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Celebration and Solidarity: Standing With Haitian Workers This Labor Day

For generations, people have come to New York seeking safety, stability and the opportunity to build a better life. They have worked, raised families, opened businesses and became part of the neighborhoods they call home.

Immigration isn't separate from New York's story. It is New York's story — and immigrant workers have always been central to it. Few weekends capture that history better than Labor Day in Brooklyn.

As our country honors working people, Eastern Parkway comes alive for the West Indian American Day Carnival, a joyful celebration of the cultures and traditions of the Caribbean communities that have helped shape Brooklyn.

This year, celebration should also come with solidarity for our Haitian neighbors. Temporary Protected Status, or TPS, was created to provide temporary protection to people already in the United States when conditions in their home countries make returning unsafe. For years, eligible Haitians with TPS were able to remain and legally work here.

In 2024, Haiti's TPS designation was extended through February 2026. The Trump administration later moved to terminate those protections. Court challenges delayed the termination, but following a Supreme Court ruling this

summer, TPS protections ended, along with TPS-based work authorization for hundreds of thousands of Haitians.

The consequences are already being felt in New York. The city has been required to separate municipal employees who can no longer demonstrate authorization to work. TPS was always intended to be temporary. But temporary status does not erase the years people have spent building lives, raising children and becoming part of our communities.

Haitian New Yorkers are nurses and home health aides caring for our loved ones. They are educators, entrepreneurs, restaurant and hospitality workers, construction workers and small business owners.

Before TPS ended, an estimated 25,000 Haitian TPS holders were employed in New York, contributing approximately \$863 million annually to the state's economy and paying more than \$280 million in federal, state and local taxes.

Those numbers matter, but our solidarity cannot depend on a balance sheet. These are our neighbors, coworkers, friends and families. They have built lives here and deserve the dignity and stability every working family seeks.

Carnival should remain a celebration of Caribbean culture, history and pride. Labor Day reminds us of the



dignity of work and the generations of working people who built this country. Celebration and solidarity can exist together.

As Caribbean flags fly proudly along Eastern Parkway this Labor Day, we should stand with our Haitian neighbors and call for a path that allows affected families to remain safe, work legally, support their families and continue contributing to the communities they have helped build.

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First a Stabbing, Then a Shooting at Bayview Houses

A woman sustained a graze wound to her left arm at the Bayview Houses in the early morning hours on Monday, August 24th. The violence follows a stabbing that took place in July at the NYCHA complex.

Police from the 69th Precinct/PSA1 responded to a 911 call of an assault in front of 2105 Rockaway Parkway around 12:15 a.m., where they found the 43-year-old victim.

The woman was taken by EMS to Brookdale Hospital in stable condition, police said.

There are no arrests, and an investigation is ongoing.

On July 27th, a 34-year-old man was stabbed multiple times in the torso in front of 5905 Shore Parkway (see "Man Stabbed at Bayview Houses," *Canarsie Courier*, August 6, 2026).

Bronx Man Arrested for Two Homicides, Two Days Apart

After almost a weeklong manhunt, a Bronx man was arrested in connection to the homicide of two men – one in Brooklyn and the other in the Bronx.

On Saturday, August 29th, Jesus Acosta, 31, was arrested and charged within the confines of the Bronx's 43rd Precinct with two counts each of murder and attempted murder, manslaughter, robbery and criminal possession of a weapon.

Just after midnight on Sunday, August 23rd, police from the 73rd Precinct responded to a 911 call of an assault in progress inside of America's Best Wings & Pizza, at 842 Rockaway Avenue, between Newport Street and Lott Avenue. They found a 44-year-old employee of the fast-food restaurant with a gunshot wound to his head and another employee, a 39-year-old male, with a gunshot wound to the leg.

Both victims were taken by EMS to nearby

Brookdale Hospital, where the 44-year-old male, identified as MD Yousef, of East New York, was later pronounced dead.

The 39-year-old male victim was listed in stable condition.

Acosta is also being accused of killing Tayvon Shuler, 33, of Brownsville. What started out as a commercial robbery in a Bronx bodega on Tuesday, August 25th, turned into a homicide when the victim later succumbed to his injuries at Lincoln Hospital. Acosta allegedly shot Shuler, who was a customer, in the chest and stole money from the cash register before fleeing the store.

According to *ABC News*, Acosta has 13 prior arrests, starting with an armed robbery when he was 14 years old. He served 10 years in state prison for shooting a man on a subway platform and was released on parole in April.

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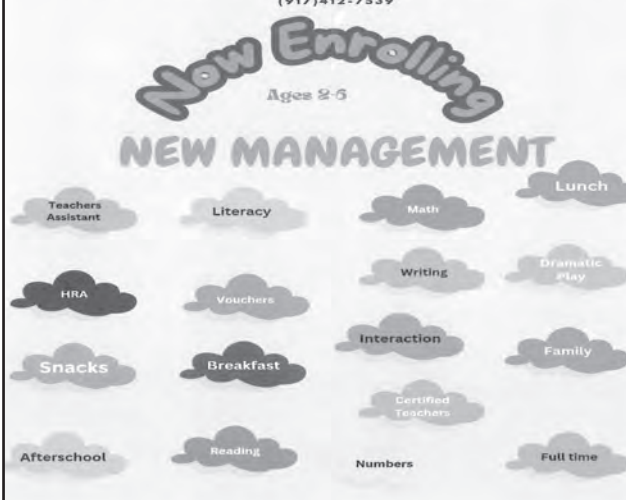
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Dolly Parton – Remembering a Global Music Legend and Humanitarian



An iconic singer, songwriter, philanthropist, actress, playwright and author, Dolly Parton, one of 12 children, grew up in the beautiful Smoky Mountains of East Tennessee. Living in a one-bedroom house, Dolly and her siblings were making music from an early age, and her singing talents were encouraged by her mom. She began singing and writing songs at 5, and by 10, she was singing on local radio and TV stations. At 13, she debuted on the Grand Ole Opry and was well on her way to becoming the country music recording artist she had dreamed of being. She moved to Nashville at 18, where she met her husband of 60 years, Carl Dean.

In 1965, she signed her first record deal with *Monument Records*, where she recorded her first album, *Hello, I'm Dolly*. By 1967, she was starring on the very popular *Porter Wagoner Show*. She would record a dozen studio albums with countless top ten hits. Porter Wagoner and Dolly would become one of the country's leading duos. This would lead to a recording contact with *RCA Records*. She became a member of the Grand Ole Opry, an honor she cherished her entire life. After leaving the *Porter Wagoner Show* in 1974, she lived out her dream of being a solo artist. She recorded "I Will Always Love You," a tribute to Porter Wagoner. It would become one of the greatest country songs of all time. It was later recorded by Whitney Houston for the movie soundtrack of *The Bodyguard* and spent 14 weeks at number one in 1992. Dolly recorded many great songs that would become the soundtrack of our lives, like "Coat of Many Colors," "Jolene," "Here You Come Again" and many more.

She teamed up with Kenny Rogers for the great duet "Islands in the Stream," toured globally with him and later on her own. In 1980, she added Movie Star to her already very impressive resume after starring in the blockbuster movie *9 to 5* with Jane Fonda and Lily Tomlin. She was elevated to superstardom in every aspect of her career. She opened the family-friendly Dollywood theme park in the Smoky Mountains, which brought in four million visitors annually. She won countless country music awards, Grammy awards, American music awards and much more. She was nominated for two Oscars and six Golden Globes. Dolly has won over 190 awards in her fabulous career. She is a member of the Country Music Hall of Fame and the Rock & Roll Hall of Fame. Dolly taught us always to dream big, believe in yourself and always lift others up.

Canarsien Jimmy Diele, radio personality and *Celebrity Spotlight* host for *iHeart Radio* podcasts, told the *Canarsie Courier* that he had the pleasure of meeting Dolly twice in his career. "She would come up to the *Scott and Todd in the Morning* show on *WPLJ* for a great interview, which I had the pleasure of being a part of. I also had the pleasure of attending her record release party for her Bluegrass Album, *Halos and Horns*. Moments I will never forget," Diele said. "Dolly was always full of so much energy and life. She was also very gracious and nice. She certainly did not forget where she came from -- those early days in the Smoky Mountains. She will always be the Queen of Country Music. I believe in 100 years from now, people will still be listening to Dolly and 'I Will Always Love You.' Icons of this status are very rare in our lifetime. She will always be known for her contributions to music and philanthropy. With over 100 million records sold, she is among the best-selling music icon of all time. Dolly, we will always love you!"

Dolly Parton passed away on August 25, 2026. She was 80 years old.

Every child went home with a smile, a Summer at the Library tote bag and a book.



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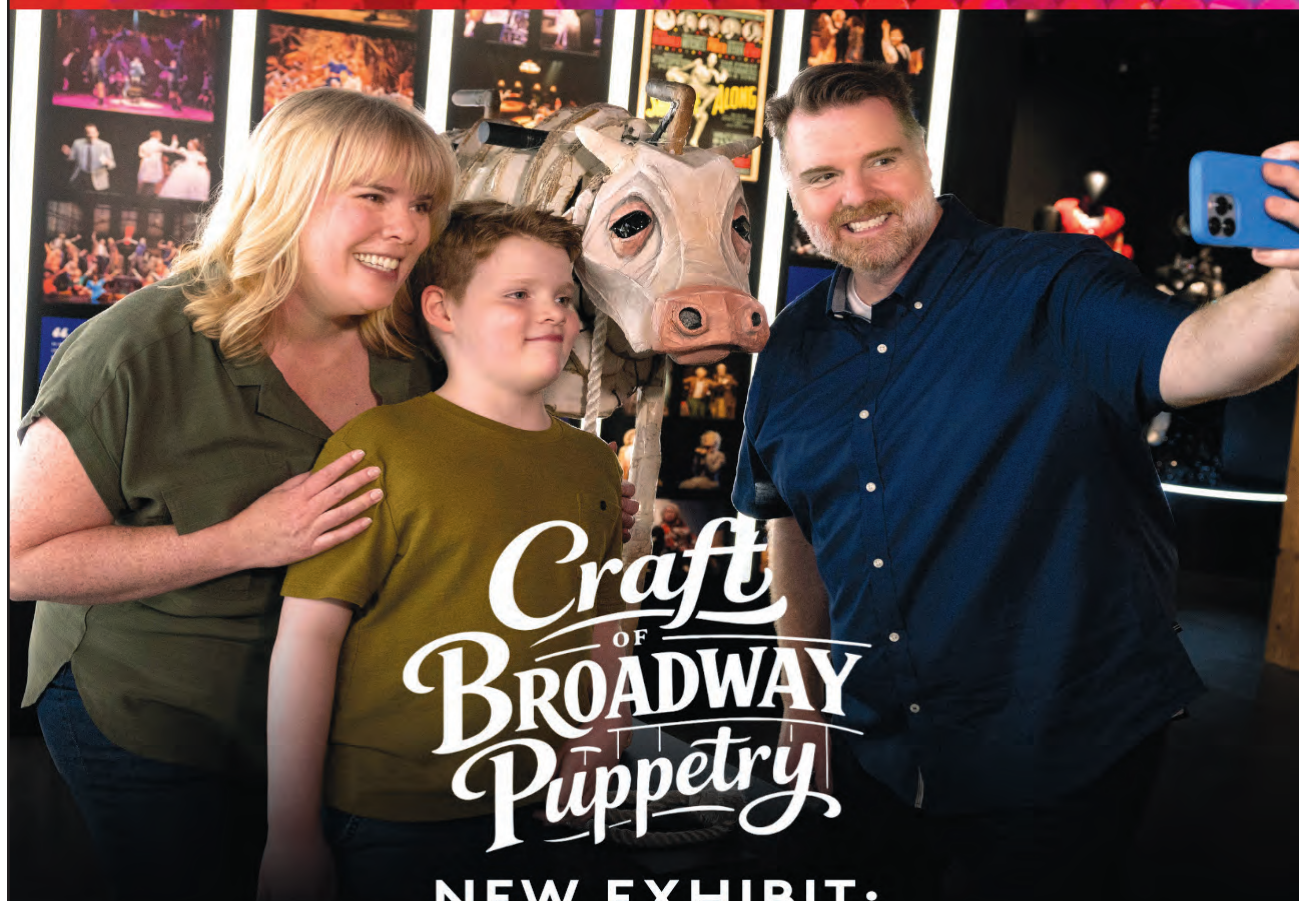
National Park Week Kicks Off With History and Adventure in Floyd Bennett Field

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Floyd Bennett Field (FBF) was the perfect venue to kick off National Park Week. Jamaica Bay-Rockaway Parks Conservancy (JBRPC) and the National Park Service (NPS) organized fun-for-all activities throughout the park on Saturday, August 22nd. From 9 a.m. to 1 p.m., history buffs, adventurers and fun-seekers could explore, celebrate and connect.

Walking into the Ryan Visitor Center, located at 1 Floyd Bennett Field, was like taking a stroll into the past and looking into the window of a time (1937) when an airplane ticket to Boston cost \$13.90 and pioneers like Howard Hughes, Jacqueline Cochran and Wiley Post walked casually through the passenger terminal.

Museum guests appreciated the intricate, original painted designs on the walls and ceilings, viewed artifacts about FBF, New York City's first municipal airport, and children tested their pitch at a flight control exhibit. The best part of the tour was the trip to the air traffic control station in the tower. Even on an overcast day, the view was breathtaking.

A trolley from The New York Trolley Company was available at the visitor center to take adventurers from one activity to the next throughout FBF. Kings Cycling had bike rentals available in case a person craved a more active form of transportation. They had a variety of bikes for all sizes and several options with comfortable seating.

NPS provided 39 kayaks and gear for anyone that wanted to paddle in Jamaica Bay, launching from the Seaplane Ramp. Even dogs joined in on the fun.

Airplane and history lovers of all ages were awestruck as they made their way through Hangar B with NPS guides and viewed the impressive collection of historic aircraft. To many of the younger patrons, the aircraft and the "stories" that go along with them seemed unfathomable.

If the plane obsession could not be satisfied after leaving Hangar B, enthusiasts headed to the Remote Control (RC) Plane Club area, on Runway 19, near the scenic shoreline of FBF where pilots performed flight exhibitions. The RC Club has been in the park for over 50 years, and if members are not skillfully maneuvering their plane, they are always ready to support an enthusiast or assist a newcomer.

Robert Moses, city planner, envisioned FBF, formerly named Barren Island, as "a place within the limits of the city where the strain of our city life can be relieved, where the nerves of tired workers can be soothed, where the old may rest and the young may play." He would have been pleased with the National Park Kickoff activities that JBRPC and NPS organized and hosted, as well as the enjoyment had by all.

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Letter To The Editor

A Love Letter to Breukelen – Celebrating a Long Overdue Investment in Our Community Center

Congratulations to the residents of the Breukelen Houses.

The recent announcement of a \$2 million State allocation to support renovations and improvements to the Breukelen Community Center is something our entire community should celebrate.

We extend our sincere appreciation to State Senator Roxanne Persaud and Governor Kathy Hochul for helping to make this investment possible.

But the real winners are the people of Breukelen — the children, teenagers, young adults, parents, grandparents and seniors who have called this community home for generations.

This is our win. And it did not happen overnight.

Back in 2019, a petition calling for a new and improved Breukelen Community Center was circulated and signed by more than 600 residents and community stakeholders.

That petition was shared with elected officials at multiple levels of government. Along with support from the Brooklyn Borough President's Office, we also asked Community Board 18 to formally recognize the need for a modernized community center as a district priority. Today, we have an opportunity to move closer to that vision.

This victory belongs to every person who signed that petition, raised their voice, attended a meeting, contacted an elected official or simply refused to accept that

our community should continue to do without.

It belongs to our seniors. It belongs to our preschool and school-age children. It belongs to our teenagers and young adults. It belongs to our families.

And it belongs to generations of Breukelen residents who understand what a real community center can mean. For me, and other caring Breukelen alumni, this announcement has special meaning.

I, just like many others, attended preschool, after-school programs, summer camp, teen programs and evening programs at the Breukelen Community Center. I know firsthand what that building can mean in the life of a child.

A community center isn't simply a building. It can be where you meet your first mentor. Where somebody discovers that you can sing, dance, play basketball, paint or lead. Where a teenager finds somewhere safe to go. Where a senior remains connected to neighbors and community. Where friendships are formed that can last a lifetime.

And sometimes it is simply the place where a child discovers that there are adults outside of their immediate family who care about what happens to them. That is why this moment matters so much.

We should be very careful not to minimize this investment. Two million dollars is significant. Senator Persaud and Governor Hochul deserve our appreciation for putting real resources behind the needs of Breukelen. But appreciation and advocacy can and should exist together.

The question before us now is not whether \$2 million is enough. The better question is:

What kind of community center does Breukelen deserve, what will it cost to build it, and how do we bring together the resources necessary to make it happen?

Other NYCHA communities demonstrate what comprehensive investment can look like. The renovation of the Unity Plaza Community Center, for example, represented a \$5.2 million investment and delivered an upgraded basketball/multipurpose space, dance studio, music recording studio, HVAC improvements, accessibility upgrades and other improvements. Unity Plaza

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only houses slightly over 1,000 residents compared to over 6,000 in Breukelen.

That should not cause us to complain about Breukelen's \$2 million. One government partner has stepped forward. Now we should invite others to join them.

The announcement should mark the beginning of the next phase of community advocacy.

1. Leverage the \$2 million into a larger investment

We should immediately begin seeking additional and matching commitments from other City, State and federal elected officials, government agencies, foundations, corporations and philanthropic partners.

Governor Hochul and Senator Persaud have helped get this started. Who will help us take it to the next level?

2. Ask Breukelen what Breukelen needs/wants.

Residents must have a meaningful voice in determining what is ultimately built.

Before the final scope is established, there should be a comprehensive Breukelen Community Center Resident Survey and community visioning process.

Do residents want:

- A regulation basketball court?
- Fitness and workout facilities?
- Modern classrooms and technology labs?
- A music recording studio?
- Dance and performing arts rooms?
- Creative arts space?

• Workforce development and employment programming?

• Senior programming?

• College and career preparation?

• Meeting and community organizing space?

• Expanded programming for children and teenagers?

3. Make sure programming grows with the building.

A beautiful building without sufficient programming, staffing and resources is simply a beautiful building. DYCD and the Cornerstone provider should be included in the planning conversation.

If we build a basketball court, will there be organized athletic programming?

If we build a music studio, who will teach young people how to use it?

If we create fitness facilities, classrooms, dance rooms and creative spaces, will there be sufficient staffing and programming to activate those spaces throughout the day, evening and weekend?

Build transparency and accountability in this project.

Breukelen residents should receive regular, understandable information about the project from beginning to end.

That means transparency regarding: the budget • project scope • design • procurement • construction schedule • expenditures • delays • change orders • and completion

This should not be viewed as criticism of NYCHA. It is responsible stewardship of public money. Public audits have identified areas where NYCHA's monitoring of contractors and documentation can be strengthened. That makes meaningful resident involvement and independent oversight good public policy – not an attack on the agency. Accountability should be built into the project before construction begins, not demanded after something goes wrong.

THANK YOU — AND LET'S KEEP GOING

There is nothing contradictory about being grateful

and wanting more for our community. We can thank Governor Hochul. We can thank Senator Persaud. We can celebrate this \$2 million investment. And then we can say:

Let's build on it. That isn't being ungrateful. That's what community advocacy looks like. For those of us who grew up in Breukelen, this is about more than renovating an old building. It is about creating a place where another generation of Breukelen children can be nurtured, coached, mentored, protected, challenged, educated and loved.

I know what that can mean because I was one of those children.

Now we have an opportunity to make sure that generations coming behind us have something even better.

Congratulations, Breukelen.

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Visit Canarsie 'Open Streets' – a Showcase of Education, Culture and Pride

The Visit Canarsie “Open Streets” season for 2026 kicked off on August 1st, with “Mas in Canarsie,” a spectacular display of masqueraders and other cultural performers outside of TriniJam BK Roti Bar & Grill, 9501 Flatlands Avenue. During the monthlong “Open Streets” festivities that occurred on weekends, the block of East 95th Street, from Flatlands Avenue to Conklin Avenue, was closed to vehicular traffic to accommodate the activities.

The Visit Canarsie festivities featured many fun as well as educational activities geared toward both adults and children. On one weekend, there were hands-on emergency, lifesaving training on CPR (cardiopulmonary resuscitation), AED (automatic external defibrillator) and the use of Narcan in opioid overdose, which was provided by members of the Flatlands Volunteer Ambulance Corps. The training was co-sponsored by Assemblywoman Jaime Williams.

Young minds with an affinity for S.T.E.M. were also given the opportunity to expand their imagination and create. Eleven-year-old Kara, who assembled a miniature battery-operated, solar-powered helicopter by simply looking at a picture, got excited when it whirled and the propellers spun after it was placed in the sun. She hopes to utilize her scientific mind further as she trains to become a doctor later in life.

A young man who focused on building a truck was similarly thrilled. Others were captivated with lessons on how to safely operate a drone. Their training was conducted by Visit Canarsie Founder Calvin Sennon, who is also a FAA-trained licensed drone instructor. During those sessions, children took snapshots of some of the salient areas of Canarsie, such as the “L” Train Station, Holy Family Church, Canarsie Educational Campus and playing field, and created postcards to be distributed globally as part of the “From Canarsie to The World” initiative.

Some youths received culinary education working alongside Sennon and his wife LaToya at TriniJam. The lessons ranged from learning to churn ice cream from scratch to preparing flavorful Caribbean dishes while others undertook the art of beekeeping and urban gardening.

Visit Canarsie, which Sennon said was established to preserve the economic vitality of Canarsie, also offers a \$1,000 scholarship to deserving young individuals who live in Canarsie, volunteer at a Visit Canarsie site and also demonstrate academic excellence. In this way, they not only acquire independence but transferrable skills that could be used throughout their lifetime.

“Those are the ways we impact them directly. Those are the ways we give them lifelong skills,” Sennon told the *Canarsie Courier*. “Through our work-training programs, we push out entrepreneurs and leaders. We don’t build dependency,” he stressed.

Sennon described the event, which concluded on August 30th, as “a season of family fun, culture, education, environmental stewardship and community pride.”

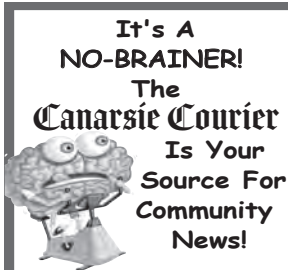
