Manhattan. We no longer see the Twin Towers. Now, only a memorial remains there, a place for visitors to put flowers."

The ceremony closed with a renewed commitment to the fallen, their families and the first responders whose lives were forever changed. Twenty-five years later, the message remained clear: the community will continue to gather, remember and ensure that September 11th is never forgotten.

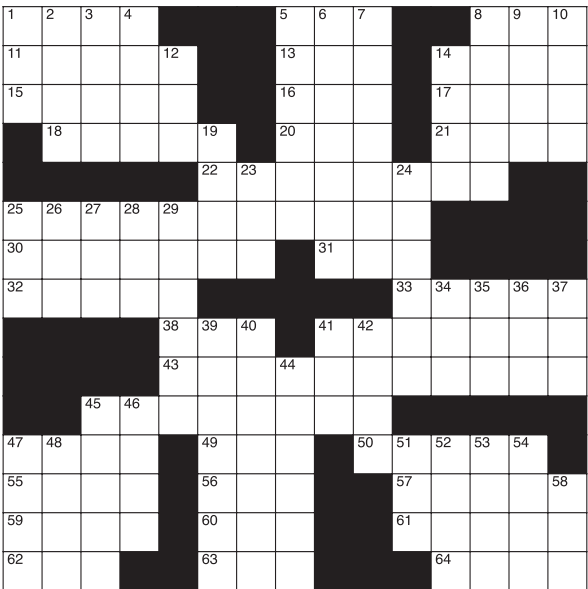
